6239

1849 Lahaina 29 May

Rev. Dwight Baldwin was sworn as Interpreter.

Claim 6239 K. Kamanawa, deceased.

A woman named Kaaweaeheula appeared as his heir and represented this claim.

Kahula sworn as witness.

I know this house lot, it is in Lahainalula and joined my house lot near the Seaman's Chapel. It is bounded makai side by my yard, also on the Kaanapali side. Mauka side by Poalima Kala patches of Kehuanaoa. Olowalu side by yard of Keaueluaole. It is fenced, and the fence is the correct boundary.

Kamauawa got this land from his Ancestors who occupied under Kaahumanu 1 and other chiefs. Claimant was 75 yrs old when he died. He lived there from Kaahumanu's time to his death in peace, with the exception of a claim very recently set up by Kanaina that claim has its foundation on this, that the whole land Paunau, of which this forms a part, was Kekauluohi's. But the claimant held possession up to his death.

Keaweaeheulu is claimant's niece, his nearest Relation, and inherits this lot. He left no children.

Keawelauole sworn, I have heard Kahula's testimony and it is correct, but there is more not told. Kanaina never set up or made known any claim to this land until 1846, when he wished it for himself, up to that time all has had peaceable possession.

I know Keaweaeheulul-she is Claimant's niece and heir. I heard claimant give her this land as far back as 1839.

Nakawalu sworn. I am nearly related to claimant being his Nephew. The claimant left this land to Keaweaeheulu. I have the last witness's testimony and it is correct.

5107 Keaka

Kahula sworn. I know the lands comprised in this claim. They are 12 Kalo patches in Lahaina waena, in the land called Paumau. All are in that land though separate. I could point them out and their bounds correctly. The claimant received these kalo patches from me, as the Lord of this land, in time of Kamehameha 1, and he has held them in peace down to the present time. Victoria has the poalima of them.

5108 L. Kamanawa

This is a claim for two lands ion Hawaii, one called Kanapouli, and ili in Ahupuaa of Honokohau, and the other is relinquished. Claimant is the same as in 6239. He is dead and his Nephew Nakuala, appears as his heir and represents him in this claim.

Keaweluaole sworn. I know this land it is an ili in Honokohau, Hawaii, district of Kailua. I once lived on it. It is irregular-containing much lava and waste ground, and I cannot give the correct bounds, but those living there know them, and can show them to the Surveyor.

Claimant received this land from Hoapili and Kaahumanu [PAGE MISSING}

5108 Continued

I lived on this land under claimant about year 1820 he held it in peace to his death. I believe Victoria the Lord (head of this Ahupuaa) I have heard claimant gave this land to Nakuula his nephew.

Keaweaeheula sworn. I am a niece of Claimant I have heard the testimony now given and it is correct. Nakuala my cousin is the heir of this land. I heard the claimant say this land was to be for Nakuala, he and my self are the near relatives and heirs of claimant.

5017 Kauhi

Ukikihi sworn. I know claimants house lot, but not his other lands. This house lot is in Lahaina. It is bounded Mauka by yard of Kalena, Olowalu by Keaweluaole's, Makai by a large Kalo patch

of Hoapil's In old times; Kaanapali by my yard. It is fenced with adobies and the fence is the true boundary.

The claimant received this land as an heir from Luluhi in Hoapili governorship time, according to my best knowledge. He has held possession of the lot to the present time, but not in peace. Keaweluaole is a counter claimant.

Keaweluaole sworn for claimant about his kalo land says, I know the kalo land or Kihapai of claimant, it lies in one piece, consisting of several patches, but its boundaries are very irregular, it is at Lahainaluna in Ahupuaa of Kelawea in ili of Kukaikapu. Mauka it is bounded by Lahainaluna school lands; Olowalu also. Makai by land of Kahookano, Kaanapali by land of Daniel Ii. Claimant has these lands from me in 1823 and I received them from Kekupuohi in 1832. The claimant has held this land without dispute till 1846. When Kanaina set up one.

I dispute the house lot claim made by Claimant in Lahaina-and I have sent in my claim to Land Commission for the same.

5006 Kalena

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the lands of claimant-they are in Lahainawaena, in Ahupuaa of Kalawea, ili of Opilopilo. Consisting of Kula and Kalo lands. He has a house lot also separate from the other land farther down. The Kula and Kalo lie together. On the Mauka is Pikanele's land; Olowalu, my land, Kukuikapu; Makai Pikanele's; Kaanapali is the creek of Ahi.

I gave this land to Claimant in 1843. I had it from Hoapilikane in 1832. Claimant has held it without dispute to the present time.

The house lot is fenced, and the fence is the true boundary. He had this land from his wife, who had it in time of Kamehameha 1. The name of his wife is Kailaa. His title to this house lot was disputed in 1846 for the first time. Dated Aug. 19 1851 by Kauhi 5017)

Kenui sworn I know these lands well, and have heard the testimony of Keaweluaole.

5389 and 5221 5389 Holoauhee, present without witness. See 1501. 5221 Ninia See pg 115 v. 10, pg 105-115 vol. 15

Keawehualoe sworn. I know the house lot of claimant in Lahaina. It is now occupied by Victor Pancerol as an eating house and it is fenced. The fence is the correct boundary.

Claimant got this land from Hoapili Kane, and built the house on it and fence. I never heard the title disputed. Claimant has had peaceable possession, and now rents the premises. I do not know of his other lands.

Kalaikini sworn, confirmed the preceding testimony and knew of no counter claim.

#### 5832 Kaumaiewa

Claimant said his only proper witness was Kaniau now in Hamakua, from whom he has the land.

Moku sworn I am luna auhau of Lahaina. I know claimants land-it is in one piece and a ssectio in the ahupuaa of Kamani. Bounded mauka by Kanainas Polanui; Olowalu by Punau; Makai by Kanaina's, Kaanapali by Polanui.

Claimant had this land from Kaniau in 1836 and has occupied it in peace ever since.

Keohokaua sworn Knew the land and that claimant had lived there in peace ever since 1839.

#### 5834 Kaweawea

The claimant is dead, but his widow Kamakana appears to represent him.

Puhia sworn: I know two of the lands of Kaweawea, his house lots in Lahaina and lands in Olowalu.

One of his house lots in Puakoo is bounded Mauka by the main St. of Lahaina; Olowalu by house lot of Kekauonohi; Makai by an old fish pond dry; Kaanapali by Kaiheekai's lot (John Holulu). It has a fence, which is its true boundary.

Claimant had this land from Kaona in Hoapili's time, and held it in peace to his death, excepting a claim set upon it a year or two ago by Kekauonohi. She wished to buy it, or exchange it for a place uka.

I know his house lot mauka, on Puakoo. Bounded Mauka by Kalua's lot, and Olowalu side, Makai and Kaanapali by yard of Kleleliki-it has a fence, which is its true boundary.

Claimant had this lot from Kekauonohi in past, and from Kalaikoa's wife Kaleohemahema in part in 1837, and he held it in peace till his death.

The lands of Kaweawea in Olowalu consist of some Kula with a house lot, and 23 Kalo patches besides 2 dry ones. It is an ili called Honokawaikukui. I cannot give its correct boundaries.

Claimant received this by wife from Kahaona about 1836, and held it to his death on 10 of last May, in peace as far as I know. I have heard lately that some one has disputed it, Kekaunaoa perhaps.

There is also a Kalo patch on Bolabola that belonged to claimant. Bounded Mauka by Kealohapalani's land; Olowaly by Ninia's; Makai by Kaluas, Poalima land; Kaanapali by Nahau's Kalo patch.

Claimant received this from Kenalo in old times of Hoapili, and held it without dispute to his death. I have heard that he gave the house lot in Lahaina to Kekauonohi on condition that he was to hold in undisturbed possession, the house lot Mauka. I heard this from Kaweawe.

Keawe sworn, old, I know these lands of Kaweawe, the Makai or town lot he had from Kahaona in 1836 by Will. The house lot Mauka from Keakuonohi, in Hoapili's time. The ili of Honokawaikukui from Kahaona in 1836 and held to his death in peace. What Pahia said of the Kalo patch in Bolabola is correct.

The heirs of claimant are his widow Kamakaua and his adopted son Kahaumanu. He has two children, a son and a daughter, Haona the son's name and Waiokauia the daughters.

Kalua sworn, I know the two house lots claimed by Kaweawe. Soon after Nahienaena's death, Kekauonohi came here, and wished Kaweawe to give her his house and lot in Lahaina from her calabashes and go and live on one of her lots in the country Mauka. He did so but whether he gave up his town lot entirely I cannot say. He lived on the Mauka lot from 1836 to his death, and Kekauonohi has kept possession of the one in town. Kaweawe and she settled it last April as I heard from them that claimant should have the Mauka lot and Keakuonohi the one in town.

A writing to this effect was produced in Evidence. (v.7/5-7)

6243 Kaohie See page 177

Claimant states: I had 7 lands, and 6 were given up by me to the King, that I might have "Kilolani" and a house lot for myself.

Keaweluaole sworn. I know claimant's house lot in Lahaina, on "Puako", it is bounded Mauka by John Hoolulu's lot; Olowalu by dry fishpond of Chiefs; Makai by the lot of Kaluaehu and the other side. It has a fence which forms the true boundary.

I have heard claimant had this lot from Kanikoa, his former wife in 1842. Since then the King has had possession of it, he took it on Kanikoa's death.

The claimant was directed to bring his paper showing the division of his lands with the King, on the next day, 30<sup>th</sup> May 1849. Claimant appeared today and produced a paper showing that his lands had been divided with the King, and that "Kilolani" was to remain as the claimant's is read as follows "No Kaohie. Kilolani, Ahupuaa Lahaina, Maui. I hookomo I ka hoona Kuleana."

C Hale Alii Signed S.P. Kalama Kakauolelo

February 7, 1828.

He also produced a letter from the King referring to his house lot in Lahaina requesting that the same might be laid before his Majesty. (v.7/7-8)

6389 Kahalelole

Keaweluaole sworn. I know this land, it is an ili in "Waikapu" its name is "Loaloa."

Claimant was one of Hoapili's carpenters, and I was a luna over them. By Hoapili's orders, I gave this land to claimant in 1837. He has held undisputed possession of it to this time, paying its taxes. Kekuana or Victoria is Lord over him if he has any. (v.7/8)

6390 Kahikona We.

Kalaikini sworn. I know part of these lands claimed. What I know of is in Lahainaluna, consisting of 4 Kalo patches, a dry loi, and a Kula. One Kalo patch and the Kula lie together in "Kelauea" and 3 Kalo patch and the Kula with 1 dry patch are in "Paunau". I could point them out to a surveyor, though I cannot define them here, it consists of 3 separate pieces.

That in Kelauea is bounded Mauka by Lui's land; Olowalu by Kahookanu's; Makai by Kaaiono's yard; Kaanapali by Kapihanui's land.

Claimant had these lands from her father Nahaikuaana as I have heard. She has held them in peace since his death about 2 years. I know he held them in peace 13 years before he died.

Polea sworn. I know claimant's father worked these lands with myself and others from 1833 to his death, he held them undisputed, when he died they descended to claimant.

Kalaikini recalled, says claimant has a house lot in Lahaina also; bounded Mauka by Pikanele's land; Olowalu by a large fish pond of the Kings; Makai by Kaleipaihala's yard; Kaanapali by Kanaina's, now occupied by Polea, it has on it a stone house.

Claimant got this land in the same manner as her other lands. I helped to build her father's house, and he held without dispute 12 ½ years. Kanaina and lot have lately disputed claimants title to this house as I have heard.

Polea recalled, Kanaina disputes the claimants title as the heir of Hoapili. The claimants father built the stone house on this lot in 1837 and occupied it in peace to his death, his title is very ancient, and Kanaina's claim a new one. Upon reflection I think he disputed this title of claimant's father just before his death. (v. 7/8-9)

6391 Kekaulele See Vol 84

Claimant stated that his witnesses were in Oahu and Hamakua. He has a house lot in Lahaina for which he had witnesses.

Nui sworn. The house lot of claimant I know-it is in Lahainawaena, bounded Mauka by Kaawa's lot, Olowalu by the same; Makai by "Kapoulu road", Kaanapali by road from the town to Lahainaluna. It has a fence which is its true boundary.

Claimant had the land from Maluo, and had held it undisturbed from 1837. (v. 7/9)

6208 Kalaikini See p. 119 9/10

Claimant has sent in several claims for the same lands, but says they are all comprised in this claim (see 5124).

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the lands in this claim, one is in Lahainawaena where claimant lives in "Kalawea" Ahupuaa. It is an ili called "Kumunui". I know Hoapili Wahine gave claimant this land in 1837. I think in compensation for his building her stone house of "Luaehu". He has improved it, and occupies it in peace to this time paying taxes on it, he pays 1 dollar a year to Kekuanaoa as an acknowledgement of Lordship. "Keapaumi" This bounded Mauka by the ili of "Iaualoa", Olowalu by my land; Makai by ili of "Auwaiolimu"; Kaanapali by ili of "Opilopilo" my land.

He has also lands at Uhumehauwe. They consist of 4 Ridges of dry land together, called Ahupua Moos. Also 4 Kalo patches apart, these and the moos were given to claimant as I have always heard in pay for keeping cattle for Lot Kamehameha or Kekuanaoa. He received them in 1845 and has ever since held them undisputed.

Claimant said he relinquished his claim to land in Hawaii a house lot in Kailu-district of Kailua. He also said that his claim for a house lot in Lahainawaena was heard by Mr. Richards; and a survey was then made of it. (Nothing of the kind on Record under this number, J.K. Smith, Sec.)

No 327 delivered. (v. 7/9-10)

6403 Napuu

Kahula sworn. I know this land, it is in "Paunau", consisting of 12 Kalo patches, 13 in one piece. Bounded Mauka by ili of "Oia"; Olowalu by a precipice; Makai by ili of "Palaani", Kaanapali by creek of Paunau."

This land was mine from time of Kahemahema 1 and in 1836 I gave it to claimant, who now holds it under me on condition that he does Poalima work. The land can never be taken from

him as long as he does this. As I understand the laws the land is his but he does Polima for Victoria. These is no dispute nor ever has been about his title.

Claimant has also 1 Kalo patch far makai of the 13, but on "Paunau", it is in Lahainaluna.

I gave this to wife of claimant in 1842 perhaps he gained it by marriage, and has held it undisputed. Bounded Mauka by yard of Kailua; Olowalu Lahainaluna Rad; Makai by Kamanawa's land, Kaanapali by Ed. Butler. (v. 7/10-11)

#### 6437 Kaiwipalupalu

Kanana sworn. I know this house lot in Lahaina with 1 Kalo patch in one piece. Bounded Mauka by Kaiki's lot, Olowalu by Lahainaluna Road, Makai by yard of Kahalelola, Kaanapali by Kauaina's yard.

This land was mine, and I gave it to Keawekolohe about 1842. I had it from my ancestors who lived there from time of Kamehameha 1.

Kalaikini sworn. Keawekolohe gave this land to claimant in 1846 and he had since held it in peace.

#### 6432 Kanainau

Claim for 20 Kalo patches in Ahupuaa of Kelaweia, Lahaina and an ili at Honokauwai in Kaanapali.

Keaweluaole sworn. I know part of claimant's land, he has 17 Kalo patches in one lot lying in Kelaweia which he got from Pikanele in 1842. I was witness to the Gift. Claimant is a mason, I worked for him. Pikanele has this land from Kekuanaoa. This is land is not comprised in the ili Kupono. Claimant has held it without dispute. It is bounded Mauka by my land "Kukuikapu", Olowalu by Kahookanu's land and yard, Makai by my house lot, Kaanapali by "Kapoulu".

Claimant has also one lot (loi) in the land of Pikanele or Victoria, and 2 others far inland, but they are all in Kelaweia. He had them from Pikanele, and has held them from him ever since in peace. I know of no counter claim.

Keawehaulu sworn. I know claimant's ili in Honokawai, it's name is "Wanaloa". He had it from Pikanele in 1842 who had it from Kekuanaoa. Claimant has held it ever since in peace.



The boundaries of this ili are well known to me, but I cannot well describe them. I was witness to the Gift. Claimant had this land for work done for Pikanele.

4662 Paaluhi

Claim for 5 Kalo patches, 1 house lot and 2 sections or ridges of Kula land, all in "Punau", Lahaina.

Kahula sworn. I know claimant lands, he had them from me in time of Hooapili, and has held them ever since in peace. He does Poalima work for Victoria.

The House lot Kula land and Kalo 2 patches are in one piece, and bounded Mauka by Kalo land of Kahikona, Olowalu by land called "Kulahuhu", Makai by "Puhowali", Kaanapali by Poalima Kalo land of Victoria.

He has 3 lois mauka of the creek of Lahainaluna. These patches are in the ili of Kaaimanini. They are separated. I cannot well give the bounds. (v. 7/12)

6210 Kaihi

Lands in "Punau", Lahaina, consisting of 1 house lot and 12 Kalo patches.

Nui sworn. I know these lands of 1 House lot and lois 12 lying in one piece. The house lot is between Lahaina and Lahainaluna, bounded Mauka by Road to Kapoulu; Olowalu by Lahainaluna Road, Makai by yard claimed by Kawipalupalu, Kaanapali by Kapena's yard. It has a fence which is its true boundary. Claimant had this from Malu about 1837, and has ever since held it in peace.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by Kalo land of Kekahuna; Kaanapali by precipice bounding the Creek; Makai and Olowalu by the Creek.

Some of these lois are very small, lying in the bed of the creek above Lahainaluna.

Claimant's title to this Kalo land is the same as to his house lot, and to my knowledge has never been disputed. The Poalima belongs to Victoria. (v. 7/12-13)

5258 Manu

Manauu witness absent, postponed. Resumed pg. 45 (v. 7/13)

4803 Walia

House lot in Lahaina, Ahupuaa of "Lapakea".

Kelolou sworn. I know this lot, it is in Lahaina, Lapakea, Bounded Mauka by Kahanu's loi, Olowalu by Kikiau's yard, Makai by Lahaina main Street, Kaanapali by yard of John Shaw. It has a fence which is the true boundary. Claimant held this lot from his ancestors and has held it undisputed since Kamehameha 1. I never heard of any counter claim. (v. 7/13)

4804 Nui K.

17 Kalo patches Lahaina muka, and 1 house lot in Lahaina.

Nana sworn. I know these lands, the house lot is at Paunau, Lahainawaena. Mauka is yard of Umiumi, Olowalu a dry creek; Makai Kaawa, Kaanapali Lahainaluna Road. It has a fence which is the true boundary.

Claimant had this land from his father, who, together have held it undisputed from Kamehameha 1 time.

Claimant has 17 Kalo patches, 15 of them lie in the valley above Lahainaluna and are in one lot. Mauka are the lois of Umiumi, Olowalu the creek, and Makai, Kaanapali the precipice. Kekuaanaoa has 1 loi within these bounds.

The other 2 lois are at Lahainalalo, Mauka are Kanaina's lois, Olowalu Paunau water course, Makai yard of etKe(?), Kaanapali "Kapawahua" of Boke.

These Kalo lands he had from his Parents, and they have been in the undisturbed possession of his family from time of Kamehameha 1. Poalima is Victoria. (v. 7/ 14)

4801 G. Luanui

For an ili in Lahaina in Ahupuaa of Uhao.

Claimant states he gave up 2 lands in Hawaii to the King, at the late division, and this was left to him. The lands given up were Waiolimu in Kau, and Puohua.

Kaleipaihala sworn. I know Uahu in Lahaina of claimant. It is a portion of land given to the claimant by the King to be his forever, in exchange for lands in Kau and Hilo, Hawaii.

Claimant had this land originally from his ancestors and has occupied it undisputed from 1835 to my knowledge.

Bounded Mauka and Olowalu by "Uhao II", Makai and Kaanapali by "Ahi 1". (v. 7/14)

4320 Kaua See 186 v. 8

For ahupuaa in Lahaina called Kapili to small farm and house lot in Puako, also a land in Hana.

Claimant says the Ahupuaa of Kopili was given him by the King, at late division, for a land in Molokai called "Kipu". Se Oahu Book 9.

Mohu sworn. I know claim to lands in Puako, Lahaina, a house lot and small adjoining farm. Bounded by the Kula of Maulukoi Mauka, Olowalu by "Pakala", Makai by Kalo land called Alapai, Kaanapali by Pauna and small portion of Waianae.

Claimant had this land from Nahienaena, and ever since held it in peace. The King gave the Ahupuaa of Kapili to claimant who has held it peaceably since 1825. I never heard of his title being disputed. (v. 7/14-15)

5207 Ulumeheihei

Claimant dead. Kaleipouhala her husband represents her, who with all present state and Laanui as her heir.

Kaleiopahala sworn having no interest. The lands of Ulumeheihei were Kaohe in Kona, Hawaii, and Polaiki, Lahaina Maui.

At recent division of lands Kaohe was given to the King and Polaihi confirmed to Ulumeheihei, who had it from Liholiho, and her title undisputed to her death. I am her husband, we had no children. G. Laanui is her nearest relative living and her heir. (v. 7/15)

5207B Kaleipaihala

This claim was included in 5207, but not separately numbered, Ahupuaa of Wainee, Lahaina, Maui.

Kinau sworn. Claimant lands were 3 Kii(?) Makawao and Wainee on Maui, and Kuwilei, Hawaii. At late division claimant gave up Makawao and Kuwilei, and Ahupuaa of Wainee in Lahaina was confirmed to claimant by the King.

Wainee runs from the sea to the Mountain I think. Claimed side is "Waineeuuku", Kaanapali is "Puako".

Claimant had held undisputed this land since 1837.

Keaweoku sworn. I know the house lot, 6 Kalo patches and 3 ridges of upland at Olowalu. The house lot is on the Sea shore, its fence is its true boundary. Keawe now occupied it for claimant or dependant on him. The six Kalo patches are far inland in the ili of Maomao in one lot. Mauka is the great creek of Uhumehawe, Kaanapali a Pali.

The upland ridges joined the house lot, but the Road divided them, leaving the house lot on the sea side.

The upland is bounded Mauka and East by land of "Kaluaaha", Makai Olowalu road; Lahaina "Kapuaa".

These lands came to claimant from Keopuolani, brother of the King who died about 1823, and he has held them undisputed.

Claimant states that Mr. Richards head his claim for a house lot in Lahaina.

7679 Kalaipaihala

Identical with No. 5207-B, Ulumeheihei and heirs. (v. 7/16)

7680 Ulumeheihei

Identical with the last part of No. 5207 and heirs. (v. 7/16)

4316 Keohokaua

For house lot and 2 separate Kalo patches or lands in Lahaina district.

Uaua sworn. I know the lands of claimant. They are in the Ili of Puaa. The house lot is in Lahainalulo on Olowalu side of Mr. Baldwin's Meeting House. Mauka is Kalo patch of Kuakanmaena, Olowalu by land of Kooka, Makai Kekauonohi's, Kaanapali of Kuakamauna.

Claimant had this house lot from Kahuni an Elder Brother, who had it from Kuakamauna in 1839, and claimant has held it undisputed with the exception of a claim made by Kalua for Kekauonohi, he still holds it.

He has also 2 Kalo lands inland in "Kanaula", I think. There are 20 lois all in one and 9 in the other land. I cannot bounds them weh. These Kalo lands claimant had from Kuakamauna in 1839 and his right never disputed to my knowledge. Claimant said his best witness- Kuakamauna, was at Oahu. (v. 7/16-17)

6413 Kaaukai

For 17 Lois and potato patch in Ahupuaa Kuholilea Lahaina.

Kanalu sworn. I know these lands. Claimant had them from a man Pakaha (dead) in 1841. Pakaha was a luna of a portion of "Kuholilea". Claimant has ever since held them undisputed. He does poalima for Kanaina.

The Mauka Lois are 11 in number. Mauka, Kenui's lois; Olowalu creek Paunau and Makai, Kaanapali main Auwai.

The Potato land and Makai Lois are bounded Mauka by kula of Kuholikea, Olowalu by creek of Paunau, Makai also, Kaanpali by Wahikuli. (v. 7/17)

4533 Ualo

House lot in Wainee 1 and 8 Lois and Kula in Wainee II

Kua sworn. I know these lands, Ualo had them from his ancesstors who held in time of Kamehameha 1. They planted the cocoa-nut trees and tilled the land. From the time of Hoapili for 10 years I have never heard claimants title disputed. The house lot is bounded Mauka by Kalaipaihala's land; Olowalu also, Makai by land of Hoapil's heirs, Kaanapali by "Pakalu".

The 8 Lois and Kula lie together in Wainee elua, and are bounded Mauka by waste Kula, Olowalu by Kalo of Kalaipaihala, Makai by an auwai separating from Paku's land, Kaanapali Kalaipaihala's Kula. I never heard claimants right to this lot disputed. (v.7/17)

6424 Kanehoewaa

For house lot and farm.

Lelehu sworn. I know these lands. Claimant had them from Hoau who had them from me about 10 years since. I had them from Kaahumanu. I never heard claimants title disuted.

The house lot is in Lahaina, the part called Moalii. Mauka is David Malo's land, Olowalu Kaulakukui's, Makai my land, Kaanapali my yard. The fence is the true boundary.

The farm lot is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Moalii's creek, Makai my land and Kaanapali. (v. 7/18)

6440 Keawe

For 6 Kalo patches in Haleu Lahaina, division of "Kauaula".

Lono sworn. I am head man of Nahaoleelua over the land of Haleu. I know these 6 Lois in one lot in Haleu. I gave them to claimant in 1842, and he has held them ever since in peace. He does Poalima for John Young or Nahaoleelua.

Mauka is Kaluaopele's Kalo land, Olowalu a stream dividing it from my lands, Makai Nahaoleelua's Kalo, Kaanapali by "Mahila" (Land). (v. 7/18)

6441 Keokeo

Lono sworn. I know claimants lands, they are 8 Kalo patches in one lot, in Haleu Ahupuaa, Kauaula, in Lahaina.

I gave this land to claimant as Luna of Haleu about 1842, and he has held it in peace ever since, he does poalima for J. Young or Nahaoleelua. It is bounded Mauka by the creek, Olowalu by Halakaa's land, Makai by Nahaoleelua's poalima lois, Kaanapali by Mua's. (v.7/18)

5387 Hinau Keone

For 1 Kalo patch at Ukumehame Maui

1 Ahupuaa "Keawenui" Molokai

1 Ili "Lilipuna" Kaneohe, Oahu

Kaleipaihala sworn. I know claimants lands at Molokai and Oahu. He owned "Keawenui" Molokai and Lilipuna Oahu, but gave his Oahu land to the King in late division, and the King confirmed claimants title to "Keawenui" to him and his heirs for ever (see Office Book). The bounds cannot be defined of that land. It is in Kona.

I do not know claimants land at "Ukumehame".

Kaniaunu sworn. I know Hinau's Loi in Ukumehame. It was a teacher's named Moo 10 or 12 years since, and from him it came to claimant through the widow of Moo, who is his wife, Kahaiaohe. I never heard his rights disputed. It is a large loi, Mauka is waste land, Maalea side a creek, Makai paahao loi, Lahaina D. Malos.

I think now that David Malo claims this patch in his capacity of Kahukula. Kaleiwahalu has the case of it for claimant.

5113 Kailaa, W. Identical with 2924 in part.

Kamaunu sworn. I know claimants house lot at Olowalu Maui. Its fence is its true boundary. Kauaaua has now charge of it for claimant. Kekapa claimants son gave her this lot, he was a teacher there, and died 1845. When he left it to her, he got it before 1839 and held it in peace to his death. Claimant and title has not been disputed since.

She says she has a claim for a house lot in Lahaina ed. By Mr. Richards, and surveyed by P. Richardson. (v. 7/19)

6404 Keaka Duplicate of 5107 (v. 7/19)

6484 Kanae 31 May 1849

For 2 lines of Kalo patches at Paunau, Lahaina.

Kanana sworn. I know these lands in Paunau. Claimant had them from Kamanawa, Konohiki in time of Kamehameha 1. They were after taken from him and restored in 1838, and he has ever since held them undisputed.

Eight patches are in one piece above Lahainaluna in the bed of the valley. Mauka are lois of Kailaa and Maluo, Olowalu the creek, Makai Poilima lois of Kekuanaoa, Kaanapali of Kepuna.

The other lois are farther inland. Mauka, Olowalu and Makai is the creek, Kaanapali precipice. (v. 7/20)

6606 Puali

For Kalo and Kula at Kooka, Lahaina, and a house lot.

Olala sworn. I know these lands, they consist of 30 small Lois, Kula, and house lot in one piece.

Claimant had them from apaa, once head man of Kooka now dead, he gave them to him in 1832 and he has held them undisputed ever since. Namauu elua is now head man there as King's Agent, to whom belongs Poalima.

Mauka is Kalahoohuia's land, Olowalu also, Makai Lahili's, Kaanapali "Kiua". (v. 7/20)

6604 Pule

For a farm in Ahupuaa of Panaewa, Lanaina. Kalo and Kula in one.

Umiumi sworn. I know the land of Kalo and Kula and house lot in one piece. Pule had it from Kamakini before 1835 and has held it in peace to his death, in January last.

Kamakini's wife Naaoa has disputed his title since his death, but never before.

Mauka is Kalua's poalima lois, Olowalu Nauku's lands, Makai Naaoa's, Kaanapali "Paeohi".

Hauola is the heir of Pule as nearest relative. He left no wife or children. (v. 7/20-21)

6549 Keauola no witness. See page 22. (v. 7/21)



6729 Maluo See page 129 v. 10

Claimant is dead, his wife Kamanaha represents him. He is a claim for house lot in Panaewa, Kula and Kalo in Paunau, all in Lahaina. See claim 2538 (Umiumi). There is also another house lot and Kula in Paunau.

Kanana sworn. I know the lands of Maluo on Paunau only, not the house lot. Claimant was the head man for Paunau in time of Kamehameha 1 but others held these lands. Some of them came direct to him from Kamakini who was over him, and some from others. He obtained them about 1837. These lands consist of 4 Moos of Kula in one lot, two of which have been disputed by Keaweluaole who has filed a claim with the B.L. Comm. For them they are on the Olowalu side. There are 8 Kalo patches scattered, 3 are connected with the Moos spoken of, and the house lot in one piece. These 3 patches were disputed by Keawekuaole, but it was settled by the Lunaauhau, of the name of Moku, who gave ½ to each, the is now oluolu. The title to the house lot has been disputed by Umiumi, who sent in a claim for it in 1848.

The other patches are disputed, two in one piece by Kekaunaoa's head man Maikai who pulled up the Kalo fo the 2, and 5 patches remaining, in 1848. This has been a matter of contention for many years. Maluo has however held possession all the time, and I believe the lands are truly his.

No. 6.7. an 8 patches are undisputed.

Hauola sworn. I know the house lot of claimant in Pauaewa, it is part of Kamakini's house lot but not separately fenced. Claimant had it from Kamakini before 1838 and held it in peace to his death in April last. I never heard his right in it disputed. Mauka is land of Kamakini, Olowalu a stream dividing it from Kamakini's house lot, Makai the Seaman's Chapel Road, North by the main road to Lahainaluna.

Counter claim remain to be heard.

6529 Hauola

Claim for 1 piece "Paeohi" Lahaina

Kahea sworn. I know claimants land in Paeohi, Lahaina, consisting of a house lot, Kalo land, and Kula in one piece, and the fence is the true boundary. Claimant had it from Waiki in time of Kamehameha 1 and has held undisputed claim till very lately when L. Kaauwai set up a claim as

head man of this land. He has since been superseded by Kapuonui who has not disputed it.

6753 Wahinepio W. Same as 650

For a houselot in Lahaina.

Piinaia sworn. I know this lot, it is fenced and that is the true boundary. Mauka is land "Kuia", Olowalu "Puiki", Makai Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali the Hospital Lot.

Claimant had this lot from the King in 1833 and has held undisputed possession ever since. (v. 7/22)

7229 Lono

For 15 Kalo patches and House lot in Lahaina.

Nahaoleelua sworn. I know these lands of Lono, his house lot at Haleu in Lahaina connecting some Kalo land. Mauka Hala trees between it and John Youngs lands, Olowalu "Namakalua" Kalo patches, Makai Tammy Young's land; Kaanapali "Paunau".

Claimant has more patches further up, but I do not know the number or bounds. I, as head man of Haleu, gave these lands to him about 1836, and he has ever since held them undisputed, he does Poalima for J. Young, and is a kind of luna over the land. (v. 7/22-23)

6725 Moluhi

For 3 Lois Haleu, Lahaina

Lono sworn. I gave claimant these lands in Namakaha's Governorship, and he has held them in peace ever since, he does Poalima for J. Young.

These 3 Lois are in one piece. Mauka and Olowalu is the stream, Makai Keawekea's land, on the other side is Dr. Baldwin's land. (v. 7/23)

7632 Kahookana

For an ili in Luhaina, Kelauea "Kupiaakainamaka"(name).

Keaweluaole sworn. I know this land, it is an ili of Haleu, each in one piece, of Kula and Kalo. Mauka is "Ukukapu", Olowalu my land "Kukuikapu", Makai "Oanaloa", Kaanapali the stream.

Claimant had this land from Hoapili W. in 1836 and has held it in peace ever since. He is luna under Kekuanaoa.

Claimant has a house lot in Lahaina; Mr. Richards heard that claim.

Kalaikini sworn. I know the evidence and it is true.

See v. 15 pg. 4 (v. 7/23)

7687 Napohaku

For house lot and 10 Kalo patches in "Kilolani" in Lahaina.

Makaulia sworn. I know these lands consisting of a house lot and 3 Kalo patches in one piece, and 7 other lois in another place. Claimant had these lands from Kanikoa, former wife of Kahoie, now Lord of the land. I think it was about 1836, and he has held them in peace to the present. He works Poalima with Kahoie.

The house lot and 3 Lois in one piece. Mauka is "Bolabola", Olowalu "Waiana", Makai "Kilolani" land of Kaohie, Kaanapali Dr. Baldwin's land on "Haleu".

The 7 remaining lois are inland of the House lot in one piece, which is bounded Mauka by "Paunau", Olowalu by "Heuleu", Makai and Kaanapali Paunau. (v. 7/24)

7263 Nahupu

For 3 Kalo patches Haleu, Lahaina.

Lono sworn. I know 3 Kalo patches of claimant on Haleu, one is in Lahainalalo and the other two uka or inland on the same lands. I gave these to the claimant as head man of Heuleu, in Namakaha's governorship at 1842, and he has held them in peace ever since.

The Makai patch is bounded; Mauka by Auwaa's Kalo patch, Olowalu by the stream, Makai by Poalima lois of John Young, Kaanapali by dry land of "Haleu".

The two patches Mauka are bounded by lois of Kalakoa, Olowalu the stream, Makai by lois of Moluhi, Kaanapali by Pahoia pali. (v. 7/24)

7633 O. Kapuhi

For 1 piece of Kalo land in "Puehehu", Lahaina.

Mohu sworn. I know this piece of land in Lahaina, Mauka Kaniho's land, Olowalu Laahili's, Makai Puehehu creek, Kaanapali also.

Claimant had it from Hoapili in 1837 and held it undisputed to this time. (v. 7/24-25)

7269 Auwaa

Nalulu sworn. I know these lands in "Healeu" Lahaina, a small hose lot and 12 Lois, 3 of which are dry.

Claimant had them from Nahaoleelua in Namakeeha's Governorship 1842, and has held the lois undisturbed, but Nahaoleelua disputes the House lot.

The lois are scattered, I could point them out, but cannot define the bounds.

The house lot is bounded Mauka by Mua's yard, Olowalu by Lono's place, Makai by Wahaoleelua's yard, Kaanapali by "Paunau".

Lono sworn. I know Auwaa's house lot in "Healeu", he had it from Nahaoleelua in 1842 and has held it to this time, but disputed by Nahaoleelua who made Auwaa "Head man" of "Healeu" and gave him this place to live in. I think it should be Nahaoleelua's now that Auwaa is no longer head man.

Nalulu recalled. I am of the same opinion as to the right of Nahaoleelua. (v. 7/25)

4878 Upai 31 May 1849

Muaa sworn. I know these lands being 9 Kalo patches and 1 Kula land, scattered, all in "Pahoia", Lahaina.

Claimant had them from Nalehu 1839 or 1840, he has held them ever since in peace. Kekuaaoa has the Poalima. The Luna under him is Kaehunui.

The Kula and 5 Kalo patches are in 1 piece, bounded Mauka and Olowalu by hill of Pahoa, Makai Lois of Nalehu and Pikanele, Kaanapali Lois of Pikanele.

Three other Lois further towards the Sea are in one lot.

Bounded Mauka by Kaehunui's Lois, Olowalu a Pali, Makai my own lois, Kaanapali also.

The remaining Loi is a large one "Mauka", bounded Mauka by Kaehunui's, Olowalu Pali, Makai my loi, Kaanapali Kula (waste).

Nalehu sworn. I know these lands of claimant Muua's testimony is all correct. But claimant has a dwelling place in a large enclosed yard in Waiokama Lahaina, and also two ridges of Kula within on which his house stands.

He had it from me, I had it from Maele, and Maele had it from Kane maikou. Upai got it from me in 1846, and I had it from Maele in 1839. Upai's title has never been disputed. Lot is the high Landlords of this part.

Mauka is road from Dr. Baldwin's Meeting House to Olowalu, Olowalu and Makai by my yard, Kaanapali Hoohole's yard. (v 7/25-26)

4878-B Part 1 Kaua deceased. See pg 167

Muua sworn. The lands of Kapuaa are well known to me, they are a house lot and Kula in one piece, and 6 separate Lois.

Claimant had these lands from very ancient times before my remembrance. I know them to have been in his peaceable possession 15 years. These lands are in Pahoa, Lahaina.

The house lot and Kula are bounded Mauka by Kula of Pahoa and waste; Olowalu by Paniani's yard; Makai by main road from Lahaina to Olowalu. Other side by my place.

The Lois are Mauka on the creek in two pieces of 3 Lois each. One lot is bounded Mauka by Lois of Moku, Olowalu by waste land, Makai and North Moku's lois.

The other piece is more mauka. Mauka is the creek of Pahoa, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai Kaepunui's land, North the creek. (v. 7/26)

4878 Part II Muua

Nalehu sworn. I know these lands, being 17 Lois, a house lot and Kula in 1 piece, the Lois are scattered, all in "Pahoa", Lahaina. Claimant had these lands from Maele in 1839 and ever since held them in peace.

The piece containing the House lot and most of the Kula is bounded Mauka by waste Kula of Pahoa, Olowalu by Kapua's land, Makai by Olowalu main road, North by the Kula of Kauahamano.

Claimant has another Kula farther Mauka. Mauka is the Pali, Olowalu Kula of "Polanui", Makai by land of Hone, N. by Pikanele.

7 of his Lois are in one piece. Mauka is Upaiilo'i's, Olowalu and Makai and Kaanapali my lois.

Another piece further Makai in the creek contains 15 Lois. Mauka is Kawahamano's lois, Olowalu a barren Pali, Makai Hoone's lois, Kaanapali Pali and creek. (v. 7/26-27)

#### 4878-D Part III Hoone

Claimant is dead, and is represented by his Widow Kuapua. He has 3 children.

Mouaa sworn. The lands of Hoone are in Pahoa, Lahaina, and consist of 13 Lois and a piece of Kula land.

Hoone received these land from Nameauu, deceased, he received them in 1844, and held them up to his death in November 1848. His widow has held them to Namauu as Konohiki under Kekuanaoa.

The Kula is bounded on the Mauka by Kula of Pahoa, Olowalu by Polanui, Makai by my lands, Kaanapali by yard of Kaliluhi.

The 15 Lois are in one piece which are bounded Mauka by my Lois, Olowalu by a Pali, Makai by the lois of Pelekani, Kaanpali by the creek of Pahoa. (v. 7/27)

#### 4878-E Part 4 Holi

Pi sworn. The lands of Holi are on Mahila, Lahaina, and consist of four Moos or ridges of land in one piece and 14 Lois-uka.

Claimant received these lands from the Konohiki Kamaihina, in the days of Hoapili, before 1839. From that time to this he has possessed these lands without dispute.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the yard of Kalehoula, Olowalu by the land of Pupule, Makai by the land of Naea, Kaanapali by "Kaulalo".

The Lois 14 in number are all in one piece, which is bounded Mauka by the land of Pupule, Olowalu by the creek, makai by the land lois of Hookeokoe, Kaanapali by a Pali. (v. 7/28)

#### 4878-F Part 5 Pi

Holi sworn. I know the lands of Pi, they are in "Makila", Lahaina, and they consist of those Moos or ridges of Kula land on which his house stands which are in one piece, also one House lot separated from this, and one piece of Kalo land containing 40 Lois.

Claimant received these lands from Kaulunae in 1824 and he has held them without dispute ever since. The King is the great Lord of "Mahila" and to him belongs the Poalima.

The piece of Kula is bounded by the House lot of Maimaie Mauka, Olowalu by the land of Kekua, Makai by the road to Olowalu, Kaanapali by the land of Paele.

The House lot further mauka is bounded Mauka by the stream, Olowalu and Makai by Kapuka's land, Kaanapali by the land of Maimai.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Auwai dividing it from the Lois of Makakapu, Olowalu by the creek course dividing it from uncultivated Kula.

#### 4878-G Part 6 Malaekahana

Makaulia sworn. I know the land of claimant, they are in Polanui, Lahaina, and consist of three distinct pieces. One Kalo land and two patches of Kula, There is a house lot beside this.

Claimant had these lands from a woman Kamano's wife, this was in 1835, I think, and he has never been disputed in his title to the present time. I am the head man of Polanui under Kanaina.

One piece of Kula containing two Moo's is Makai and is bounded Mauka by Kanaina Poalima Lois, Olowalu by the land of Makuwahine, Makai by the yard of Kaoo, on the other side by the same.

The Mauka piece of Kula is fenced, and the fence is the correct boundary. Mauka of it is the Kula of mine, Olowalu is "Puunau", Makai is Polaiki's land, on the other side is the land of Koalakai.

The House lot has two houses on it, and is bounded, Mauka by the land of Makuwahine's land, Olowalu by John White's land, Makai the road to Olowau, on the other side by the land of Kapuoanui.

The Kalo land contains 10 Lois, and it is bounded Mauka by "Alio", Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Poalima lois of Kanaina, Kaanapali by Wainee. (v. 7/29)

#### 48780-H Part 7 Waihoioahu

Kule sworn. I know all the lands of claimant, they are in Paunau nui Lahaina, they consist of one House lot, and 3 Lois in one piece, and 4 Moos of Kula in another piece. 15 Lois in another piece, 2 Lois in another piece, and 1 Loi by itself making all six distinct pieces.

Claimant received these lands from Kamaihina in 1837, and he has held them in undisturbed possession ever since. There is however a Polaima land midst of his kula.

The House lot piece is bounded Mauka by Kapu's land, Olowalu by "Kalaha", Makai by the Poalima land of Pahi, Kaanapali by "Paunau akahi".

The piece of 4 Moos is bounded Mauka by the Poalima land of Paki, Olowalu by the land of Kupali, Makai by the yard of Kamaihina, Kaanapali by "Paunau akahi".

The 15 Lois piece is uka loa, and is bounded Mauka by the Lois of Alapai, Olowalu by the lois of Kawau, Makai by the lois Poalima of Paki, Kaanapali by a Pali and Kaulunee's places.

One of the 2 Lois piece is bounded Mauka by the lois Poalima of Paki, Olowalu by the Pali, makai by loi Poalima, Kaanapali by "Kooka".

Another 2 Lois piece makai of the 15 Lois piece, is bounded Mauka Poalima lois, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by creek and Poalima lois, on the other side by the Pali, and "Paunau".

The other loi is bounded on all sides by my land. (v. 7/29-30)

Wainoioahu sworn. I know the lands of claimant, they are in Paunau, Lahaina, and "Waiokama". The consist of a House lot on the sea beach, this is in "Waiokama", 16 Lois in one piece, and three Moo's of Kula in another piece. These last two pieces are in "Paunaunui".

These lands were formerly mine. I received them from Kamailina in 1832, and held them quietly up to 1846 when I gave them to claimant, who has since held them in peace.

The house lot is bounded Mauka by the Pond of Nalehu, Olowalu by the yard of Kalaimoku, Makai by the sea, on the other side by the yard of Kalaimoku.

The piece of three Moos is bounded Mauka by "Paunauiki", Olowalu side also, Makai and Kaanapali sides by my land.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the lois of Kapu, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the lois of Hawau, on the other side by the lois of Kuoalapai.(v. 7/30)

#### 4878-K Part 9 Puapia

Kaiaholokai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in Kauaula, Lahaina, and consist of 40 Lois in one piece, and one piece of Kula. He had also a house in the yard of Ohai in "Mkil" but no House lot.

Claimant received these lands from Keliahonui the husband of Kekauonohi who is the Lord of this land. He obtained them in 1835 and he has held possession of them ever since without disturbance.

The Kalo land of bounded Mauka by the Lois of Honokoa, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the lois of Kalua, there are Poalima Lois on the Kaanapali side is a Pali.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the Poalima kula of Kapule, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the creek, on the other side by the same.

The claimant is dead, and his widow Kalama is his heir. He left no children. He died in Feb. 7 last.

#### 4878-J Part 8 Kupalii From V. 30

The claimant appeared this morning and stated that his claim had not been fully heard yesterday, and that he desired to introduce witnesses to the balance of his claims which consisted of another House lot, two ilis, or section of Kula and 5 Lois in four distinct pieces.

Kauhikape sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. Beside those lands which were testified to yesterday, he has four other pieces in "Hooka" Lahaina. Two are Kula, one a House lot, and the other Kalo.

Claimant received these lands from Namauu Ehu with the exception of the Kula, which he received from Apaa.

The Kula came to him in the days of Hoapili previous to 1839, and he has held this ever since in peace.

The House lot, and the Kalo land he received in 1845, and has had quiet possession of them ever since. Namauu Ehu was the Luna of the land. The King is the Great Lord of the land.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Loi of Haehai, Olowalu by Polanui, Makai by the yard of Kapa, On the other side by "Wainee nui".

The Kula is bounded Mauka by the Kula of Kupa, Olowalu by Polanui, Makai by Namauu Ehu's land, Kaanapali by "Waineenui".

The Kalo land is bounded by a Pali on the Mauka and Olowalu side, Makai by the land of Kahaka, Kaanapali by the creek.

The other Kula piece is a very small one and is bounded Mauka by Namauu Ehu's land, Olowalu by the same, Makai by Namuu Ehu's land, Kaanapali by "Puaa".

4878-M Part 10 Kaiaholokai June 1 1849

Kaauana sworn. I know the lands of Claimant, they are in Hauaula, and a House lot in "Puehuehu". They consist of three distinct pieces.

Claimant obtained his lands in "Kauaula" from Kekauonohi in 1836, and his House lot from Kalama at the same time. He has been in undisturbed possession ever since.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the main road to Olowalu, Olowalu by the yard of Kauoiopio, Makai by the Sea Shore, on the other side by the ravine. It is fenced on two sides.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by Kekuahiko's land, Olowalu side by the creek and Pali, Makai by Honokoa's land, on the other side by Kaailau's lands.

The Kalo land contains 16 lois and is bounded Mauka by the Lois of Poepoe, Olowalu by the creek and Pali, Makai by the lois of Kalama, Kaanapali by the Pali inaccessible. (v. 7/32)

#### 4878-N Part 11 Kaekae

Kanehiwa sworn. I know the lands of claimant, they consist of a piece of Kula, and one piece of Kalo land in "Wainunui". The House lot is in Halakaa. I only know the House lot well, this is not very clear to me.

Heele sworn. I know all the lands of the claimant, they are as stated by Kanehiwa. The lands in Waineenui came to her in the days of Hoapili from Kealoha, and have been in her possession ever since without dispute. The House lot came to her from her ancestors, more than 20 years since, and she has never been disputed in her title.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Main road of Lahaina, Olowalu by the yard of Kanehiwa, Makai by the Sea shore, on the other side by the yard of Kanehiwa.

The Kula is bounded Mauka by the Kula, Olowalu by "Hakakaa", Makai by the same, on the remaining side by the Kula.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Lois of Aa, Olowalu by "Puaa", Makai by the lois of Mahoe, on the other side by my land of Lois. It contains eight Lois. (v. 7/32-33)

#### 4878-O Part 12 Olala June 1, 1849

Kahulanui sworn. I know the land of Olala, in part I know that he has one piece of Kula, and Kalo land in "Puehuahuiki".

From Puipui to the claimant received this land in 1835, and he has been in undisturbed possession from that time to this.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of I and Laahili, Olowalu by the cree, Makai by the land of Laahili and Koaeae, on the remaining side by "Kuia".

Namaka sworn. I know that Olala has a piece of Kula, 4 Moo's in "Waineenui" and a House lot, and his iaka on the same land where he lives.

The claimant received these lands from Namaka in the days of Hoapili, before 1839, and he has never been disturbed in his possession. This land is under Kaleipaihala, as a Luna.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by my lands, Olowalu by Kaleipaihala'a Poalima lands, makai by the House lot of Poopuu, on the other side by the lands of Naai.

This Kula has another piece which is further Makai. It is bounded Mauka by the House lot of Poonui, Olowalu by the land of Hanaumua, Makai by the land of Ualo, on the other side by the land of Kamohumohu.

The Kalo land, and a House lot where he lives is in one piece, and it is bounded Mauka by my land, and "Huia", Olowalu by my land, and the Poalima of Kaleipaihala, Makai by the yard of School house, on the other side by "Huia". (v. 7/33-34)

4878-P Part 13 Hooeae June 1, 1849

Kahulanui sworn. I know the lands of claimant, they are in Puehuehu iki, Lahaina, and consist of one piece containing a House lot, and Lois, and Kula.

He received these lands from Puipui, the head man of this land under the King, in 1845, and he has held them without dispute ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Olala, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the Poalima of Laahili, on the other side by the Pali, and Kuia.

The Konohiki has 3 Lois in the middle of this. His name is Laahili. See pg. 64 v. 15 (v. 7/34)

4878-Q Part 14 Naopala June 1, 1849

Olala sworn. I know the lands of claimant, they are in Puehuehu iki, Lahaina. It is Kula, and Kalo ground all in one piece.

He received this land from Puipui in 1835, and his title has never been disputed. However the Konohiki Laahili has taken a Loi in the center of this land.

It is bounded Mauka by the Poalima land of Laahili, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the land of I and Laahili, on the other side by "Kuia." (v. 7/34)

4878-R Part 15 Kahulanui June 1, 1849

Naopala sworn. The claimant has to my knowledge four Lois in one piece, in "Puehuehuiki".

He received it from me in 1845, and I had it from Olala in 1835. My title to it nor that of claimant has ever been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by my Lois, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the Lois, Kaanapali by the Lois of Laahili.

Kaunana sworn. The claimant has to my knowledge a piece of Kula land in Kauaula. He received from Kaiaholekai in 1836, and he has held it without dispute ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaoao, Olowalu by the Pali and creek, Makai and Kaanapali by the land of Haoao. (v. 7/35)

4878-S Part 16 Kule

Waihoioahu sworn. I know all the lands of the claimant, they are in "Paunau", Lahaina. They consist of two pieces. One Kula, and Kalo land, and one Kalo only.

He received these lands from me in 1832, and he has held them in peace ever since. Paki is the great Lord of this Land.

The piece of Kula, and Kalo land, is bounded Mauka by "Makila", Olowalu by "Paunau akahi", Makai by the Pali, Kaanapali by "Keoka".

The Kalo piece contains 4 Lois, and is bounded Mauka by the Lois of Kaoao, Olowalu and side by the creek, Kaanapali by the Poalima Lois of Kamaihina. (v. 7/35)

4878-T Part 17 Ikeole

Naopala sworn. I know the land of claimant, they are all in "Paunau", Lahaina. They consist of 12 Lois and one Kula all in one piece.

The claimant's husband Kaulia received this land from Wainoioahu in 1832 and held them without dispute up to his death in 1847, then the land not being cultivated. Waihoioahu went to Ikole in February last and asked her why she did not till this land. She answered that she had no men to work it. He asked her to seek men to work it. She said, she could not find them.

Waihoioahu sworn. This land after the death in claimant's husband in 1847, went to waste for the want of cultivation, and I went to her, and asked to her to till it or seek men to do so. But she said, she could not find them. And she suggested that she had better give up the land then to some person who would till it. Upon this she relinquished it to me, and I gave it to the head man Kamaihina, to till. I had no interest in this matter further than to see the land cultivated. Kamaihina is now seeking men to till it.

This piece is bounded Mauka by the Poalima Lois of Kamaihina, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the creek, and I's loi, Kaanapali by the Pali. (v. 7/36)

4878-U Part 18 Koolani June 1, 1849

Kule sworn. I am the son of claimant, I know the land of my father. It is one very small patch of Lois. It is in "Paunau", Lahaina.

Claimant received this land from Kupa in 1836, and has had quiet possession of it ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the Lois of Nooheau, Olowalu by the Lois of Ohuli, Makai by the loi Poalima, on the other side by Makila. (v. 7/36)

4878-V Part 19 Kaia

Pauli sworn. I know all the lands of the claimant, they consist of one piece of Kula, and 26 Lois, which is in "Kooka", Lahaina.

This land came to the claimant in 1837 from Apaa the head man of Kooka, and he has had the undisturbed possession of the same ever since. The head man, Apaa, took however some Lois from him as did the present head man Namauu Ehu, but still he has 26 Lois left.

It is bounded Mauka by "Kuia", Olowalu by my own lois, Makai by the Poalima Kula of Namauu, Kaanapali by Kuia. (v. 7/36-37)

4878-W Part 20 Kahoekaha June 1, 1849

Napapai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Polaiki". They consist of three distinct pieces, two of them Kula land and one Kalo lands.

The claimant received these lands from my mother in the year 1840. My Mother received them from Ulumehuihui many years before. Neither my mother or the claimant title was disputed until very recently in January last, when the Luna Oio wished the Kula for a Poalima land, the piece he wishes is in front of claimants house and has some bread fruit trees on it. This luna has no ground for the claim more than his wish so far as I know.

The Kula piece upon which claimant's house stands is bounded Mauka and Olowalu sides by the Poalima lands, Makai by the Poalima of Kaauhala, Kaanapali by the Polaiki land of Mr. John White.

The other Kula piece is bounded on the Mauka and Olowalu sides by "Paunau", Makai by Kekai's lois, Kaanapali by Polanui.

The Kalo land is iuka loa, and is bounded Mauka by the lois of Kalauau, Olowalu by Kekai's lois, Makai by Puaa, Kaanapali by Wainee 1<sup>st</sup>. (v. 7/37)

4878-X Part 21 Kuoalapai

Waiheioahu sworn. I know the land of the claimant, these are in one piece, 12 Lois, and a Kula, in another, two Moo's all in Paunau nui.

The claimant obtained these piece of land from his father Lonomakaihonua in 1842, and has possessed them without dispute ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by "Paunau akahi", Olowalu by the lois of Kupalu, Makai by my land, "Kaanapali by the Pali.

Paki the great Lord of this lands.

The Kula piece of two Moo's is bounded Mauka and Olowalu side by "Paunau oholu", Makai by the yard of Kamaihine, Kaanpali by my lands. (v. 7/37-38)

4878-Y Part 22 Uamaka June 1, 1849

Wainoioaku sworn. I know the lands of the claimant they consist of 2 pieces of Kula, and one piece of both Kula and Kalo lands, they are all in "Halakaa".

Claimant received these lands from Unele in 1845, and he has been undisturbed possession ever since. The Lord of the land is Kaeo.

The Makai Kula is bounded Mauka by the yard of Kapu, Olowalu by the land of Paikaualani, Makai by the land of Ihihi, Kaanapali by Paunau ekolu.

The next piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaiukekoole, Olowalu by the land of Kupieke, Makai by the lois of Paikaualani, Kaanapali by the creek. See pg. 77 v. 15 (v. 7/38)

#### 4878-Z Part 23 Konokoa

Kahulaniu sworn. I know the land of the claimant, they are in 4 distinct pieces, a House lot and Kula in "Halakaa", and three sections of Kula, and Kalo land in "Kauaula".

In 1839 claimant received all his possession in "Kauaula" from Kawaihae, and he has held them in peace ever since.

The land in "Halakaa" he received from Kailau in the days of Hoapili before 1839, and he has had undisturbed possession from that day to this.

This last named piece is bounded Mauka by the Uamaha's lands, Olowalu by the land of Kupihe, Makai by the Mamaka's lands, Kaanapali by the same.

The Makai section of land in Kauaula is bounded Mauka by the Lois of Kalama, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the lois of Kalama, Kaanapali by the Pali. There is a Loi Poalima of Kalua's in this.

The Kalo land which is in one Loi, I gave to the claimant in 1837, and he has occupied it in peace ever since. The House lot, and Kula, he received from Mahaena in 1837, and he has not been dispute is his title to this place.



The House lot, and Kula is bounded Mauka by the land of Pupuka, Olowalu by the dry creek bed, Makai by the main road of Lahaina, Kaanapali by the land of Kekua.

The Kalo ground is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by my Lois, Makai by the poalima lois of Serang or Victoria, Kaanapali by "Wainuiki". (v. 7/39)

4878-CC Part 25 Kauwiopiopio

Maimai sworn, I know the lands of claimant, they consist of two pieces in "Makila", Lahaina. One a House lot, and the other a Kalo ground.

Claimant received the House lot from Pohina in 1825, and been in peaceable possession ever since.

The Kalo land came to him from Kaulunae in the day of Hoapili, previous to 1839, and he has held the same without dispute ever since.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the main road of Lahaina, Olowalu by the yard of Pupule, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the yard of Kaiaholokai.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Lois of Kaleoula, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the lois of Paele, Kaanapali by the high Pali. (v. 7/39-40)

4878-DD Part 26 Makaina June 1, 1849

Naholona sworn, I know the lands of claimant, they are in "Kaulalo", Lahaina, and consist of two pieces, one a Kula land Makai, and the other a Kalo land of 4 Lois mauka.

The claimant received them from Poopuu in 1837, and he has had undisputed possession from that time to the present.

The Kalo piece is bounded Mauka by the lois of Pinauea, Olowalu and Makai sides by the lois of Poopuu, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the land of Poonuu, Olowalu by the land of Kamokai, Makai by the main road of Lahaina, Kaanpali by the land of Pinauea.

Kapuki sworn I have heard the testimony just given by Naholona and know it to be correct. (v. 7/40)

4878-EE Part 27 Makaiole See page. 164

No person appeared upon the calling of this claim. (v. 7/40)

4878-FF Part 28 Poopuu

Umiumi sworn, I know the lands of claimant, they are consist of one large Loi on "Waianaes 1", One large Loi on "Waianaes 2". A House lot and Kula on "Wainee nui", all in Lahaina.

The first large Loi was obtained by claimant from Kaaimalalo in 1824, and he has held in peace until about three weeks since, when the head man John Hoolulu, the King agent disputed it.

The next large Loi the claimant received from the same source at the same time, and her title to it has never been disputed.

The first Loi, is bounded Mauka by the land of Pikanele, Olowalu by the lois of Nima, Makai by the loi of Paupau, Kaanapali by the land of Pikanele.

The last piece is bounded on the Mauka by "Puako", Olowalu by the lois of Kainalo, Makai by the loiof Kauilioho, Kaanapali by the land of Napuakau.

Olala sworn, I know the House lot, and Kula, of the claimant. It is on "Wainee nui". The claimant obtained this land from me in the days of Princess Nahienaena before 1836, and she has had the quiet possession of it ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by the land of Naai, Makai by Hanaumua's and my own land, Kaanapali by the land of Kamohomoho. (v. 7/41)

4878-GG Part 29 Maluae June 1, 1849

Nahau sworn, That she knows the lands of the claimant, they are in "Puaa iki", Lahaina. They consist of 2 pieces. One a Kula land and House lot, and Kalo patch Makai, and the other a section of Lois 15 in number Mauka.

The claimant obtained them from me when I was the head of the land in 1832, and his title has been indisputed ever since.

The Makai piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Ahia, Olowalu by the land of Puanui, Makai by the land of Peahi, Kaanapali by the Poalima land of Kaio's.

The Mauka piece is bounded Mauka by the creek, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the lois of Kupa, Kaanapali by the lois of Wahineiki. (v. 7/41)

9817 Makaele See page 98

Kapuhi sworn, I know the lands of the claimant, they partly on "Puehuehu nui" and partly on "Puehuehu iki". They consist of a Kula, and Kalo land in separate pieces on Puehuehu iki, and a House lot on Puehuehunui.

The Kula and Kalo lands are from Puipui in 1829, and have been held by the claimant ever since in peace.

The House lot was taken up by the claimant as waste land in 1839, and he has been occupied by the claimant ever since, no one has disputed her title.

Kamokai sworn, I know the land of claimant, they are in "Makila", Lahaina. They consist of 2 pieces. One a Kula land, and the other a Kalo land.

The claimant obtained these lands from Kaulunae soon after Liholiho went to England, about 1825 and his title to them is without dispute.

The Kula is bounded Mauka by the land House lot of Kapua, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the house lot of Muouou, Kaanapali by the land of Kaleiopu.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the lois of Kaleiopu, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by my lois, Kaanapali by the Pali. (v. 7/42)

4878-KK Part 32 Kelia June 1, 1849

Pupuka sworn, I know the lands of the claimant, they consist of Section of Kalo patches on "Puehuehu iki", and a House lot, and Kula, and Loi on "Makila".

The claimant obtained these lands in the days of King Liholiho, from Kaleiheana, and has possession then in peace ever since.

The piece on "Makila" is bounded Mauka by my lands, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the main road of Lahaina, Kaanapali by the land of Kanehiwa.

The piece of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Laahilo, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the lois of Hauneka, Kaanapali by the lois of Keawehane. (v. 7/43)

4878-LL Part 33 Makanui

Maimai sworn, I know the lands of claimant. They are in "Makila". They consist of three pieces, a House lot, and Kula grounds, and a piece of Kula and Kalo ground.

He received them from Kaulunae in the days of Hoapili prior to 1839, and he has held undisputed possession to this day.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the poalima Kula, Olowalu by the same, and even so on the Makai, Kaanapali by the yard of Kalehoula.

The Kula piece is divided by a water course, Mauka by the yard of Pupule, Olowalu by the lands of Kaleleiki, and Keaweolu, Makai by the land of Keaweolu, Kaanapali by the land of Pupuka.

The remaining piece is bounded Mauka by the lois of Kekua and Kainakakapu, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the lois of Kalaeopu, Kaanapali by the Pali. (v. 7/43)

Muaa sworn. I know the lands of claimant in Pahoe. He obtained them from Kalahoueka his father-in-law. He received them as a gift. This was the present year. Kalahoueka received them from Kapua in 1839. Neither his title or that time of Moku's has been disputed.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Keaweolu, Olowalu by the Poalima ground of Kaehunui, Makai by the main road of Lahaina leading to Olowalu, Kaanapali by the creek of Makila.

The Kalo ground is bounded Mauka by the creek, Olowalu by the Pali and Kapua's land, Makai by "Puehuehu iki", Kaanapali by the poalima lois of Kaehunui and Kula. (v.7/44)

4878-NN Part 35 Kapuhi June 1, 1849

Moku sworn, I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Makila", they consist of a House lot, and Kula in one piece.

The claimant received this land from Pi in 1837, and he has held it without dispute ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Holi, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the large Lois of Naea, Kaanapali by the large loi of Kanehina and "Kaulalo". (v. 7/44)

6433 Kenalo

Meuakaka sworn, I know the House lot of claimant. They are in "Punakea", Lahaina.

He obtained this lot from the Konohiki of Punakea, whose name is Kanolu. He is now dead. The claimant's title has not been disputed ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the pond belonging to Haawipu, the Konohiki, Olowalu by the yard of Heahole, Makai by the shore street, Kaanapali by "Halulukoakoa". It is fenced on three sides.

Kalua sworn, I know the land of claimant in "Kauaula", I am the head man of this "Kauaula" under the King. The land was formerly Kekauonohu, and the claimant was head man under her. He is now hemo, and his title has come to an end. (v. 7/44-45)

6711 Puuki June 1, 1849

Kekahuna sworn. I know the lands of claimant, they are in the Ahupuaa of Uhao, Lahaina. She holds this land under the King. He gave it to her in 1836, and his rights in it have never been disputed. Only half of this land belongs to her, the other half belonging to me.

Her half is bounded Mauka by the Poalima of Uhao belonging to the King, Olowalu by "Aki nui", Makai by the same, Kaanapali by "Aki" also.

She has a House lot also in Lahaina on "Puako". It is bounded Mauka by the second street of Lahaina, Olowalu by the yard of Uncle, Makai by the large lois of Kaeo, Kaanapali by the yard of Kuakamauna. I know nothing of her title. (See Kaeo) (v. 7/45)

5458 Manu From pg 13

Kuaana sworn, I know the land of the claimant, consist of a piece of Kula and 5 Lois lying together, and 17 Lois comprising a section of Kalo land Mauka. They are all in "Hooko", Lahaina.

The claimant received these lands in the days of Hoapili, in the early days (of that great man) and he has been in undisputed possession ever since.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Namamahu, Olowalu by the land of Kehua, Makai by the land of Opunui, Kaanapali by "Puaa".

The Kalo section is bounded Mauka by the poalima of Namauu Ehu, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by my lois, Kaanapali by the land of Oleloa. (v. 7/45-46)

6541 Haia June 1, 1849

The claimant is dead, and his widow Pihe is his heir together with six children, 2 sons and 4 daughters.

Kenalo sworn, the lands of the claimant consist of 7 Loi in one piece, and one House lot connected with a garden. The Kalo ground in "Kula", and the other piece is in Paunau, both in Lahaina.

The House lot and the Garden has been occupied by the claimant and his wife Piho from the days of Kamehameha 1 without dispute.

The Kalo land was obtained by the claimant about 1839, I think, and has been possession in peace ever since.

The House lot and garden is bounded Mauka by the cattle yard of Lahainaluna, Olowalu by the Pali and creek, on the other two sides by the high Pali.

The piece of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Napahi, Olowalu by the lois of Kauaa, makai by the lois Puipui and Kahina, Kaanapali by Kuholilea. (v. 7/46)

6426 Kalehoula

Maimai sworn. I know the land of the claimant consist of a House lot, and a land consisting of Kula and Kalo land, besides these there is one Moo of Kula. They are all in "Makila", Lahaina.

The claimant received all these lands in the days of Princess Nahienaena from Kaulunae, and has possession of them in peace ever since.

The house lot is bounded Mauka by the road dividing it from the land of Makanui, Olowalu by the lands of Makanui, and my land, and the Poalima, Makai by the poalima land, Kaanapali by "Puehuehu nui".

The one Moo is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by the land of Paele, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by the poalima land of "Makila".

The other piece is bounded Mauka by the lois of Kauwaioahu, Olowalu by the creek of Makila, Makai by the lois of Kaiuiopiopio, Kaanapali by the land of Kalihoula. (v. 7/46-47)

6496 Kuaana June 1, 1849

Manu sworn. I know the lands of claimant consist of 2 pieces, one a section of Kula, and the other a section of Kalo land.

The claimant received these lands from Apaa (prior to 1839) in the days of Hoapili and he has held them without dispute to the present time.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Kalukane, Olowalu by "Alii", Makai by the land of Kapu, Kaanapali by "Waukanoa".

The Kalo piece is bounded Mauka by my own lois, Olowalu by the land of Keaha, Makai by the lois of Kupihea, Kaanapali by the lois of Olelo.

There are two poalima lois in the middle of this last piece. (v. 7/47)

7225 Umiumi

Poopuu sworn. I know the lands of claimant consist of one piece of Kalo land in "Bolobola", and "Waianaenui". It is 4 Lois one of which is in Bolobola, the other tree in "Waianaenui". He has two Moos of Kula in "Puaa".

I gave the claimant the 3 Lois in Waianaenui before 1836, The Loi in Bolobola he had from Makaulia before 1836. The Kula in Puaa he had from Naiahelu three years ago. There has been no dispute about the Kalo land, but there has been dispute about the Kula. Kaeo's wife has taken away this kula and given it to Nawelu. This was done about 3 weeks ago. Naiahelu gave up the whole yard containing these Moo's to Kaeo's wife.

This Kalo piece is bounded Mauka by the yard of Kahiikona, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the land of Kahikai Aha, John Hoolulu, Kaanapali by the yard of Kapohaku.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the land of Peahi, Olowalu by the Poalima land, Makai by the Street east of the Meeting House, Kaanapali by the yard of Kanaina. (v. 7/47-48)

8638 Kaohie Lahaina June 2, 1849

This claim is identified with claim 6243, which has already been heard. (See Testimony taken 29<sup>th</sup> May 1849). (v. 7/48)

3300 Moku

This claimant is the same Moku's named in Claim 4878 Part 34. He appeared, and said he wished to abandon his claim for land named in Claim 3300 as the late freshlets had rendered it valueless.

Lot Kamehameha sworn as interpreter. (v. 7/48)



6784 Naai

Koolakai sworn. I know the lands of Naai. They are all in "Waianae nui", of which Kalupaihala is the Lord. They consist of 2 pieces. One of Moo's of Kula, and the other a Kalo land of 17 Lois, which is mauka loi.

The claimant had these lands from Kaleipaihala in the days of Hoapili, and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka and Olowalu sides by the land of Kaleipaihala, Makai by the land of Poopuu, Kaanapali by the land of Mahiku.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by "Alio", Olowalu by "Polanue", Makai by "Polaihi", Kaanapali by the land of Kaluahinenui. See pg. 43 v. 15. (v. 7/48-49)

6791 Kamapuaa June 2, 1849

Maluai sworn. I know the land of claimant, they are all in "Puaa iki", it is in one piece, and Kula land of 2 Moo's.

The claimant received this land from Kumalana, had it from Naheo in ancient times, in the days of Hoapili, and he has held it in peace to up to the time of his death, when it came to claimant whose title is without dispute. Nahau was the Luna of Puaa iki in older times.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Wahineiki, Olowalu by the land of Ahia, Makai by the land of Maluae, Kaanapali by the land of Aa. (v. 7/49)

6792 Umi

Kaumana sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kauaula". They consist of 7 pieces, three of Kula one Moo each, the other a Kalo land Mauka lua, of 9 Lois. Another of one loi, one of 3 lois, and another of 2 lois.

The claimant received these lands from Keawe in the days of Hoapili, prior to 1839, and he has held them without dispute every since.

The Makai Kula is bounded Mauka by the stream of "Kauaula", Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Poalima land of Kalua, Kaanapali by the High Pali.

The second Moo of Kula is bounded Mauka by the creek, Olowalu by the land of Kukahiko, Makai by the land of Kaailau, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

The other Moo is bounded Mauka by the high Pali, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the Poalima land of Kalua.

The Kalo land of 9 lois is bounded Mauka by the lois of Kaleo, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the lois of Kukui, Kaanapali by the same.

The one loi Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the lois of Kahulanui's, Olowalu and Makai sides by the same, Kaanapali by the Poalima lois of Kalua.

The Kalo land of 3 Lois is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the Poalima land of Kalua, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

The remaining Kalo land of 3 Lois is bounded Mauka by the lois of Naheana nui, Olowalu and the remaining sides are bounded by the lois of Kukahiko. See pg. 53 v. 15 (v. 7/49-50)

6794 Koalakai June 2, 1849

Makaulia sworn. I know the lands of claimant, they are all in "Polanui". The consist of 2 pieces, one is a Kula containing his house, the other a Kalo land.

The claimant obtained these lands from me. I being a Luna of "Polanui" under Kanaina, this was before 1839 and he has possessed them ever since in peace.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the land of Kapu, Olowalu by the land of Malaekahana, Makai by the land of Kukua, Kaanapali by the stream o "Keoka".

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Poalima lois of Kanaina, Olowalu by the same, and the lois of Kainokane, Makai by the land of Makuahine, Kaanapali by Polaiki. See pg. 2 v. 15 (v. 7/50)

6797 Kamaka

Koalakai sworn, I know the land of claimant they are in "Polanui" and consist of Moos in one piece.

The claimant received this land from Kaoao in 1845. Kaoao had this land from in the older times of Hoapili, before Makaulia became a Luna, and he held in peace until he gave it to

claimant and the claimant has continued in the peaceable possession of it ever since. Claimant has a House on the land.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of John White "Polaiki", Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Poalima land of Kauaina, Kaanapali by the land of Kamano.(v. 7/50-51)

6799 Keaka June 2, 1849

Manu sworn. I know the land of claimant, they are in "Hooka", Lahaina. They consist of seven Moos of Kula in one piece, and a piece of Kalo land 23 small lois mauka lua.

The claimant received these lands from Apaa in the days of Hoapili kane. He has possessed them in peace ever since.

The Kula is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by the land of Kekua, Makai by the road leading just mauka of the Church to Olowalu, Kaanapali by "Puaa nui".

The Kalo section is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by the stream "Pahoa", Makai by "Pahoa", Kaanapali by the land of Kukahiko. (v. 7/51)

6800 Kukahiko

Manu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Keoka", Lahaina. They consist of 3 Moos of Kula in one piece, and one Kalo land of 23 small Lois Mauka loa.

The claimant received these lands from Ahaa in the ancient days of Hoapili, and has possessed the Kalo land in peace ever since. But the Luna Apaa, who gave him the Kula land, took it from him soon after, and he has held it ever since allowing the claimant however to dwell on it. Apaa and his successor Namauu Ehu have now enjoyed the fruit of this Kula for 4 to 5 years. Apaa took it away by the right of his Lunaship and not for any hewa of the claimant.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the land of Kekua, Olowalu by the land of Kehoio, Makai by the Mauka street leading to Olowalu, Kaanapali by the land of Keaka.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Lois of Kupikea, Olowalu by the lois of Keaka, Makai by "Pahoa", Kaanapali by a high Pali. (v. 7/51-52)

6804 Opunui June 2, 1849

Kawau sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Halakaa". They consist of 3 Moo's of Kula in one piece, and 12 Lois of Kalo land in one piece. The Luna or Konohiki Joshua Kaeo has a Poalima loi, however in the middle of this Kalo land.

The claimant received these lands from Kanaihae the Luna of Halakaa in the days of Hoapili, and he has held them in peace ever since.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaeouo, Olowalu by "Puehuehu iki", Makai by the land of Paikaualani, Kaanapali by the land of Pumauna.

The Kalo land is bounded by "Haku" Mauka side, Olowalu by the creek of "Paunaula", Makai by "Paunau", Kaanapali by the same.(v. 7/52)

6802 Pekelane

Nalehu sworn. I know the land of claimant, they consist of 6 Lois of Kalo in one piece in Pahoa, Lahaina.

The claimant received this land from Maele in the early days of Hoapili, and he has held them ever since without dispute.

It is bounded Mauka by the high Pali, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the lois of Kuaana, Kaanapali by the same. (v. 7/52)

6803 Paukaoahie W. (the claimant is dead.)

Kupali sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it are in "Pahoa", Lahaina, and consist of one piece of Kula, and one Kalo land of 30 small lois.

He received this land from the head woman Maele, in the days of Hoapili, and he has held it in peace up to his death, this year. Kaauna her only child is her heir. (Kaauna a grown man appeared).

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Pelekane, Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by the stream of Pauaula, Kaanapali by the same. (v. 7/52-53)

6804 Kekaululu June 2 1849

Kaheananui sworn. I know the land of claimant, it is a Kihapai of land in "Puaanui", Lahaina.

The claimant received it from Kalua in the year 1848. Kalua is the Luna of the land "Puaanui", it was Poalima land before.

It is bounded Mauka and Olowalu sides by the Poalima land of Kalua, Makai by the road leading to Olowalu, Kaanapali by the Poalima land of Kalua.

The claimant appeared and said he had no claim to this land. (v. 7/53)

6781 Hihio and 4602 and 8135

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the lot of Hihio. It is in Lahaina nui. I have known it ever since 1832, but not before. When I came here in 1832, the claimant was living on this land under his sister Kamailohi and her husband named Puaa. I built a house for his sister on one corner of the lot where she lived, and Hihio had his houses on another part. Hihio had his two houses there, and Puaa one house adobies. They dwelt together in peace until about 1838, when Puaa died, and willed all his rights to his wife, the claimant's sister. Hihio and his sister then lived together on the land until her death in 1844. When she willed every right she had in this lot to Hihio, who has had the entire possession of it ever since.

His title was never disputed until 1847. When A. Kaeo set up a claim to this lot. The foundation of Kaeo's claim is that the claimant, and his sister were the Kanakas of Kaaimalalo, who gave them the place, Kaaimalalo is Kaeo's the mother. Puaa was a high man under Kamehameha I. he was one of his Councillors and held rights in the land under him.

It is bounded Mauka by the main street of Lahaina, Olowalu by the house of Pikanele which stands on Kekauononi's land, Makai by Kanaina or Lot, and George Shaw's land, Kaanapali by the canal of Lahaina.

In 1842, or rather when the King's Child was born, and Pikanele built his house on the Olowalu side of this lot there was a dispute between Pikanele and Hihio, Hihio contending that he was crowding on to his land. The matter was taken before Kekauluohi the Premier, and Kaaimalalo being present, said to Hihio let Pikanele have the land he wants and to you shall belong all the rest, the lot now claimed. To this Hihio consented and there the dispute was put to rest.

Kalaikino sworn. I am about 38 years of age and have lived in Lahaina for 13 years. During my residence he claimant has been in the quiet possession of this lot up to 1847, when Kaeo raised the dispute spoken of by Keaweluale.

The claimant has a piece of Kalo, and Kula land in one piece in Lahainalalo on "Kuhua".  
Keohokalole is the Lord of Kuhua.

He received this land from Puaa in the days of Kamehameha II went to England. He has been in the undisputed possession for 13 years to my knowledge.

It is bounded Mauka and Olowalu sides by "Aki", Makai by the land of Alaala, Kaanapali by the land of Hale.

Kana sworn. I have resided 27 years in Lahaina, and I am 57 years of age. I heard the testimony of Keaweluaole and it is correct.

I know that the claimant has lived on this House lot ever since 1824, when Hoapili was maimed, and I never heard his title disputed until 1847, where Kaeo raised a dispute. (v. 7/53-54)

8135 Hihio Same as above (6781) See after testimony in page 332 T.T. v. 3

The claimant appeared and stated that this claim with the piece named in Honuaula was identical with Claim 6781 which had just been heard, that for the piece in Honuaula, he had no witnesses present. (v. 7/54)

6782 Nahau June 2, 1849

The claimant appeared and said she wished to abandon her claim as she had not put it in willingly. Hihio did it for her. (v. 7/55)

7590 Kainokane

Nahaulia sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Polanui", Lahaina, they consist of two separate sections of Kalo and, and one piece of Kula with a house therein.

The claimant received these lands from me as the head man of "Polanui" in the days of Hoapili, and she has possessed them without dispute ever since.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the Kula land of "Polanui", Olowalu by the same, Makai by the main road leading from Lahaina to Olowalu, Kaanapali by the lot of Paniaui.

The Makai section of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Poalima lois of Polanui, Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by the creek, and the land of Mahuahine, Kaanapali by the land of Koalahai.

The other section of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Polima lois, Olowalu by the stream of "Alio", Makai by the land of Koalakai, Kaanapali by land. (v. 7/55)

6783 Kauhi See pg. 57

Makaulia sworn, I know the lands of claimant, they are in "Polanui", Lahaina, they consist of two section of Kalo land, and one piece of Kula.

The claimant received these lands from me, in the days of Hoapili in 1839, and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the road leading to Olowalu, Olowalu by the land of John White, Makai by the land of Makuahine, Kaanapali by my Kula.

The Makai section of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the stream of Alio, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the creek of Alio, Kaanapali by the same.

The other section is bounded Mauka by "Ilikahi", Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by the stream of "Polanui", Kaanapali by the high Pali and stream. (v. 7/55-56)

6785 Kaluahinenui June 2, 1849

Kamohomoho sworn. I know the lands of he claimant, they are in "Waimeanui", Lahaina. They consist of one piece of Kula, and two pieces of Kalo land, and one of one Loi, and the other of Moo.

The claimant received these lands from Kaeipaihala the Lord of this land some time in the days of Hoapili in ancient times, and he has possessed them without dispute ever since.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Namaka, Olowalu by the land of Keakini, Makai by the land of Kahuna, Kaanapali by the Kula of Kalupaihala.

The Makai loi is bounded Mauka by the lois of Namaka, Olowalu by the lois of Naai, Makai by the lois of Kaniho, Kaanapali by the land of Ualo.

The other piece is bounded on all sides by the land of Kaleipaihala. (v. 7/56)

6786 Kamohomoho

Kaluahinenui sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Waineenui". They consist of one piece of Kalo land, with a house thereon.

The claimant received this land from Pakawili in the days of Hoapili and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by the Kula land of Kaleipaihala, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the land of David Malo, Kaanapali by "Puako". (v. 7/56)

6787 Hanaumua

Kamanoha sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are two in near. One is a Kula land in "Waineenui", and the other a Kalo land in Moanui. The land in Moanui is the same which the claimant has claimed in No. 6805.

The land in Waineenui he received from Kaleipaihala in the days of Hoapili, and in those same olden days he received the Kalo land in Moanui from Wahinepio, and his title to them has never been disputed.

The Kula land consist of 4 Moos and is bounded Mauka by the auwai dividing it from Kaleipaihala's land, Olowalu by the land of John Hoolulu, Makai and Kaanapali by the land of Kaleipaihala.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Heakini, Olowalu by the creek called Kopaula, Makai by the Pali, Kaanapali by the same creek. (v. 7/56-57)

6788 Kamauoha June 2, 1849

Hanaumua sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it is a piece of Kula land in "Puako", Lahaina.

The claimant received this land from Pahia at the time they put taxes on the dogs, two years ago. Pahia received it from Kalua in the days of Hoapili, he hold this land without dispute.

It is bounded Mauka by the kula of "Puako", Olowalu by "Wainee nui", Makai by the kula of Puako, Kaanapali by the same. (v. 7/57)



6783 Kauhi See pg. 55

Makaulea sworn, I know the lands of claimant, they are in "Polanui", Lahaina. They consist of two sections of Kalo land, and one piece of Kula.

The claimant received these lands from me in the days of Hoapili, 1839, and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the road leading to Olowalu, Olowalu by the land of John White, Makai by the land of Makuahine, Kaanapali by my kula.

The Makai section of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the stream of "Alio", Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the creek of Alio, Kaanapali by the same.

The other section is bounded Mauka by "Ilikahi", Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by the stream of "Polanui", Kaanapali by the high Pali and stream. (copy twice)(v. 7/57-58)

6789 Kaheananui June 2, 1849

Kahiwa sworn, I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Puaanui", Lahaina. They consist of 10 Lois in one piece, and one small Kula.

The claimant received these lands from Kuakamauna the luna of this land about 1835, and he has held them in peace from that time to this.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the lois of Maluae, Olowalu by the lois of Kupa, Makai by the lois of Kaupuna, Kaanapali by the Poalima loi.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the land of Kupa, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the land of Kalua.

Kalua is the Luna of Puaa. (v. 7/58)

6790 Pawaa (claimant is dead)

Kaheananui sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in Puaanui, Lahaina. They consist of two sections of lois, and one piece of three patches, and one of four, and one small piece of Kula.

The claimant received these lands from me just after the death of Hoapili, and he enjoyed them in peace up to his death with the measles this year. Paukualana his widow is his heir, he left no children. She now holds the possession.

The small piece of Kula is bounded Mauka and Olowalu sides by the creek of "Keoka", Makai and Kaanapali sides by the land of Kahea called "Puaa".

The Kalo land of 3 lois is bounded Mauka by "Wainee", Olowalu by the stream of Mauimakapo, Makai by Puaaiki, Kaanapali by "Wainee".

The other piece of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Keohokana's, Olowalu by the creek dividing it from Polanui, Makai by "Puaaiki", Kaanapali by Wainee. (v . 7/58-59)

6793 Pauhela June 2, 1849

Makaulea sworn. I know the lands of claimant, it is in one piece in "Polanui", Lahaina. It is now Kula though it was once Kalo land.

The claimant received from Kauhi not long since. Kauhi received it from me about six years ago, I am the head man of Polanui, and I know of no dispute respecting claimant title.

It is bounded Mauka by "Hikahi", Olowalu by Launuiipoko, on the other two sides by the creek of Polanui. (v. 7/59)

6795 Uhuhua

Makaulia sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, it is in "Polanui", Lahaina. It consist of two pieces, one a Kula land, and the other a Kalo land.

The claimant received these lands from me about the year 1840, and he has enjoyed them in peace ever since.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Koolakai, Olowalu by the land of Malaekahana, Makai by the land of Malaekahana and Kui, Kaanapali by "Hooka".

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by my lois, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the land of Kakaaui, Kaanapali by the stream of "Polanui". (v. 7/59)

6796 Kui

Kawau sworn, I know the land of the claimant, they are in Polanui, Lahaina, it consist one piece 3 Lois and some Kula.

He received this land from Kalakai, in the days of Hoapili, and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Kukua, Olowalu by the land of Malaekahana, Makai by the Poalima of Huhalake, Kaanapali by Hioka. (v. 7/59-60)

6798 Pau June 2, 1849

Meuaa sworn. I know the land of the claimant, but the claimant held this land under Nalehu until about 4 years since, when he left it, and he has now returned and lives on the land for Nalehu. He has no title in this land, the land is in "Pahoa" Lahaina. (v. 7/60)

6805 Hanaumua

This is identical with part of Claim no. 6787 which has already ben heard.(v. 7/60)

10462 Nalehu

Muaa sworn. I know the lands of Nalehu, they are in "Pahoa", Lahaina. It is a Kalo land of 10 small lois, of six pieces.

The claimant received this land from Maele the headwoman of "Pahoa" in 1839, and his title was once disputed, but the dispute was all settled by Namauu before his death and he now holds it in peace.

The first piece is one Loi, and a piece of Kula, and is bounded Mauka by the Pali, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Poalima lois of Kekaunaoa, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The second piece is 3 Lois, and is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by the lois of Puahiwa, Makai and Kaanapali by the Pali.

The third piece is one Loi, is bounded Mauka by the Poalima lois of Kekuanaoa, Olowalu by the lois of Pikanele, Makai and Kaanapali by the Pali.

The fourth piece is two Lois, and a piece of Kula, and is bounded Mauka by the lois of Upai and Pikanele, Makai by the Poalima, and Pikanele's land, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The fifth piece is one loi, and is bounded Mauka by the land of Pikanele, Olowalu by the Poalima loi, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The sixth piece is 3 Lois, and is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by the Poalima, Makai and Kaanapali by the Pali. (v. 7/60-61)

10465 Nalehu June 2, 1849

Muaa sworn. I know the land of the claimant is in "Waiokama", Lahaina. It is in two pieces. He has one House lot, which was heard Mr. Richards, there are remaining one House lot.

The claimant received this land from Maele in 1839, and his title has not been disputed seriously from that time to the present.

It is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Olowalu by the lot of Keohokalole, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the foreigner who tried to shoot Kekauluohi, his Hawaiian name is Kokana. There is also a pond on this side. (v. 7/61)

10221 Makaulia Lahaina June 4, 1849

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant in "Kilolani", Lahaina, and his lands in "Bolabola", Lahaina, consisting of 4 Lois and a cultivated field. These are all I know.

The claimant received these lands from Kekauonohi at the time they were building the Fort in Lahaina, a long time before the death of Hoapili. He has occupied them in peace ever since.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the yard of Pohaku, Olowalu by the yard of School House, Makai by the yard of Daniel Ii, Kaanapali by the land of Mr. Baldwin "Haleu".

I don't well know the bounded of the land in "Bolabola".

I know however the lands of the claimant in Hawaii. It is a Ahupuaa of land named "Kaapuna" in Kona, Hawaii, near by Kau. The King Kamehameha I gave this land to the father of the claimant and it descended to the claimant. It has recently confirmed by Kamehameha III, at the recent division of Lands, the claimant yielding u to the King his land "Opihiale" which lies near it.

I am also knowing to a gift in "Polanui", Lahaina. This was in 1832. So far as I know it consists of 18 Lois, and a house lot

The further hearing of this claim was postponed until other Witnesses arrived. Cont. pg. 69 (v. 7/61-62)

#### 6851 Kahula

Nihiiki sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Puaanui", Lahaina, they consist of 6 Lois in one piece.

The claimant received this land from Kapeleaumoku the Konohiki of the land at the time John Young was Governor of Maui about 1840, and he has enjoyed them without disturbance. Kekauonohi is the great Lord of this land.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Lupahailani, Olowalu by the land of Kaeo, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by the land of Maluae. (v. 7/62)

#### 6852 Punahale

Moku sworn, I know the lands of the client, they are in Olowalu. They consist of two part, one in a Kula lands, and the other a Kalo land.

It is a ili named "Pua". He has 70 lois in this Kalo lands.

He received these lands from Naea the Konohiki of Olowalu in 1835. This is the King's land, at the present time. His title has never been disputed.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupumi, Maalaea by the creek of Olowalu, Makai by the sea beach, Lahaina by the ili of "Hiwaa".

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Poalima lois of Naea, Maalaea by the ili of "Kaluaaha", Makai by the great creek, Lahaina by the high Pali. (v. 7/62-63)

#### 6853 Nuhi

Moku sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Puehuehunui", Lahaina, and consist of one Kula land and one Kalo land of 10 Lois.

The claimant received these lands from Kahehuna the Luna of "Puehuehunui" in 1841, and he has held them without dispute to the present day.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the lot of Ina, Olowalu by the Poalima land, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by the land of Kauakahi.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the high Pali, Olowalu by the land of Umiumi, Makai by the land of Kulua, Kaanapali by the land of Kanakaoo. (v. 7/63)

#### 6854 Ohule

Waiholua sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Paunauiki", Lahaina. They consist of one Kula land, and one Kalo land of 30 Lois.

The claimant received these lands from Kapu the Luna of the lands at the death of the Princess Nahienaena in 1836, and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The Kula piece consist of 4 Moos, but I think that Oleloa a counter claimant is entitled to one.

These 3 Moos is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by the Poalima of Kapu, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by "Polaiki".

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaolani, Olowalu by the creek of Kauaula, Makai by the land of Kuli, Kaanapali by my land. (v. 7/63)

#### 6855 Keha

The claimant is dead, but the widow, Kahaia appeared.

Ohule sworn. I know the land, It is a Kula land in "Polanui", Lahaina.

The claimant received it about 1842 from Makaulia, the Luna of the land, and he has held it in peace, up to the late sickness of the Measles, when he died the Luna took it away and gave to Kauia. His widow and two children are the heir of claimant, Makaulia took the land away on account of the claimant death and so far as I know for this alone.

It is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by the Poalima land of Makaulia, Makai by the land of Malaekahana, Kaanapali by the land of Kamano.

He had a section of Kalo land also which has been taken away by the same luna at the same time and for the same cause. I am not well acquainted it. (v. 7/64)

#### 6856 Kawai

Waihoioahu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Paunau nui", Lahaina. They consist of two pieces, one a Kula lands, ana 22 lois in one Kalo land. The Kula consists of 3 Moos.

The claimant received these lands from me, I being the Luna of the land Paunauniu in 1839, and he has held them in peace ever since. Paki is the Lord of the land.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by my lands, Olowalu by the Poalima, Makai by the Meeting House lot, Kaanapali by "Paunauiki".

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of "Kupalu", Olowalu by the creek of Kauaula, Makai by the land of Huli, Kaanapali by my land. (v. 7/64)

#### 6857 Nakaikuana

Ohule sworn. I know the lands of claimant, they are in "Wainee", over which is Kealoha. They consist of one Kula land, and 6 Lois in one piece, and two pieces of Kalo land iuka loa, one of 22 Lois, and the other 4 Lois.

The claimant received these lands from Hoapili kane and Hoapili wahine before 1839, and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The House lot, or Kula land, and 6 Lois, and is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaukeana, Olowalu by the land of Aa, Makai by the land of Napaka, Kaanapali by Wainee the land of Kaleipaihala.

The Kalo land of 22 Lois is bounded Mauka by the land of Laanui, Olowalu by the land of Kahoekaha, Makai by the land of Mahoe, Kaanapali by the land of Napaku.

The Kalo land of 4 lois is bounded Mauka by the land of Napaku, Olowalu by the land of Mahoe, Makai by the land of Napaku, Kaanapali by the same Kula lands. See Pg. 53 v. 15 (v. 7/64-65)

#### 6858 Napapaia W.

Kahoekaka sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Polaiki", Lahaina, and consist of two pieces of Kalo land, one of 4 Lois, and the other of 17 Lois. And two pieces of Kula land, and one House lot.

The claimant received these lands from Ulumekuku in 1837, and her title has been without dispute.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Poalima lands, Olowalu by the land of Kapu, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by the land of John White.

The Kula is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu and Makai by the land of Kapu, Kaanapali by "Polanui".

The Kalo land of 17 Lois is bounded Mauka and Makai by the Poalima lands, Olowalu by the land of John White, Kaanapali by my land.

#### 6859 Kaiama

Waihoioahu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in Paunaunui, Lahaina, and consist of two pieces of Kalo land, one of 2 Lois, and the other of 3 lois, also one Kula land.

The claimant received the Kalo land of 3 Lois from me in 1839, at the same time he received the other lands from Kalahohina, the Konohiki and his title has never been disputed.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by my land, Makai by the Poalima land, Kaanapali by "Paunauiki".

The Kalo land of 3 Lois is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by the Poalima lois, Kaanapali by Kooka.

The Kalo land of 2 Lois is bounded Mauka by the Poalima lois, Olowalu and Makai by the land of Kualapai, Kaanapali by the Pali. (v. 7/66)

#### 6860 Nunea



Kahoekaka sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it consists of one piece of Kula land. It is in "Polanui", Lahaina. He received this land from Keha about 1844, and he has held the same without dispute. Keha had it from the Luna Makaulia.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Malaekahana, Olowalu by "Paunau", over which is Kapu, Makai and Kaanapali by the land of Kamanu and Malaekahana. (v. 7/66)

#### 6861 Puuanui

Makuahine W. sworn. I am the mother in law of the claimant, but I do not know the lands well enough to testify concerning them no other witness offered. See pg. 88 (v. 7/66)

#### 6862 Kaumiumi

Moku sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Puehuhunui", Lahaina, and consist of two pieces of Kula, one House lot, and one piece of Kalo land in all 4 pieces.

The claimant received these lands from the Luna Likua in 1844, and his title has never been disputed.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by my lands, Olowalu by the land of Likua, Makai by the Poalima land, Kaanapali by Puehuehuiki.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Kanakahi, Olowalu by my land, Makai by the land of Kiope, Kaanapali by "Puehuehuiki".

The other piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Kanahao, Olowalu by the creek of Puehuhunui, Makai by the yard of Lipu, Kaanapali by "Halakaa".

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the lands of Nuhi, Olowalu by the Kahawai, Kaanapali by the land of Nuhi. (v. 7/66-67)

#### 6863 Wahie

Moku sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Puhakea 2", Lahaina, and consist of one piece of Kula and Kalo land.

The claimant received this land from Kuakamauna in `837, and has possessed it in peace ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Kuakamauna, Olowalu by the land of Kakapuna, Makai by the land of Kaeo, Kaanapali by "Punakea 1".

Keakuonihi is the Chief of "Punakea 2". (v. 7/67)

6864 Puhī

Poepe sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it consist of one Loi, it is in Punakea 2, Lahaina.

He received this land from Wahie just after Hoapili's death. His title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Wahie, Olowalu by the land of Queen, Makai and Kaanapali by the land of Kaeo.

Wahie sworn, that he obtained this patch in 1837, and that the claimant title is good. (v. 7/67-68)

6865 Kekua

The claimant though cited to attend did not appear. (v. 7/68)

6866 Kahapuna

Pohano W. sworn. I know the land of the claimant, they are in "Punakea 2", Lahaina, and consist of one piece of Kula and another of 2 Lois.

The claimant received these lands from Kamoakini the Luna in 1847 and he has held them in peaceably ever since.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the Govt. fence, Olowalu by "Punakea 3", Makai by the Lois of Pahi, Kaanapali by Wahie's lot.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Wahie, Olowalu by Pahi's land, Makai by Kaeo's land, Kaanapali by the land of Kuakamauna. See pg. 11, vol. 16 N. Testimony (v. 7/68)

6867 Poepoe

Kauwaua sworn. I know the Kalo land of the claimant, it is 35 lois in one piece, and 2 pieces of Kula in "Kanaula", Lahaina.

The claimant received this from Keawe the Luna in the olden days of Hoapili, and has enjoyed them in peace ever since.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Kahea, Olowalu by the land of Nahunanui, Makai by the land of Kalua, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

The first piece of Kula is bounded Mauka by the land of Kalua, Olowalu by the same, One the other two sides by the high Pali.

The second piece of Kula is bounded on three sides by the high Pali, Makai by the land of Kaailau.

The third piece is bounded on the Mauka and Olowalu, and Makai sides by the creek of Kauaula, and Kaanapali side by the high Pali.

Moku sworn, I know the house lot of Poepoe. He received it from Moa in 1839 or 1940, and his title to it has never been questioned.

It is bounded Mauka by the lot of Kapu, Olowalu by the lot of Kainoi, Makai by "Puehuehuiki", Kaanapali by the lot of Kaiwipochoole. It is in "Halakaa", Lahaina. (v. s7/68-69)

6868 Hanapaipo

Moku sworn. I know the land of claimant is in "Puehuehunui", Lahaina. It consist of a House lot, and garden in one piece.

The claimant received this land from Kahehuna the Luna in the year 1841 and there has never been any dispute respecting claimant's title. I am the Luna Aukau of Lahaina, and have resided there for 23 years.

It is bounded Mauka by the lot of Ina, Olowalu by the land of Nuhi, Makai by the land of Kaaukahi, Kaanapali by "Puehuehu iki". See pg. 72 v. 15 (v. 7/69)

10221 Makaulia from 61 v.

This claim which was partly heard this morning and it is now resumed.

Kapohaku sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Bolabola", Lahaina.

The Kalo land of 2 Lois is bounded Mauka by the land of Kalua, Olowalu by the Poalima of Kalua, Makai by the land of Keahohapalani, Kaanapali by the land "Haleu".

The Kula land and one Loi is bounded Mauka by the lois of Pikanele, Olowalu by the same, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by the land "Haleu".

The remaining loi is bounded Mauka by the land of Kealohapalani, Olowalu by the land of Pahi, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the land of Kealohapalani.

Kealakai sworn. I know the land of the claimant in "Polanui", Lahaina, they consist of one House lot, one Kula, two Moo's in another piece, and one Kalo land of 5 Lois. One of six Lois, one of two Lois, another of 2 Lois, and 6 Lois in the others, scattered here and there. K can point out the boundaries of the lois correctly.

The claimant received these lands from Hoapili long before his death in 1823, and he has been in the peaceably possession of them ever since.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Pali, Olowalu by the land of Kawau, Makai by Puehuehuiki, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The Kula is bounded Mauka by "Halakaa", Olowalu by the same, Makai by the land of Kapu, Kaanapali by "Hooka".

The piece of Moo's, is bounded Mauka by the land of Kamaka, Olowalu by the land of Kauhi, Makai by the land of Malekahana, Kaanapali by the land of Makuahine.

The Kalo land of 5 Lois is bounded Mauka by the cattle yard of Kahipokine, Olowalu by "Launiupoko", Makai by the land of Kauhi, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The Kalo land of 6 Lois is bounded Mauka by the land of Kauhi, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the Poalima lois of Kanaina, Kaanapali by the land of Kauhi.

The next of two Lois is bounded by the land of Kapele, Olowalu by the land of Pila, Makai by the land of Kapule, Kaanapali by "Waineenui".

The other piece of 2 Lois is bounded by the land of Kanaina on Mauka side, Olowalu and the other sides by my lands.

(See Claim 6855 Keha claimant which is a counter claim for a part of the kula above described.)(v. 7/70)

6869 Kauaioahu

Olala sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Waineeiki" and "Makila", Lahaina. They are in 3 pieces, one Ili of land called Waikapu in "Makila", and two Moo's of Kula in separate pieces in "Waineeiki".

He obtained the ili of land in Makila from Hoapili in olden times. The two Moo's he obtained from Ualo, one of them is a House lot. Those were obtained in 1844, and there has been no dispute except it be from Lot Kamehameha. Ualo was a man living on this land under Hoapiil whose heir is Lot. He owned no rights in the land any further than the case of it given to him to take care of.

Lot stated that he was willing to let the claimant live on this land during his life, that he did not wish to drive him from it. The claimant states that this was all he asked.

The Ili is bounded Mauka by the land of Kalohohina, Olowalu by the creek of Kauaula, Makai by the land of Kalehoula, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

The Moo nearest the Church, Mauka of "Wainee", Olowalu by Ualo's lot, Makai by the road leading mauka of the Church, Kaanapali by the land of Ualo.

The other Moo is bounded on all sides with the land of Lot or Kanaina. I don't know which. It is a piece within a large lot which is in dispute, between Kekoanaoa and Kanaina. (v. 7/70-71)

6870 Pupule

Kainikani sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Makila", Lahaina. It is in two pieces one a Kula of 2 Moos, and the other a section of Kalo land.

The claimant received these lands from Kauluna in 1838, and she has had in peaceably possession ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Kalehoula, Olowalu by the Poalima land, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by the land of Holu.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaholonui, Olowalu by he creek of Kauaula, Makai by the land of Holi, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

There are two Poalima lois in this Kalo section.

There is also a House lot which is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Olowalu by the lot of Kane, Makai by the sea beach, Kaanapali by the land of Kaiwiopiopio. (v. 7/71-72)

#### 6871 Naheananui

Kukahiko sworn. I know the land of the claimant, they are in "Kauaula", Lahaina, they consist 2 pieces, one piece of Kalo land of 24 Lois, and one piece of Kula.

The claimant received these lands from Keawe the Luna of this land in the old days of Hoapili before 1839, and he has always had peaceable possession of the same from that time.

The Kalo land of 24 Lois is bounded Mauka by the land of Poepoe, Olowalu by the land of Kalua, Makai by the land of Kaeaholokai, Kaanapali by the land of Poepoe.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the land of Umi, Olowalu by the land of Kalua, Makai by the land of Kaailau, Kaanapali by the land of Kukahiko. (v. 7/72)

#### 6872 Kauaia

Kaiaholokai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Kauaula", Lahaina, they consist of 2 pieces of Kula land and 3 pieces of Kalo land in one 9 Lois, in the other 10, the third 6 Lois, and one House lot.

The claimant received this lands from Keluahonui in 1836 and he has had quiet possession ever since.

The House lot is bounded Mauka and all the other sides by the land of Kanonui. Kanonui owns of the land which the house stands.

The first piece of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Kahulanui, Olowalu by the same, and the other two sides by the land of Kalua.

The second piece of Kula is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by the land of Umi, Makai by the land of Kaoao, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The Kalo land of 9 Lois is bounded Mauka by the land of Kalua, Olowalu by the creek of "Kauaula", Makai by the land of Kalua, Kaanapali by the land of Kalua and Poepoe.

Umi sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Kauaula", Lahaina. They consist of two pieces of Kula, and two pieces of Kalo land, one of 10 Lois and 10 Lois in the other.

The claimant obtained this lands from Kenalo or Keawe in 1844 and he has had quiet possession ever since.

The first piece is bounded Mauka and Kaanapali by my land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the land of Kaoao.

The second piece of Kula is bounded Mauka by the land of Kauaua, Olowalu by the land of Honokoia, Makai by the land of Kalua, North by the land of Kaailau.

The first piece of Kalo is bounded Mauka and North by my land, Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by the land of Kalua.

The other piece of Kalo is bounded precise by the same as the second piece of Kula, i.e. the same men's lands adjoin. (v. 7/73)

#### 6874 Kahune

Kaulahea sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Alio", Lahaina. They consist of two pieces, one a Kalo land, and the other a Kula land.

The claimant received these lands from Lani, about 1840, and his title has never been disputed.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka and Olowalu, and Makai sides by the land of Kauhihape, North by "Hooka".

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by Waineana's land, Olowalu by Iukahi, Makai by the land of Lipa, North by "Waieenui". (v. 7/73-74)

#### 6913 Mahiai

Kamohai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kaulalo", Lahaina. They consist of 3 pieces, two of which are Kalo, and one a Kula. He received these lands from Kaaihee, three years since. Kaaihee had them from Kanehiwa the Luna of "Kaulalo". The title of Kaaihee or the claimant I never heard disputed. "Kaulalo" is a good land.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the Govt road leading to Olowalu, Olowalu by the land of Makuahine, Makai by the main street of Lahaina, North by the Poalima land.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the land of Umi, Olowalu by the creek of Pahoia, Makai by the land of Pinawa, North by the Pali. See 50 v. 15 (v. 7/74)

6875 Kaulahea See 197 p

Kauhihape sworn. I know the land of the claimant. They consist of 6 pieces, 4 of Kula land, two of Kalo land.

The claimant claimed these lands from Lani in the days of Hoapili before 1839, and his title has never been questioned.

The first piece of Kula is bounded Mauka by the Govt road leading to Olowalu, Olowalu by the land of Kaaihulu and Nakapa, Makai by my land, North by the Poalima land of Lani.

The second piece of Kula is bounded Mauka and North by the Poalima land of Lani, Olowalu by the land of Kapule, Makai by the road leading to Olowalu.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> piece of Kula is bounded Mauka by "Hooka", Olowalu and Makai by the Poalima land of Lani, North by my land.

The Kula of one Moo is bounded Mauka by the land of Kahaulua, Olowalu by "Halakaa", Makai by the creek of "Paunauiki", North by the Poalima kula, and the same creek.

The other piece of Kula is bounded Mauka by the road leading to Olowalu, Olowalu by the land of Haupu, Makai by the great Government road, North by the Poalima land.

The Kalo land of 2 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kahili's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai and Kaanapali by the creek of Kauaula.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Kahili's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Kauhiiheha's lands.

The last piece is bounded Mauka by the Poanui's land, Olowalu and Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the creek. (v. 7/77)

6915 Kaupu

Kua sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Paunauiki", Lahaina, and consist of two pieces of Kula land.

The claimant received this land from me in my capacity of Luna of "Paunauiki" in 1843 or 4, and from that time to the present he has been undisturbed. The King is the Great Lord of Paunauiki.

The first piece of Kula contains 2 Moos is bounded Mauka by the Poalima land, Olowalu by my land, Makai by Kauhiheha's land, Kaanapali by the land of Kaulunae.

The other piece is bounded Mauka by Halakaa, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by Kahili's land. (v. 7/77-78)

6879 Kukaulua

Kua sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Paunauiki", Lahaina. They consist of 2 pieces of Kula land, one containing 7 Moos, the other 2 Moos. The claimant received these lands in the days of Namakeha in 1844 from me as Luna, and he has possessed them in peace ever since.

The first piece contains of 7 Moos, is bounded Mauka by "Halakaa", Olowalu by the same, Makai by the same, and Kahil's land, Kaanapali by Hekona's land.

The other piece is bounded Mauka by the creek of Paunau, Olowalu by the Haupu's land, Makai by the Govt road leading to Olowalu, Kaanapali by Kauhiheha's land. (v.7/78)

6880 Kanaualiuali

Ulala sworn. I know the land of the claimant. They are in "Kauaula", Lahaina, and consist of one piece of Kalo land of 11 Lois.

The claimant received this land from Kenalo the Luna of the land in 1839 or 1840, and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Ukiki's land, Olowalu by the road leading from the beach to the mountain, Makai by "Makila", Kaanapali by the same and the Pali. (v.7/78)

#### 6881 Kahulanui

This Kahulanui is not the same person who is the claimant in No. 4878, Part 13.

Kanaualiuali sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kauaula", Lahaina. They consist of 3 pieces, 24 Lois and one Moo of Kula land in one piece, 2 pieces of Kula in one Moo each.

The claimant received these lands from Keawe, in the year 1836 and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The Kalo land, and one Moo of Kula is bounded Mauka by the creek, and Honokoa's land, Olowalu by Kahanamiku's land, Makai by the Poalima Lois, Kaanapali by the land of Kaanaana.

The next piece one Moo of Kula is bounded Mauka by Honkoka's land, Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by Kaanaana's land, Kaanapali by the land of Ukiki.

Olala sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kauaula", Lahaina. They consist of 2 pieces of Kula and six Lois scattered here and there.

The claimant received these lands from Kenalo in 1830, and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The first piece of Kula land is bounded Mauka by Kahulanui's land, Olowalu by the same, Makai by Poepoe's land, Kaanapali by Kahiko's land.

The next piece of Kula is bounded Mauka by the Poalima land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the stream and Kahulanui's land.

This is a different Keawe from the one in 6882.

The claimant received these lands from me in the days of Hoapili, and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The first piece is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Paele's land, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

The other piece is bounded Mauka by Kaleloula's land, Olowalu by the Pali and creek, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Pi's lands and mine. (v. 7/81)

Kamohai sworn. I know the land of the claimant is in "Makila", Lahaina. It is a Kalo land of six Lois.

The claimant received it from Kalaiepu the Luna, in 1844, and has possession of it in peace ever since.

It is bounded mauka by Kanui's lands; Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by the land of Kaleiepu, Kaanapali by Waimanalo's land. (v. 7/81)

Kamohai sworn. I know the land of the claimant is in "Kaulalo", Lahaina and consist of 3 Lois in one piece.

The claimant received it from Pinauea in the days of Namahiha, and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Pinauea's land, Olowalu by Poopuu's land, Makai by Makahiwa's land, Kaanapali by the high Pali. (v. 7/82-83)

6920 Poopuu W. June 4 1849

Kamohai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kaulalo", Lahaina, and consist of 4 pieces, 3 pieces of Kalo and one of Kula lands. One of the Kalo lands has 8 Lois and one Kula, another 1 Loi, another of 2 Lois. The claimant received them from Kanehiwa in the days of Namakeha.

It is bounded Mauka by Kaleipaihala's kula, Olowalu by the road leading to the Mountains on Wainee dividing it from the Hinder's lands, Makai by Namaka's land, Kaanapali by my lands. (v. 9/91)

Noku sworn. The claimant is dead. Before he died however he removed to Oahu, leaving all his lands here to Kawaihae claimant in no. 6889. (v. 7/92)

Olala sworn. The land of the claimant is in "Puehuehuiki", Lahaina. It consists of one piece of Kula, and Kalo land of 12 Lois. There are 5 of the Lois however which are Poalima.

The claimant received it from Puipui in 1835, and has possessed it in peace ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by Napala's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by "Kuia". (v. 7/93)

6911 Kahina- Woman

It is bounded Mauka by the Pali of Hanaula, Olowalu by the same, Makai by "Kuia", Kaanapali by "Haliili" and the Pali. (v. 7/94)

6933 Neua a little boy June 6 1849

Kahina sworn. I know the mother of the claimant. My boy's lands they are in "Ilikahi", Lahaina. It is Kula and Kalo land all in one piece.

He received it from his grandfather Hanui, and his grandfather received it from David Malo before 1839, and dying in 1840, left it to this child who has possessed it in peace ever since. This land of "Kikahi" is Lewis as Chief, and David Malo is the Luna of it.

It is bounded Mauka by D. Malo's land, Olowalu by "Polanui", Makai by "Alio", Kaanapali by Naumana's Pali and the creei, and Opio's land. See p 37 v. 15 different land. (v. 7/95)

6934 Ukiki (is dead)

Olala sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kanaula", Lahaina and consist of one Kalo land and 4 section of Kula land.

The claimant received these lands from the Luna Kui in the year 1839 or 1840, and his title has never been disputed. The claimant is dead this year with the measles leaving this land to his only child Waihiakaea a son.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Polima land, Olowalu by Umi's land, Makai by "Makila", Kaanapali by the high Pali called "Kukaimoa."

The first piece of Kula is bounded Mauka by Honokoa's lands, Olowalu by Kanana's land, Makai by Kahulanui's land, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> piece of Kula is bounded Mauka by Kalua's Poalima, Olowalu by the land of Honokoa, Makai by Umi's land, Kaanapali by the Pali of "Haleluli."

The 3<sup>rd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by the creek of Kauaula, Olowalu by the same, Makai by "Kuinamoi" a small mountain, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The last piece is bounded Mauka by the high Pali of "Puhi", Olowalu by the same, Makai by Kaanaana's land, Kaanapali by the small mountain called "Hanapa." (v. 7/95)

6901 Kahaumanu June 6 1849

This claim was called, but no person appeared to answer and it could not be ascertained who the claimant was. (v. 7/96)

6895 Kauakahi

Moku sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Puehuehunui", Lahaina, and it consists of 2 pieces of Kula and 2 of Kalo.

The claimant received these lands from Nalimu, in the year 1833 and has possessed them in peace ever since.

The first piece of Kula has one Loi in it, and is bounded Mauka by Hanakaipo's land, Olowalu by Nuhi's land, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Puehuehuiki.

The second piece of Kula has 2 Lois connected with it, and is bounded Mauka by Koliukua's land, Olowalu by the creek of Puehuehu, Makai by Kanakao's land, Kaanapali by "Halakaa."

The 3<sup>rd</sup> piece of 2 Lois is bounded Mauka by Umi's land, Olowalu by the creek of Puehuehu, Makai by Koliukua's land, Kaanapali by Kokuno's land.

The 4<sup>th</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by "Waineenui", Olowalu by Hanakaoo's land, Makai by the Poalima land, Kaanapali by Waineenui. There are seven Lois in this piece. (v. 7/96)

#### 9811 Makaula

Olala sworn. The claimant has gone on a whaling voyage and left all his lands to Maele his brother in law. See p 44 v. 15 (v. 7/96)

#### 9813 Namaka

Olala sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Wainenui", Lahaina, and consist of one House lot, and 1 Kula and one Kalo lands.

The claimant received them from Kaleipaihala in the year 1844 and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaluahinenui, Olowalu by James Nowlien's land, on the other two side by the Poalima.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by Mele's land, Olowalu by Kalani's, Makai by Poalima, Kaanapali by Naea.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by "Puehuehu", Olowalu by a low Pali, Makai Ualo's land, Kaanapali by the road dividing it from "Kuia". (v. 7/96-97)

#### 9814 Nawai June 6 1849

Liu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kelaweia", Lahaina. They consist of two separate Lois and one Loi and House lot.

The claimant received them from Nalehu the Luna in the older times of Hoapili, and these lands have been held by him without dispute although Pikanele has taken away the other lands of his.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by my lands, Olowalu by Hookano's land, Makai by the Govt road near Lahainaluna, Kaanapali by the land of Keaweluaole.

The first piece of Kalo land mauka is bounded Mauka by Pikanele's land, Olowalu by the same, Makai and Kaanapali sides by the Kapaulu creek.

The remaining piece is bounded on all sides by Pikanele's land. This last one is disputed Pikanele. Pikanele said that he allowed the man all he claimed. (v. 7/97)

9815 Liu

Kupihanui W. sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kilawea", Lahaina. They consist of 5 Lois in one piece and 5 Lois in another piece with a Kula, and one in another.

The claimant received these lands from Hoapili Kane, and Hoapili Wahine in the days of Kamehameha I. His title has never been disputed.

The piece of 5 Lois is bounded Mauka by Pikanele's land, Olowalu by Hokano's, Makai by Nama's, Kaanapali by Keaweluaole.

The second piece of 5 Lois is bounded on all sides by Pikanele's lands.

The last piece is bounded Mauka by Pikanele's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by Kuailike, Kaanapali by the creek of "Kapoulu." (v. 7/97-98)

9816 Kaununui June 6 1849

Kapihanui sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kelawea", Lahaina. They consist of one Kalo land of 10 Lois, and one Kula with a house on it.

The claimant had them from Hoapili in his early days, and has held them without dispute ever since.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by Pikanele's land, Olowalu by the creek of Kapoula, Makai by Paeohi's lois, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The other piece is bounded Mauka by Kanaina's land, Olowalu and Makai by Pikanele's land, Kaanapali by Kuailike's land. (v. 7/98)

9817 Makele

This claim is identical with claim no. 4878 Part 30. (v. 7/98)

9825 Paniani

Kaimokane sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Polanui", Lahaina. It is a House lot.

He had these land from Hoapili wahine in the year 1824 and has had in peaceable possession ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by the land of "Kekakanui". (v. 7/98)

9818 Paahana W. June 6 1849

Moku sworn. The claimant is my daughter. The lands she claimed are in Kilolani. When her husband Mahi died, she returned these lands to the Konohiki of Kilolani named Kaohie, and went to live Olowalu where she now lives, with a new husband. (v. 7/99)

9819 Hulaia

Mele sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Polaiki", Lahaina, and consist of one piece of Kalo land of 4 Lois.

The claimant received these lands from Ulumekukui in the year 1847 or 1848 and has possessed them ever since. Ulumekukui the Konohiki is now dead.

This piece is bounded Mauka by Keaweliopu's land, Olowalu by "Polanui", Makai by Puaaliwa's land, Kaanapali by "Waineenui". (v. 7/99)

9820 Paele

Mele sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Waineenui", Lahaina. They consist of one piece of Kula land Makai and one section of Kalo land containing 14 small Lois up mauka.

The claimant received these land from Kaleipaihala in 1845, and has possessed them ever since without disturbance.

The Kula is bounded Mauka by the land of "Kuia, Olowalu by Kaleipaihala's land, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by "Kuia".

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by Kahealinenui's land, Olowalu by Naia's, Makai by "Waineeiki", Kaanapali by Ualo's land. (v. 7/99-100)

9822 Kaailau June 6 1849

Kanana sworn. I know the land of the claimant, they are in "Halakaa", and "Hauaula", and "Makila", Lahaina. They consist of one Kula and Loi in one piece. Another piece of one Kula and 7 Lois and the other one Loi.

The claimant received these lands from Col. Moa, one loi in "Halakea", in the days of Hoapili. From Kalua he received one Loi and one Kula in 1847 from Kaluopu he received the 7 Lois in "Makila", in the year 1846, and he has held them without dispute except one Kalo patch in "Makilo" which is Kanehiwa has disputed without reason.

The one Loi in "Halakaa" is bounded Mauka and Olowalu and Makai by Pumaiwaa's land, Kaanapali by the creek of Kauaiola.

The piece of 7 Lois in Makila is bounded on all sides by Haleiopu's land.

The one Kula and one Loi piece in Hauaula is bounded Mauka by Kalua's land, Olowalu by Kukahiko's, Makai by Honokoa's, Kaanapali by the high Pali. See p. 61 v. 15 (v. 7/100)

9823 Kaoao June 6 1849

Kaailau sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kauaula", Lahaina, they consist of Section of Kalo land, and 3 Moos of one Kula in one piece, and one Kula in another.

The claimant received these lands from Henalo the Luna in 1846 and he has held them in peace ever since.

The first piece is bounded Mauka by the Poalima of Kekauionohi, Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by Moku's land, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the Pali of Hauaula, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the Poalima, Kaanapali by Honokoa's. (v. 7/100)

9821 Kaleiopu



Maimai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Makila", Lahaina. They consist of one Kalo and one Kula land.

The claimant received these lands from Kaulunae the Luna in the days of John Young Governorship, and has held them in peace ever since.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Pupuka's, Makai by Kamaka's, Kaanapali by Pi's land.

The Kalo piece is bounded Mauka by Makanui's, Olowalu by Uilama's, Makai by Pupuka's, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

There are 2 Lois inside of this last piece belonging to the Poalima of Kaulunae. (v. 7/100-101)

9824 Kahulanui June 6 1849

This claim is identical with a part of the land already heard in No. 4878 Part 15. (v. 7/101)

6203 Namauu Ehu or Lazaro

10533 Namauu Lazaro

Namauu No. 10533 is identical with this claim.

The claimant produced a paper showing to the satisfaction of the Commission that he had divided the Ahupuaa of "Kooka" with the King and that he was entitled to one half of said Ahupuaa, situated in Lahaina.

Manu sworn. I know the land of "Kooka" situated in Lahaina, one half of which belongs to the claimant. I am a son of that land. There are six natives living on the half of Kooka belonging to the claimant. I am one, Kahaka, Olelo, Kuaana, Kaia, Opunui.

The division with the Government is not made property as yet and hence I cannot give the correct boundaries.

I know that the claimant has beside his ½ of "Kooka", a House lot in Lahaina. He had it from Mohikio in the days of Hoapili about 1838, and his title has never been disputed.

It is fenced and the fence is the correct bounds. On the Mauka side by the Lois of the Govt, Olowalu by Pikanele's lot, Makai and Kaanapali sides by the lot of Kanaina. (v. 7/101)

6204 Manu June 6 1849

This claim is identical with the No. 5458 heard on Friday June 1 1849. (v. 7/102)

6205 Olelo

Lazaro Namauu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kooka", Lahaina, they consist of 2 Kula and 6 Lois in one piece, and one House lot.

The claimant received them from me in the year 1842 and his title has never been disputed, he lives on my half of "Kooaha", mentioned in the claim above.

This land is bounded Mauka by "Puehuehuiki", Olowalu by Pahoa, Makai by the Pali, Kaanapali by "Waineenui".

The House lot is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by "Polanui", Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Puaanui. (v. 7/102)

6206 Lola

Lazaro Namauu sworn. The lands of the claimant, they are in "Kooka", Lahaina. They are nally, however the lands of Kupalu claimant in No. 4878 Part 8 heard on Friday June1, 1849. Lola being only a man whom Kupalu hires to go to Poalima work. (v. 7/102)

6207 Kahaka See p. 162

Manu sworn. The land of the claimant is in "Kooka", Lahaina, and consists of 2 pieces, one a Kula land, and one Kalo land, with the Kula, however there one Loi.

The claimant received these lands from Lazaro Namauu about 2 years since and has held them without dispute.

The Kula nd one Loi piece is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Lazaro Namauu's, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by "Puaanui".

The other piece is bounded Mauka by Kupalu's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by "Pahua", Kaanapali by the stream of "Kooka." (v. 7/102-103)

6208 Makaino See Omakaino June 6 1849

Lazaro Namauu sworn. The lands of the claimant is in "Kooka", Lahaina, and consists of one piece of Kalo and one piece of Kula land.

The claimant received them from me, in the year 1843, and has held it ever since without dispute.

The Kalo piece is bounded Mauka by "Waineenui", Olowalu by my land, Makai by Kahaka's land, Kaanapali by Puaanui's.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by Manu's land, Olowalu by Kekua, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Puaanuis. (v. 7/103)

6209 Kamohai

Pupule W. sworn. The lands of the claimant they are in "Makila", Lahaina, and consists of 2 Moos of Kula in one piece and one section of Kalo land.

The claimant received them from Kauluna in the days of Hoapili and has held them since in part. But Pi, and Honu keep the Kula from him. Pi and Honu are old residents on the land (It appeared after much evidence that the Claim of Pi and Honu were just and that the claimant was without foundation so far as the Kula is concerned (See Pi's and Honu's claims heard a few days snice).

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by Pupuka's land, Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by Pai's land, Kaanapali by the high Pali. (v. 7/103)

6210 Kapuka

Pupule sworn. The land of the claimant is in "Makila", Lahaina. It is a House lot and one Loi.

The claimant received it from Pupuka in the days of Hoapili and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Pupuka's land, Olowalu by the creek of Makila, Makai by Pupuka's land, Kaanapali by Maimai's land. (v. 7/103-104)

6211 imai A blind man June 6 1849

A Moku sworn. The claimant is in "Makila", Lahaina. It is in one piece of Kalo and two of Kula but one of the Kula's is joined to one of the Kalo lands, and hence there are only 3 distinct pieces.

The claimant received them from Kaulunae in the year 1841 and has held them in peace ever since.

The first piece makai is bounded Mauka by the Poalima, Olowalu by Kapuka's land, Makai by Paele's land, Kaanapali by Kalehuula's land.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Pai's land, Olowalu by the Pali of Makila, Makai by the Poalima land, Kaanapali by the Pali of Makila.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Pupuka's land, Olowalu by Kamihai's land, Makai by Pai's land, Kaanapali by the Pali of Makila. (v. 7/104)

6212 Kekua

Maimai sworn. The lands of the claimant are in "Makila", Lahaina, and consists of one Kalo land and Kula, and one Kula by itself.

The claimant received them from Kaulunae in the year 1823 and has had quiet possession ever since, the Konohiki has 4 Loies of Kalo however in the midst of the Kalo land.

The first piece is bounded Mauka by Pi's land, Olowalu by the Pali of Makila, Makai by Kamakakapu's land, Kaanapali by the Pali of Makila.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by Kaleiopu's land, Olowalu by Honu's land, Makai by the Govt fence, Kaanapali by the land of Pi. (v. 7/104)

6213 Hela June 6 1849

This is the same person that is called Pupule in Claim no. 6870 heard on June 4<sup>th</sup> 1849. (v. 7/105)

6214 Oo

A Moku sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Puehuehunui", Lahaina, and is in 3 pieces, 2 of Kula, one of Kalo.

The claimant received them from Kaluhuna the Luna in 1841 and he has held them ever since without dispute.

The Kula is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by "Kaulalo", Makai by Laahili's land, Kaanapali by Liukua's land.

The first piece of Kalo of 22 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kalua's land, Olowalu by Nuhi's land, Makai by Liukua's land, Kaanapali by "Waineenui".

The other Kula is bounded Mauka by Liukua's land, Olowalu by the creek of "Puehuehu", Makai by Kokanee's land, Kaanapali by "Halakaa". (v. 7/105)

6215 Keoni

A Moku sworn. I know the land of the claimant is in "Puehuhunui", Lahaina and is in one piece of Kula land.

The claimant had this land from Maimai the blind man in 1847. Maimai had it from Maimai in the year 1845 and these title have never been dispute.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaiimikio, Olowalu by "Kaulalo", Makai by my land, Kaanapali by the Poalima land.

The claimant has gone to California. (v. 7/105)

Makuahine sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Pohanui", and is in 3 pieces. One piece consists of 10 Lois, another of Kula land, and another Kula land close to the house.

The claimant received these lands from me in the year 1845 and her title has never been disputed.

The first piece consisting of 10 Lois is bounded Mauka by Hoalakai, Olowalu by Kainikane's, Makai by John White's land, Kaanapali by Kalaipaihala's land.

Pakeanini sworn. I know the land of the claimant. They are in "Wahikuli", Lahaina. It consists of one piece a Kula and House lot only.

The claimant received this land from Kaenaena the Luna in 1841 and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of the Konohiki, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by the Konohiki's land. (v. 7/107)

6474 Kaihuhauna

Kekoko sworn. I know the land of the claimant is in "Wahikuli", Lahaina, they consist of a House lot and garden in one piece.

The claimant received it from Kaenaena the Konohiki in the year 1841 and has had undisputed possession to the present time.

It is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by the Konohiki's land, Makai by J. Kaeo's cococ nut grove, Kaanapali by the Konohiki's land. (v. 7/107)

6475 Kaohana

Kekoka sworn. I know the land of the claimant is in "Wahikuli", Lahaina. It consist of one piece a House lot and garden.

The claimant received it from me in the days of Hoapili before 1839 and has had in peaceable possession ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the Kula of the Konohiki, Olowalu by th same, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by the Konohiki's land. (v. 7/107)

6476 Kelukuli (is dead)

Kekoko sworn. I know the land of the claimant is in "Wahikuli", Lahaina. It is one piece a House lot and a garden.

The claimant received it from me in the years before 1839 and he has held the same without dispute ever since.

It is bounded Mauka and Olowalu ty the Kula of the Konohiki, Makai by the Cocoa nut grove of J. Kaeo, Kaanapali by the Kula of the Konohiki. (v. 7/107-108)

6477 Pakeaniani June 7 1849

Kaaahaunalo sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Wahikuli", Lahaina. They consist of a House lot and garden.

The claimant received it from Kekoko before 1839 and he has had undisputed possession from that time to the present times.

It is bounded Mauka by the "anapuni", cattle pasture, Olowalu by Kekoko's land, Makai by the Cocoa nut grove of Kaeo, Kaanapali by my land.

There is also belonging to claimant a piece of Kula up mauka on the same Ahupuaa. It was received from Kokoko and his title to it is the same as to the House lot.

It is bounded Mauka by the Pali, Olowalu by the same, Makai by Kekoko's land, Kaanapali by the high Pali of Wahikuli. (v. 7/108)

6498 Kokio See pg 170

Nakoelua sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Kainehe", Lahaina. They consist of a House lot and Kula in one piece and one piece of Kalo, up mauka of 5 Lois.

The claimant received these lands from Aki in 1845, and he has held them without disputed ever since. J. Piikoi is the Lord of the land.

The House lot and Kula piece is bounded Mauka by "Hanakaoo", Olowalu by my land, and path, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by "Puunoo".

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by "Kalimaohe", Olowalu by the high Pali, Makai by the creek of Kahoma, Kaanapali by the same. (See further testimony in this claim.)(v. 7/108-109)

6500 Pihalaalau

Hauemo sworn. I know the land of the claimant, is in "Kainehe", Lahaina. It is one piece of a House lot.

The claimant received it in the year 1831 from Kekia, and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Mahie's yard, Olowalu by Pupuka's, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Kamai's land. (v. 7/109)

6847 Pauahi

The claimant sworn. The land here claimed is in "Moalii", Lahaina and I have returned it to the Konohiki of Keawe. (v. 7/109)

6848 Lulawale

Paulii sworn. The claimant was my father and is now dead. I am his only son and child and inherited all this land which I have returned to the Konohiki Keawe. The land now belongs to Keawe. (v. 7/109)



6849 Nahale W.

Keakualele sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Moalii", Lahaina. They consist of one piece of Kula and 2 Lois. Another piece of 2 Lois up Mauka and the other a House lot.

The claimant received it from Nahauna before 1839 and was held without dispute up to this year when Moakaka a woman (present) claimed two of the Lois. The ground of Moakaka's claim is that in the days of Hoapili in the year 1839, the two patch were States by Nahauene from her father and given to the claimant kept by the claimant until this time.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Olowalu by Kaka the Konohiki of land, Makai by the sea beach, Kaanapali by Paahai's land.

The Kalo land has 6 Lois is bounded Mauka by Nahale's loi, Olowalu by the creek of Aki, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by "Waiana'e". (v. 7/110)

2652 Napuupahoehoe

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Puehuehunui", Lahaina. It is one piece of a House lot.

The claimant received it from Nawaa in the year 1831 and has possessed it ever since. But within the last two years I hear that Kaunaea has built on this lot up to within the last two years there never was any dispute of the claimant title, but he lived there in peace ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni leading to Olowalu, Olowalu by the yard of Keahelele, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the yard of Nailuli.

No. 6428 is a counter claim to this. I was the Luna here in the days that this land was given to the claimant.

John Richardson sworn. I have heard the testimony of Kaauwai and it is correct. There is one other thing however I heard Puipui the father of Kaumaea the counter claimant in No. 6428 and from whom the claims to desire his title says in Dec. 1847 that he claims this lot, because he as a Konohiki of this land.

The claimant was never disputed in his title until 1847.

Kaili W. sworn. I have lived close claimants lot since the days of Kamehameha I. The claimant has lived on this lot fencing and improving it in peace from 1831 to the present time, except that Kaunaea has claimed it within the last year. See page 469. (v. 7/111)

2650 John Richardson

Mr. Richardson stated that this claim was written out by me but have no title in this lot it belongs to Kaili and son Kakanui and out of kindness I sent in their claim for them.

Kipi W. sworn. I know the lands of Kaili. They are in "Puehuhunui", and "Puehuehuiki". They consist of 4 pieces, a House lot and Kula in "Puehuhunui" and a piece of Kalo and one of Kula land in "Puehuehuiki."

The claimant received the land in "Puehuehuiki" from Puipui in 1824 and has occupied it ever since without dispute.

The 2 pieces in "Puehuhunui" she had from Kaehuna in 1838 and has possessed them in peace ever since.

I heard yesterday that a woman by the named of Kauhi had put in a claim for it (no Claim in Opposition found).

The first piece of Kula is bounded Mauka by Lahili's land, Olowalu by the Poalima of "Puehuhunui", Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by "Halakaa."

The Kalo land of 14 Lois is bounded Mauka by Haueka's lois, Olowalu by the Poalima of Lahili, Makai by the Kaniko's lois, Kaanapali by the creek of Kauaule.

The House lot in "Puehuehunui" is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Olowalu by Kapela's land, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Makaele's yard.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by Kaailu's land, Olowalu by the land of Kalehoula, Makai by Kaaihe's land, Kaanapali by Pua's land. (v. 7/111-112)

2924 Kale Kailaa W.

Kapihenui W sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant. They are in "Puehuehunui", Lahaina. Connected with it are 5 Lois. It was heard in the days of Mr. Richards and has been surveyed. She has a House lot at Olowalu also which is the same mentioned in Cl. No. 5113, heard May 30, 1849.

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the 11 Lois of the claimed by Kailaa at the Ili of Kahao in Paunau, Lahaina. It has been occupied in common by this claimant and Kamanaua ever since 1832.

They divided the Lois between them. This Kamanaua is the same man named in No. 6439 and No. 4990. His heirs are Keaweheulu and Nakuala are his heirs they are Counter Claim Moku the Luna has decided this case once. He gave the remaining six to Nakuala. Mr. Baldwin has had this matter him in the Church and it is on old boned contention. Kaauwai, Kamakau and Lee were all of the opinion that the division made by Moku should stand and thus the matter be settled. This decision was made after hearing both parties who were present.

The Counter claim is No. 4990 (Kamanaua) and according to Moku's division. Nakuala the heir would be entitled to 12 lois and the claimant Kailaa 5 lois. The was once all Kamanawas.

The boundaries were not taken as they were difficult to get and it was thought best to let these be determined by the Surveyor. (v. 7/112-113)

7724 Poholopu

Kanalu sworn. I know the lands of the clamant. They are in "Kuholilea" and "Wahikuli". His House lot is in Wahikuli and one piece of Kula and 4 other small pieces in Kuhililea, both in Lahaina.

The House lot in Wahikuli he received from Aha before 1839 and his title has never been disputed.

The lands in Kuholilea were received from Kukai long before 1839 and have been in his undisputed possession ever since.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the high Pali, Olowalu by the creek of Lahainaluna, Makai by the yard of Keanepuni, Kaanapali by the pasture of Keanapuni.

The piece of 34 Lois and Kula in Kuholilea is bounded Mauka by the lois of Opunui, Olowalu by the great creek, Makai by the lois of Kukapu, Kaanapali by "Wahikuli".

The piece of 3 Lois is bounded Mauka by the lois of Halualani, Olowalu by the lois of Kaenaena, Makai by the lois of Kukapu, Kaanapali by Kukapu's land Kanaina's lois.

The one small Loi is bounded Mauka by Kuleapu's, Olowalu by the same, Makai by Kanaina's, Kaanapali by Kekoko's.

The next is one Loi and Kula is bounded Mauka by Alanui, Olowalu by Halualani, Makai and Kaanapali by Kukapu's land. (v. 7/113)

6465 Kahikona

This has been heard in the days of Mr. Richards. It is not properly a claim, but a letter inquiring about some paper. (v. 7/113)

6467 Kahikona

Kaua sworn. I know the land of the claimant called "Kumimi", on Molokai. It is a Ahupuaa. He received it from Hoapili Wahine in the year 1827, and held it up to the year 1840 in peace, when Kekaukuohi drove him from it, because he said, he had not received his possession from Kekauluohi. This was like denying that great chief. Upon this she sent her man to drive him from the land. He went to the King, and he told him to remain on his land. He did so, but Kekauluohi pursued him and threw him into prison and kept him in irons because he denied her. At last at the entreaty of Mr. Richards he is as let out of prison but his land was never restored.

Kekauluohi was the Premier, and prevailed over the King, he being young.

Mumuku sworn. The claimant had this land from Hoapili in 1827, and held it in peace until 1840.

Pikanele sworn. I know the land of Kumimi on Molokai belonged to the King. He gave it to his sister Nahienaena. She gave it to Hoapili, and Hoapili wahine, and she gave this Ahupuaa to the claimant and he held it in peace until 1840, when he was turned off by Kekauluohi, because she was Premier. He went to the King, and he said you arcd I am not homoed from this land. Kalukuona then held on it still. John Stevens the went to him and told him to be off. Kalukona said I will not go Kekauluohi the sent to Elai the Luna Aukau to turn him off. Kahikona said "I did not have my land from Kekauluohi, but from the King. She then sent her men, and brought him and thrust him into Prison, where he was kept 40 days when Mr. Richards interceded for his release and succeeded.

For one half of the Ahupuaa of "Pueopaku" and Hilo, Hawaii, he presented a paper showing a division of the same with the King (See the Book in the Office of the Minister of the Interior).

Kaua recalled. I know the claimants land at "Kahakuloa. It is an Ahupuaa called "Kukuipukaiki". He received it from Kahikona a woman, a chief in the days of Hoapili wahine in 1841. It came to Kahikona the woman from her mother, Moehikio. He has had undisputed possession to the present time.

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the claimants land in "Waihie", East Maui. It is on Ili "Paleluka" is the name of it. He has three Moos in this ili, but the great ili belong to Kanaina. The Moos have no named and I cannot describe them well. (v. 7/114-115)

10644 K. Puko

Kahoholu Wahine sworn. The claimant House lot is in "Waukama", Lahaina and she has two sections of Kalo land in "Pahoa", Lahaina.

The claimant received her House lot from Kanemaikou in the year 1830, when Lot was born. Her title to it has never been disputed.

The lands in "Pahoa" were received from the same person at the same time. She has held them without dispute except that Namaiu, before his death took away 3 Lois from her Lois.

The mauka piece in "Pahoa", is bounded Mauka by the Kaweolu's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the land of Kawahamano, Kaanapali by the creek of Kanaula.

The other piece of 2 Lois is bounded Mauka by Nalehu's lois, Olowalu by the loi of Pepai, Makai by the loi of Pikanele, Kaanapali by the loi of Nalehu.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni leading along side of the Meeting House, Olowalu by the street leading from the sea to mauka, Makai by the another street, Kaanapali by the Meeting House yard. It is a grave yard that belongs to many spirits. (v. 7/115)

6468 Kamauele

Hauola sworn. The claimant's land is in Paeohi, Lahaina. It has however been heard before Mr. Richards and awarded to L. Kaauwai. The claimants grandmother was his main witness. It has been surveyed by John Richardson. It is a House lot. However there is other land, however belonging to him.

The section of land here claimed is a large one.

L. Kaauwai sworn. I gave the claimant in 1844 a piece of land of about 10 Lois, or more a section of Kula. Her grandfather had this land in the time out of mind and held it without dispute until 1844 when he died and willed it to me. I then gave it to the claimant.

It is bounded Mauka by the House lot of Piele, Olowalu by the land of Kawaakipi, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Panaewa. (v. 7/115-116)

5894 Pelupalu W.

Keaweluaole sworn. The land of the claimant is in "Puako", Lahaina. It consists of a section of Kalo and Kula land.

The claimant received it from Hoapili Wahine in 1838 and she has held them ever since without dispute so are as I know until this day. Just now I have heard that Kekauonohi claims it. She set up the claim in 1848 I hear.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Kekauonohi, Olowalu by the "Alapai" the name of the loi, Makai by Kekauonohi's loi, Kaanapali by the loi of Poopuu. (v. 7/116)

6052 Waihoikaea and Kemi

Hanumo sworn. The claimants House lot is in "Puunoa" and 5 Moos of Kula in one piece at "Nakalepo" and a section of Lois in "Kuholilia", all in Lahaina.

The House lot is owned in common by the claimant, but all the other lands belong to Kenui alone. The House lot is from Uano in the year 1823. Their ancestors and themselves have lived here 35 years without dispute. J. Kaeo though I heard a few days ago disputed it.

The 5 Moos they received from Naua in the days of Liholiho and have held them without dispute.

The section of 9 Lois he received from Kaenaina the Luna in the year 1843 and has held them without dispute until about 3 weeks ago. Kanaina set up a claim to it and it came before Moku the Luna Auhau, and the Circuit Judge Nakaolelua and John Richardson and it was decided against Kanaina. The claimant says he will restore these rights to Kaewaewa.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by Kaeo's land, Olowalu by Kaihukai's land, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the Loko of Kaeo.

The 5 Moos is bounded Mauka by the creek, Olowalu by Ua's land, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by "Puunoo" and Alemihi.

The Kalo section is bounded Mauka by Kaenaena's loi, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by Kaaukai's land, Kaanapali by the Poalima loi of the Konohiki. (v. 7/116-117)

5912 Simeona Pahia

Numuku sworn. The land of the claimant is in "Puako", Lahaina. They consist of 5 pieces.

They were received from Kuakoa in the year 1840 and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The first piece is bounded Mauka by my lois, Olowalu by the road from the sea mauka, Makai and Kaanapali by the land of Kahea.

The second piece is bounded Mauka by Kalua's land, Olowalu by the same road spoken of above, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Kanuku's land.

The third piece is bounded Mauka by Kalua's land, Olowalu by Judge Parsons land, Makai by Kanuku's land, Kaanapali by a road or street.

The fourth piece is bounded Mauka by Kamokai's land, Olowalu by "Waineenui", Makai by D. Malo's land, Kaanapali by my own land.

The 5<sup>th</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Kalua's land, Olowalu by Kanuku's land, Makai by Kalua's land, Kaanapali by the Pali. This last piece is way up mauka. (v. 7/117)

5914 Puko See p 115 Lahaina June 8 1849

This claim is identical with No. 10644 which was heard yesterday. (v. 7/118)

4602 Hihio See 531 p

This claim is identical with No 6781, heard on the second of June inst. (v. 7/118)

7634 Kauho

This claim is identical with No. 6783. (v. 7/118)

7625 Kahoomaimae

Kanalu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. It is in "Kukolilea", Lahaina, and consists of 9 Loies all in one piece.

The claimant received these lands from Kalawaia in the year 1831 and he has possessed them in peace down to the present day.

It is bounded Mauka by the Poalima loies of Kanaina, Olowalu by the land and loie of Napahi, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the creek of "Kahoma". (v. 7/118)

5896 Bartholomea Haauinui See H.

(See Cl. 4878 Part 8 a counter claim in Part).

Keawehiaole sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They consist of a House lot and two Moos of land in one piece.

The claimant had these lands from Apaa in 1844, the head man of "Kooka", Lahaina, where this land lies. He held peaceable possession of them until 1848, when Kekua the widow of Apaa, who is the present Konohiki of "Kooka" drove him from the land. (Kekua appeared and said she drove him from the land because he did not pay a tax of 25 cents).



It is bounded Mauka by Keaka's land, Olowalu by Kahaka's and Kaku's land, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by Manu's land.

Puhi sworn. I know the House lot and 2 Moos of the claimant in "Kooka". He received this land from Apaa in 1844. He possessed it in peace up to 1847 or 1848, when Kekua turned him off because he did not pay the tax of 25 cents for his Moos.

Keohokane sworn for counter claim of Kupalu. That Kekua took this land away from the claimant and gave it to Kupalu about two years since. Kekua took away the land. The history of this claim is as follows.

The claimant came here from Hawaii about 1843 and lived with his brother, the witness Puhi, who has land adjoining this until they quarreled when he went to Kekua or Apaa her husband, and asked for a piece of land to cultivate, and Kekua gave him this land to cultivate upon condition that he paid her 25 cents per year for the Bread fruit on the land, and 20 cents a year for the Moos. He took the land, and the first year paid the sum agreed upon. The second year he would not pay the 25 cents for the Moos, and he would not the third year, and hence Kekua took away the land and gave it a Kupahi. He did not go to the Poalima like other men on "Kooka".

Manu sworn. I am a man living on "Kooka" and it is my business to see the Poalima work and to receive the commutation for the same, when the men do not work. The claimant Haawinui has not been to Poalima work or paid any commutation for the same. (v. 7/118-119)

6458 Kauhiwahine

Pikanele sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. It is in the large section or district of "Kalama", about 25 miles from Lahaina. It consists of three sections of land in "Kahakuloa" which is an Ahupuaa.

He receive one section an ili called "Puunauakuhe" from Kuakamauna in 1846. The other two sections from me in 1843 when I was the Luna of the land, he has held them in peaceable possession ever since.

These lands are all in the ili of "Puunauakuke" which the claimant own and it can be best bounded by giving the name of the Ili. The Konohiki, however, who is Kanaina owns a large Loi in the center. There is likewise an Auwai running through it that divided it.

The first piece is bounded Mauka by Kehimaluai, Lahaina side by the creek, Makai by the Konohiki's land, Nae by the Pali.

The second piece is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki's land, Lahaina side by the creek, Makai by Kahuahale, Nae by the Pali. (v. 7/119-120)

5935 Pahia June 8 1849

Makaulia sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Bolabola", and consist of Lois and Kula land in one piece.

I am the Konohiki of "Bolabola". The claimant has gone to live on Lanai. He went to Lanai in Jan. 7 1849 and before leaving restored this land to me in my official capacity. The King is the great Lord of the land. He sold his house however to Kahie before he went.

Kalua sworn. I was a witness to the transactions stated by Makaulia and they are correct. I heard the restoration from the mouth of the claimant Pahia himself. (v. 7/120)

6073 Kalepaka

The claimant has gone to California but his wife Aui appeared and answered for him.

Kaa sworn. The land of the claimant, they are one House lot in "Puunoa" the claim for which was heard by Mr. Richards and a piece of Kula with a House thereon, in "Moalii, Lahaina.

The claimant received part of this named land, i.e. 3 Moos from me between 1836 and 1839, and at the same time received the remaining part Luluai, there was no dispute about his possession until about a week ago when a man disputed with him, but it was a matter of no consequence. A little thing not affecting the claimant's title.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaulaikukui, Olowalu by the land of Paakai, Makai by the land of Moakaka, Kaanapali by Keawe's land. (v. 7/120-121)

6061 Hanemo June 8 1849

Kaa sworn. I know the land of the claimant, they are in "Puuwa 1", Lahaina, and consisting of two Ili in one piece. One Ili is called "Paopua" and the other "Koheelule". The Lord of this is J. Kaeo, and he likewise has two section of Kalo land one of 3 Lois and one of one Loi. Namauu who is dead with the late Lord of this last land, which is "Puunoa 3" and a House lot adjoining. And he has also a section of Kalo land in "Moalii".

The claimant received the land in Puunoa 1 from his father Keliiau in 1838.

The land in Puunoa 3 he has had undisputed possession of them until this day.

The land in Moalii he had from Luluai in the days of Hoapili and he has had his possession lately confirmed by the new Konohiki who is Keawe.

The Kula land in Puunoa 1 bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni or Kaeo's land, Olowalu by Kaeo's land, Makai by the main road of that region, Kaanapali by Uaua's land.

The second piece in Puunoa is bounded Mauka by "Alemiki", Olowalu by Uaua's land, Makai by the Govt road, Kaanapali by "Alenuhi."

There is another piece in Puunoa 1 which is bounded Mauka by "Alamiki", Olowalu by Nauaiki's land, Makai by Kaeo's land, Kaanapali by the school teacher's land.

There is also a section of Kalo land in Puunoa 1 which is bounded Mauka by Uaua's land, Olowalu by the Pali of "Puunau", Makai by Kami's land, Kaanapali by Kaenaene's land.

The first piece of Kula in Puunoa 3 is bounded Mauka by Kaananui's land, Olowalu by Namanu's land, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by Kaahanui's land.

The second piece of Kula in Puunoa 3 is bounded Mauka by Namauu's land, Olowalu by the school house yard, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by Kanemo's land in Puunoa 1.

The House lot in Puunoa 3 is bounded Mauka by Namauu's yard, Olowalu by Kamaka's, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Poopuaa's land.

The Kalo land in Puunoa 3 is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by the creek of Kahoma, Makai Hanapilo's land, Kaanapali by Namuu's land.

There is still another piece of Kalo land which is bounded Mauka by "Puako", Olowalu by the Poalima lois of Namauu, Makai by the lois of Poopuaa, Kaanapali by Hanapilo's land.

There are eight pieces in all with a piece in Moalii which is bounded Mauka by Kaai's land, Olowalu by Keawe's land, Makai by Kamanowai's land, Kaanapali by the same. (v. 7/121-122)

4663 Puu (Napu) (see page 101) June 8 1849

The claim is the same persona and the land is the same already heard under No. 6403 Puu is the proper name. (v. 7/122)

6430 J. Kahula (Wahahula)

Puu sworn. The claimant's land is 4 House lot in Lahaina, heard by Mr. Richards, beside these are the two Ili's in Paunau, just mauka of the Seaman's Chapel. The House lot from a portion of these ilis. The names of these Ilis are Lihuee, and Kuaimanini.

The two Ilis lie together are bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Kaohie's, and the land of Paunau belonging to the Konohiki, Makai by the Poalima land, Kaanapali by Kamanawai's land.

There is one Poalima lois within this land.

The claimant received this land from th Kahu of Kaahumanu by the name of Makalawelawe in the days of King Kamehameha and has held undisputed possession ever since. (v. 7/122-123)

5621 Keawekolohe June 8 1849

Kaohie sworn. The land of the claimant consist of a section of land, with his partly in the 3 Ahupuaas of "Kilolani", and "Paunau" and "Puako". It is Kula and Kalo land all in one piece.

I gave him the part in Kilolani in 1846 and at the same time he begged the other parts. The claimant goes to the Poalima work of Kilolani.

I am the Lord of Kilolani, Ukiki had the land, she gave the claimant from Mahoe before 1839. The claimant's title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by J. Kapena's yard, Olowalu by Haleole's land, and "Halue", Makai by "Halue" and my land, Kaanapali by the land of Liki. (v. 7/123)

10125 Maikai

The claimant is a woman living with Kekuanaoa at Oahu.

Kauai sworn. I am the mother of the claimant and know her land. It is a House lot in "Puou", Lahaina, and a section of Kalo land mauka loa, 20 Lois.

The claimant got it from her father, who had it in the days of Kamehameha 1 and held it in peace up to 1838 or there about and then transferred it the claimant who has held it ever since without dispute.

The House lot and 2 Loies is bounded Mauka by the yard of Beke or Antonia, Olowalu by the road leading to Lahainaluna, Makai by the yard of Kaiewa, Kaanapali by "Kapauakua" or Antinio's land.

The second piece is 20 Loies is bounded Mauka by Kala's loies, Olowalu by Kaupena's land, Makai by Kahoma creek, Kaanapali by Kaupena's loies.

I forgot there is one other Loi which is bounded Mauka by Mahoe's loi, Olowalu by Timokeo's loi, Makai by the yard of Kaupena, Kaanapali by the road to Lahainaluna. (v. 7/123-124)

6428 L. P. Kaumaea June 8, 1849

This is a claim for the same land claimed by Napuupahoehoe in Cl. 2652 which was heard yesterday.

Keawekane sworn. I know the land in dispute between my son in law Kaumaea and Napuupahoehoe.

Nawaa gave this land to Puipui in the days of Kaahumanu just after Liholiho's death. I am the widow of Puipui, and heard Nawaa give him all his lands in Puehuehu.

But Napuupahoehoe has held this land by himself and other from 1831. Puipui's House stood on this land. It has been a kind of staying place with him, when he came here from Wailuku where he resides.

Puipui gave this lot to the claimant Kaumaea. I never heard it for a great many years.

This land was Nawaa's and when he died in 1845, I went at the request of my husband to this lot to buy the fishing apparatus of Nawaa's widow and some other things. But Nawaa's widow, who is now dead, told me she could not sell these things as all of Nawaa's possession belonged to Puipui.

Napuupahoehoe has not permanently resided on this lot but being a friend of Nawaa's he has for many years been in the habit of coming here from Wailuku in his canoe, landing there and making this lot a stopping place. Since Nawaa's death the lot has been in the possession of Puipui's people.

Makaele sworn. I know this lot and have for many years, I lived on this lot with Nawaa. When he died I suppose the lot fell to his wife and when she died it went to Puipui the Konohiki. This is the natural course of things, Nawaa having no heirs. The name of Nawaa's widow was

Nanauula. Puipui helped to bury Nawaa and his widow. The testimony given by Kaimokane is correct.

Kalehoula sworn. I am the father in law of the claimant and have lived on this lot for 2 years. Namuula the wido of Nawaa told me before she died that after her death all this lot was to go to Puipui who has since given it to the claimant.

Lipi sworn. I live near this lot and have from the days of Kamehameha 1. The claimant Napuupahoehoe furnished the means to Nawaa to enclose this lot with a fence and I heard Nawaa say the land was to be his. When he has come to town with his food he has always made this a stopping place. (v. 7/124-125)

5904 Polea June 8 1849

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They consist of 7 Lois and 6 Moos of Kula in one piece in "Moalii", Lahaina, and 18 Lois in one piece in "Honokowai", one piece of Kula and Kalo land in "Waiehu" it is an Ili called "Paueue."

He received this lands from Hoapili wahine in 1837 and he has held them in peace ever since.

The piece in "Moalii" is bounded Mauka by the King's the Poalima, Olowalu by "Alamiki", Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by the King's the Poalima, there is one Poalima loi within this.

Keawe sworn. I know the land of the claimant at "Honokowai". It is in the Ili of "Naunaunakahelawai". It is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaleikini, this is the Poalima land, Olowalu by the creek of Honokowai, Makai by the land of Kini, North by the Pali.

Keaweluaole recalled he forgot to mention that the claimant has a House lot in Lahaina in Puako. It is on the canal just makai of George Shaw's lot.

The claimant received it from Hoapili in 1823 and I have heard but I only know that he lived there in 1833. He has held the same from that time to this without dispute. He now rents it to Kanaian for 12 dollars per month.

It is bounded Mauka by George Shaw's land, Olowalu by the lot of Kanaina, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the Lahaina canal. (v. 7/125-126) See page 12-15

7711 John H. Kaiheekai 8 June 1849

The claimant offered in evidence a paper showing that at the recent division of lands with the King he was permanently confirmed in his possession and ownership of the Ahupuaa of

“Puahoowali” in Lahaina. There are only three men living on this land. Their names are Kuailipi and Lono and \_\_\_.

The name of the land given to the King by the claimant is “Polapola” in Kipahulu. (v. 7/126)

10579 Opunui

Nalehu sworn. The claimant’s land is in “Kuholilia”, Lahaina. It consists of one section of Kalo land.

The claimant received this land from Kalaikoa in 1838 and he has held it in peace ever since. There is one Poalima Loi in this section belonging to Kanaina.

It is bounded Mauka by Elemakule’s loi, Olowalu by the creek of Kahoma, Makai by Poholopu’s land, Kaanapali by the high Pali. (v. 7/126)

10431 Nipoa Juen 8 1849

Kanalu sworn. I know the land of the claimant, they are in “Kuholilea”, Lahaina. They consist of 2 pieces one a Kula land and one a Kalo and Kula land, there are 19 Lois.

The claimant received it from Kanaina the Luna of Kuholilea in 1841 and has held it ever since in peace.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by the high Pali, Olowalu by “Kukua”, Makai by the Pali, Kaanapali by the same Pali. It is the Pali of “Kauhilua”.

The other piece is bounded Mauka by Napahi’s loi, Olowalu by “Puuhi’s” land and “Puunoa”, Makai by “Puako”, Kaanapali by the Pali. (v. 7/127)

4267 Kaanaana Probably same as c. 9812

Manu sworn.. The claimant’s land included in this claim proved before Mr. Richards.

Note No Testimony on records of Native Book in R. office. (v. 7/127)

6495 Kawakamano

Mua sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. It is in two pieces, one of Kalo and the other of Kula land in "Pahoa", Lahaina.

The claimant received it from Namauu now dead, in the year 1844 and has possessed it in peace up to the present time.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by the kula of Kuopua, Olowalu by my land, Makai by the Govt road, Kaanapali by the Poalima of Namauu's heirs.

The other piece is Kula and Kalo land, it is bounded Mauka by Piikoi's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by the creek of Pahoa. (v. 7/127)

10568 Oleloa W.

Napapai sworn. I know a part of claimant's land, those which I know are in "Puuanu akahi". It consists of two pieces one a Kula land and the other a Kula and Kalo land.

The claimant received this land from the King in 1837 and her rights have never been disputed.

The Kula land is bounded Mauka by Ohule's land, Olowalu by the Poalima of Kapu, Makai by Ohule's, Kaanapali by the creek of "Polaiki".

The Kalo and Kula land is bounded Mauka by Ohule's land, Olowalu by the creek of Pahoa, Makai by Puunau ehea, Kaanapali by Kunewa's land.

The claimant produced in evidence a paper showing that at the recent division in there was given to her by the King an Ahupuaa of land in Kipahulu, Maui, called "Kakanoni" (see the Book in Mr. Young's Office.) See 166 p v. 10 (v. 7/127-128)

6528 Kakuole June 8 1849

Kainokane sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Polanui", Lahaina. They consist of a House lot and Kula in one piece, one piece of 7 Lois, and 2 Lois in another, and 2 pieces of one Loi each.

The claimant received these lands from Makaulia in 1840 and his title to them has never been disputed.

The House lot and Kula land is bounded Mauka by the creek of Polanui, Olowalu by the Poalima Lois of Makaulia, Makai by the Kula of Kaoao, Kaanapali by "Puehuehuiki."



The piece of 7 Lois is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by Manomani's land, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the Poalima of Makaulia.

The piece of 2 Lois is bounded Mauka by the Poalima, Olowalu by Kamokulahaole's land, Makai by Kaeo's land, Kaanapali by the Poalima.

The next piece of one Loi is bounded Mauka by Kaoao's land, Makai, Olowalu and Kaanapali sides by Kaoao's land.

The last piece is bounded on all sides by Keano's land, this last piece of one Loi was taken away by Makaulia in 1847. (v. 7/128)

6760 Hanalei B. June 8 1849

Lelehu sworn. I know the lands of Hanalei in "Moalii", Lahaina. They are in three pieces, one a House lot, one a Kalo land of 8 Lois and one a Kula land.

The claimant received these lands from a son of the land Puki by name in 1831. His parents had the land time out of mind. His title has never been disputed.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Govt road, Olowalu by the pond of Victoria, Makai by the sea, Kaanapali by the Konohiki's land.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki's land, Olowalu by "Mokaki", Makai by my land, Kaanapali by "Kapahuiki" named of ili.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by "Moalii", Makai by "Polea", Kaanapali by the Konohiki's land. (v. 7/129)

4760 A. Lelehu

Hanalei sworn. I know the land of Lelehu is "Moalii", Lahaina, they are 7 Lois and one Kula in one piece. The claimant received it from Hoapili wahine before 1839 and has held them without dispute ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by the creek of Moalii, Olowalu by the same, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Keawe's land. (v. 7/129)

10534 Nailiili

Kumaeo sworn. I know the land of the claimant, in "Puako", Lahaina. They consists of a House lot and 6 Lois and a piece of Kula land, all in one piece.

The claimant received them from Kawaa the Luna in the days of Hoapili before 1839 and has held them without dispute, but Kawaa who is his foster father owns two of the Lois and 3 of the Moo's.

It is bounded Mauka by the kula of "Paunau", Olowalu by Kuokoa's land, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by Pelupelu's land. See p. 365 v. 15 (v. 7/129-130)

9950 Leleku June 8 1849

Kuumiumi sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Puunoa" 2, and a Kula and Kalo land in "Puako" both in Lahaina.

The claimant received in Puunoa from Mahune in the year 1831. The claimant received the land in Puako from Kuokoa the Konohiki in 1840. He has held them without dispute to the present time.

The land in Puunoa consists of 21 Lois and is bounded Mauka by Puuiki, Olowalu by the creek of Kahoma, Makai by the Poalima of the Konohiki, Kaanapali by Kuholilea.

The other piece in "Puako" is bounded Mauka by Paunau 2, Olowalu by the creek of Kahoma, Makai by the lois of Kaeo, Kaanapali by "Kuholilea". (v. 7/130)

10532 Naolulo

Moakaka W. sworn. I know the land of the claimant is 11 Moos of land in one piece. There are no Lois.

The claimant received this land from his father Mahuka in the days of Hoapili and he has undisputed possession ever since, but Huueo 3 Moos of Poalima in the middle of this piece.

It is bounded Mauka by Kahinalua's land, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Govt road, Kaanapali by "Kauaula" 2. (v. 7/130)

6551 Hikiau Lahaina June 9 1849

This is a claim for an Ahupuaa of land called "Kaupohulua" in Namakualoa, Maui.

This was given to the claimant by His Majesty at the recent division of Lands (see the Book in Mr. Young's Office).

Her gave to the land "Lapaka" and "Kou" in the place of it. (v. 7/130)

4592 Hikiau See page 326 for 23

This claim was heard by Mr. Richards. No record of answer. (v. 7/131)

6478 Kapololu June 9, 1849

Hikiau sworn. I know this House lot of the claimant. It is in "Lapakea", Lahaina. The claimant received this House lot from me and Kamakini in 1831. I gave him half of this lot and Kamakini the other half. The lot is fenced and the fence is the correct bounding. The claimant's title has never been disputed from that time down to the present.

It is bounded Mauka by the Paahao lois, Olowalu by the road leading Lahainaluna, Makai by the land of Kuakamauna, Kaanapali by the yard of Uahue. (v. 7/131)

8466 Kapapa

Kaleleiki sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. It is in Puako, Lahaina. It is one House lot.

The claimant received this House lot from Kekauonohi or His Majesty in 1847 and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Judge Parsons of D. Malo's lot, Olowalu by "Waineeiki", Makai by the Govt road leading to Olowalu, Kaanapali by my land. (v. 7/131)

3474 Kaniau A district Judge at Hamakua

Kaki sworn. I know the land here claimed. It is in "Kamani", Lahaina. It is one piece consisting of Kalo and Kula land.

The claimant received this land from Kaoo in 1837 and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by the lot of Mahina, Olowalu by "Polanui", Makai by the lot of Kaoo, Kaanapali by the land of David Malo.

There is a land in Molokai included in this claim but the claimants witness are on that Island. (v. 7/131-132)

505 Moehaona June 9 1849

This claim was heard in the days of Mr. Richards. So says the claimant's Husband. See 356 cl. (v. 7/132)

7779 Kaleleiki

This is a claim for the Ahupuaa of "Kupaiaiki" in Molokai. This he had from the King at the recent division of lands. For the balance of this he has no witness present. See page 244. (v. 7/132)

10667 Part 1 Pikanele (See cl. 7777) Page 170

Kauhiwahine sworn. I know this land. It is an ili of land in "Waihee", near Wailuku, the name of the Ili is "Kapoho".

The claimant had this land from Hoapile kane and now holds it under Kekuanaoa, paying him therefore the sum of 5 dollars per year and if he does not pay him the five dollars yearly then his title will be pau. But he has two fish ponds in this, that belong to Pikanele alone.

The two fish ponds lie together and are bounded Mauka by the Poalima fish ponds, Olowalu by Kimoeko's land the head man of Kekuanaoa, Makai by the Govt lois, North by Mileka's land. See p. 97 v 15 (v. 7/132)

10667 Part 2 Pikanele

Kauhiwahine sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Helawea", Lahaina, 6 Lois in one piece up mauka, 8 Lois in another piece makai. He received these land from Kekuanaoa in 1840 and he has held them without dispute ever since. He likewise has 2 pieces of Poalima Lois each of 3 Lois which he holds under Kekuanaoa paying him therefore the sum of 15 dollars per years.

The piece of 6 Lois up Mauka that belongs to Pikanele truly is bounded Mauka by the Pali, Olowalu by the same, and the kula of Kanaina, Makai by Keaweluaole's land, Kaanapali by the creek of "Kelaweae".

The piece of 8 Lois makai is bounded Mauka by Kalaikini's land, Olowalu by the land occupied by Keaweluaole, Makai by the lot of Kualike, Kaanapali by the creek of Kelaweae.

The land of the claimant in Waianae, Lahaina consists of 3 pieces. The first piece up mauka loa has 6 Lois. The second piece up mauka contains 5 Lois. The third piece down makai contains 2 Lois.

The claimant had this land from Kaaimulolo, Kaeo's mother in 1834 and he has held them in peace ever since.

The piece of 6 Lois up mauka loa is bounded Mauka by Kauwa's land, Olowalu by Palani's land, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the Pali of Waianae.

The second piece of 5 Lois is bounded Mauka by Naulu's lot, Olowalu by "Waianae iki", Makai by the King's land, Kaanapali by "Kulahuhu".

The 3<sup>rd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Kaihukai's land, Olowalu by "Puako" and Kaihukai's land, Makai by "Puako", Kaanapali by Kaihukai's land.

The lands of the claimant in Bolabola were heard in the time of Mr. Richards.

His lands in "Pahoa" Lahaina consists of 2 pieces of Kalo land one piece of Kula land.

One piece of Kalo land contains of 7 Lois, the other piece has 5 Lois. The claimant received these lands from Maele the Luna in 1840. His title to the Kalo lands has never been disputed. But Nalehu has disputed the title to the Kula. When Maele died in Feb. 1845, her brother Nalehu took this Kula from him and gave it to Mua. Mua and three others living on the land have put in their claims for the Kula which have been heard. The land was taken from him for some cause known to me, perhaps because Maele died.

The piece of Kalo land of 7 Lois is bounded Mauka by Upine's land, Olowalu by Nalehu's land, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

The piece of 5 Lois is bounded Mauka by the high Pali, Olowalu by Nalehu's land, Makai by Nalehu's kula, Kaanapali by the creek and the Pali.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by Kapu's title village, Olowalu by Keohokalole's lois, Makai by the Govt road, Kaanapali by the land of the heirs of Namauu.

Nalehu sworn. I am the brother of Naele now dead. This Kula land in dispute between Pikanele and Moku and others was the property of Moku and others before Naele gave it to Pikanele. Consequently it was their land, and Naele had no right to give it away. She might give away Poalima land, but not the land of the tenants. It was very wrong for her to dispose of this land and consequently it was restored to them. (v. 7/132-134)

3542 Kalua June 9 1849

The claimant presented his paper showing his title to the Ahupuaa of "Kekena" in Puna, Hawaii. He received it from the King at the recent division of Lands (See Book in Mr. Young's Office).

Umi sworn. The claimants lands in "Puehuehunui", Lahaina 18 Lois and one Kula in one piece.

The claimant received this lands from the Konohiki Kahehuna in 1844 and he has held them without dispute up to the present day.

It is bounded Mauka by the King's Poalima, Olowalu by Makaiole's land, Makai by Oo's land, Kaanapali by my land.

Kauhapa sworn. I know the land of the claimant has a Kula land in the Ahupuaa of "Honopau", Hamakualoa, Maui, it is one piece.

The claimant received this land from Kekauonohi in 1846 and he has held the same without dispute up to the present day.

It is bounded Mauka and Makai and Haiku sides by the land of the Government, on the other side by the creek of "Hoolawa".

Kaleleiki sworn. I know the House lot of Kalua in "Puako", Lahaina.

The claimant went to live there under Kekauonohi in 1843 and has lived there until the present time. In February 1848 Kekauonohi and Keliiahonui divided this lot into two halves and gave him the Makai half to hold to him and his heirs forever. I was a witness to this agreement and so was Joshua Haeo and Momona.

It is bounded Mauka by Kekauonohi's half, Olowalu by the street dividing it from David Malo's lot where Judge Parsons lives, Makai by the street, Kaanapali by my land and Weanea's lot.

The claimant has a House lot in "Waineeiki" which was given to him as I have heard about 5 years since by the King, and he has held it without dispute ever since. He holds it under the King but not to him and his heirs forever, but during the pleasure of the King. The claimant presented a writing under the hand of the King to this effect.

It is bounded Mauka by the land belonging to the heirs of Kaaimalolo, Olowalu by Lot's lot, Makai by the street, Kaanapali by David Malo's lot. (v. 7/134-135)

11086 Kaiheekai June 9 1849

Alu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant in "Kauakaoo", Lahaina. It consists of one piece of Kalo land uika loa, and one piece of Kalo land Makai, and one piece of 4 Moos of Kula also Makai. Lot is the Lord of this land.

The claimant received this land from his father Holulu in 1844, who had it from the days of Kamehameha 1. He has held undisputed possession to the present day.

The piece of 9 Lois up mauka is bounded Mauka by Paaha's lois, Olowalu by the creek, Makai by Uilama's lois, Kaanapali by the Pali of Paunau.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Kalo land is bounded Mauka by Kahele's land, Olowalu by the Poalima land, Makai by Uilama's and Paaku's land, Kaanapali by Pupuka's land.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by Pitman's land, Olowalu by "Kalimaohe", Makai by the King's land "Kainehe", Kaanapali by "Puunui".

There is one Loi more to which his title is the same in "Puahoowali", Lahaina. It is bounded Mauka by the Lono's lot, Olowalu by Puaheowali, Makai by "Paunau", Kaanapali by the Govt road leading mauka. (v. 7/135-136)

3049 Kaluaokamano June 9 1849

Kualike sworn. I know the lands of the claimant in Puahoowali, Lahaina. It consist of one Kalo land of 2 Lois, one House lot and Kula land and one Loi in Kelawea, Lahaina.

The claimant received this land from me, his father, in the days of Hoapili. He has held the land without dispute except the one Loi in Kelawea, which Pekanele took away from him in 1847 without any other cause then this that Loi was an old man and exempted by law from going to Poalima work.

The lot of 2 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kaiheekai's land, Olowalu by "Puahoowali 2", Makai by Lono's lot, Kaanapali by the Govt road.

The House lot and Kula is bounded Mauka by "Puako", Olowalu by "Puahoowali", Makai by Kaihakai's land, Kaanapali by the Govt road.

The Loi in Kelawea is bounded on all sides by Pikanele's lois.

Liu sworn. I know the loi in dispute between Kaluaokamano and Pikanele. This loi was given to the claimant's father by Pikanele and taken away recently because the claimant's father who had it charge was old and did not go to the Poalima work. (v. 7/136)

603 W. T. Hoonaulu fr. P. 188 vol. II Lahaina June 17 1849

The claimant appeared and made oath that he had put in a claim for a House lot in Lahaina which was partly heard at Oahu. That there is a counter claim for the lot named Kauai and that he had witness here at Lahaina that he desired should be heard.

The wife of the counter claimant appeared to represent her husband whom she stated to be sick unable to attend. The Commission there proceeded to hear the witnesses on both sides.

Kahula sworn for Hoonaulu. I know the Lot in dispute-it is in "Puako", Lahaina nei. The claimant received this lot from Keaweahoulu in the year 1840. Keaweahoulu received it from his brother Kauai, but I don't know that he did. Hoonaulu has lived on the lot ever since 1840 and Kauai has lived in the Fort.

Hoonaulu has built upon fenced and improved the lot and his family now live there.

It is bounded Mauka by H.S. Swinton's lot, Olowalu by Nu's lot, Makai by H.S. Swinton's lot, Kaanapali by the same.

Hinau sworn for Hoonaulu.

I know the House lot in dispute. In ancient times on the days of Hoopili in 1837, this lot belonged to Kauai, Keaweahuulu and Kauai lived there together as brothers, and I lived with them. Kauai, when he went to live in the Fort gave this lot to Keaweahoulu, so Keaweahoulu told me. This was in the last days of Hoapili. Hoonaulu has lived on this lot nine years and never heard his title to it questioned until the year 1847 when Kauai rose up and disputed it. In 1847 Keaweahoulu gave Hoonaulu a paper embodying their former agreement to which paper I was a witness. The paper was produced.

Kapapa sworn for Hoonaulu. I know the lot in dispute. Hoonaulu went to live this lot and occupied it in peace up to 1847 when it was the first disputed.

Henry S. Swinton sworn for Hoonaulu. I know the House lot in dispute. The claimant Hoonaulu I always heard desired his title to this lot from Keaweahoulu. He has lived there ever since. I have been in Lahaina now 5 years. I never heard his title disputed until 1847. He has built upon



and improved the lot and I gave him a small piece out of my lot so as to give him a passage way into his lot from the street. I never heard Kauai say this lot belonged to Hoonaulu but I have heard Keaweahoulu say that the lot was his once and that he had given it to Hoonaulu, because he had taken care of him when sick.

Pikanele sworn for Kauai. I know the lot in dispute. I have known the lot ever since 1824. It was then occupied by Kauai. Keaweahoulu his brother went there to live with him when the King first came to Lahaina to live before 1836, about 1836. Kauai went to live in the Fort and Keaweahoulu continued to live there. Keaweahoulu told me that he had not given this lot to Hoonaulu. But Hoonaulu has built upon and improved it. I don't remember when he first went there to live.

Kalaikini sworn for Kauai. This lot is well known to me for I lived a neighbor to it for some years, this lot in olden times belonged to Kauai and he had a stick fence around it. Keaweahoulu lived there afterwards. Hoonaulu went to live there some years ago and built a large house on it, fenced the same and made it valuable. I did not hear Hoonaulu's title disputed until 1847.

Kapuhi sworn for Kauai. I know the lot in dispute. It was occupied by Kauai from 1824 to the time he went to live in the Fort. (v. 7/136-138)

11025 George Shaw June 17 1849

Kuheleloa sworn. I know the lot here claimed. It is in "Puako", Lahaina.

The claimant received it from Piho through his wife, Maunahina, in 1844. Piho received this lot from Hoapili in ancient times and lived there until 1842. When Kekauluohi took it away from him and it is now in the possession of Kanaina who claimed it at the present time. Hoapili and Piho built the house on this lot for Piho. When Piho died he left this lot to Maunahina his daughter and the wife of the claimant. I don't know why Kekauluohi took away this lot.

Pikanele sworn. Piho received this lot from Hoapili Kane, because he married Hoapili's wife. Hoapili and Piho built the house together and Hoapili owned half of the house and Piho the other half and the ground on which half the house now stands. If Hoapili used upper part to store things, then Piho used the lower part and vice versa. The ground was never formerly divided, and I cannot tell which half belongs to Hoapili and which to the heir of Piho.

Piho lived there in peace until 1842, 1842 when Kekauluohi drove him from the lot and Kanaina her husband now holds it. I know of no reason for Kekauluohi driving him from this lot except that she desired it.

It is bounded on all sides by the land in the possession of Mr. Boller and said to be owned by Kanaina. (v. 7/138-139)

10427 Naea June 17 1849

Kapuhi sworn. I know the lands of the claimant all except his House lot in Wailuku he has one Lot in "Kamani", Olowalu, one lot in "Makila", Lahaina, one House lot in "Kahana", Kaanapali and one House lot in "Kuhua", Lahaina.

He received the lot in Kamani, Olowalu from blind Kaeo in 1843 and he has held it without dispute to the present day. Kaeo received it from his mother Kaaimalolo.

The claimant received the lot in Makila, Lahaina from Nahienaena the King's sister about 1830 and he has held it without dispute to the present day.

He received the House lot in "Pakala" from Pikau in 1846 and he has held it in peace ever since. Pilau lived on the lot from the days of Nahienaena until he gave it to the claimant.

The lot in Kahana, Kaanapali he received from Kuuku in 1829 and his title has never been questioned.

The House lot in Kuhua, Lahaina, he received from Kalaimoku wahine about 1841 and his title to this lot has never been disputed. Kalaimoku received it from her grandfather Heulu in my ancient times.

The lot at Kamani, Olowalu is bounded Mauka by "Kolea", Hana side by Ukumehame, Makai by the sea shore, Lahaina by Kailiula's lot.

The lot in "Makila" is bounded Mauka by the Govt road leading to Olowalu, Olowalu by the creek of Makila, Makai by Wailehua, Kaanapali by the land of Pali "Kahealepo."

The lot in Pakala is bounded Mauka by Kaeipaihala's lot, Olowalu by Mokupinia's lot, Makai by the main street of Lahaina, Kaanapali by the King's lot.

The lot in Kaanapali is bounded Mauka by Paki's land, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Govt road, Kaanapali by Kanaina's land.

The House lot in Kuhua is bounded Mauka by the King's Poalima land, Olowalu by "Kuhua nui", Makai by the King's Poalima, Kaanapali by Kukailuki's lot. (v. 7/139-140)

488 B. Kaai June 17 1849

Umiumi sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Paunau", Lahaina. It is an ili of land called "Pilani".

The claimant received this land from Keaho in the days of Kamehameha 1 and Keaho had it from Kaahumanu. He has ever possessed it in peace.

It is bounded Mauka by Kuaimanini's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by Keaipuaa's lot, Kaanapali by Keaweheaole's land. (v. 7/140)

3050 Kaiawa

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the land of the claimant. It is a House lot in "Puoa", Lahaina.

The claimant received this from Kalaikoa in 1833 and lived there in peace until 1846 when J. Kaeo took the lot from him. Kaeo took this on the ground that it belonged to him as the heir of Kalaikoa. It is now occupied by Kaupuna. Kaeo has put in a claim for this which is said to have been heard by Kaeo. The claimant fenced this lot.

It is bounded Mauka by Maikai's lot, Olowalu by the Govt road, Makai by the Catholic Church yard, Kaanapali by the yard of "Wahinehuli".

Kamana sworn. I know the land of Kaiawa in "Kapeuakua", Lahaina. It consists of 3 pieces comprising in all 7 Lois, one has 4 another 2 and the last one Loi.

He has also a small burial place in Paunau, where rests the bones of his father and friends. He received this from Halaikoa, J. Kaeo's father in 1831 and has buried his friends there in peace ever since.

He received the Kalo land in "Kapeioakua" from Kainana his brother in law in the olden days of Hoapili and his title has never been disputed.

The piece of Kalo land which has 2 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kaehukulani's land, Olowalu by Kamiki's lois, Makai by the Poalima loi of Beke, Kaanapali by Kaimiki's lois.

The piece of 4 Lois is bounded Mauka and Olowalu by "Paunau", Makai and Kaanapali by Kamiki's land.

The piece of 1 Loi is bounded Mauka by the Poalima of Keke, Olowalu by Mahoe's land, Makai and Kaanapali by the Poalima of Beke.

The title Burial place is bounded Mauka by the creek of Paunau, Olowalu by the road leading to Lahainaluna, Makai by a pig pen of old standing, Kaanapali by Kaawa's lot. (See p. 16 v. 15)(v. 7/140-141)

2524 A. Moku June 17 1849

The claimant appeared and said the land referred to in this claim had been included in his other claims already heard. (v. 7/141)

465 Hihio See 4602, 6781, 8135

This is a claim for a House lot in dispute with Kaeo and has already been heard under another number. 8135 (v. 7/141)

475 Mu and Paahana

Ihihi sworn. I know the House lot of the claimants. It is in "Paako", Lahaina ina nui.

The claimants received this land from two persons and each owner one half of the lot which is divided. Mu received his half from his brother Nahaloaa. Paahana received his half from Pikao. They received their rights at the same time in 1823 and they have possessed it in peace ever since.

Mu's half is bounded Mauka by Kanaina's lot, Olowalu by Paahana's half, Makai by the main street of Lahaina, Kaanapali by Kawai's or Hoonaulu's lot.

Paahana's half, Mauka by Kanaina's lot, Olowalu by Kaleipaihala's lot, Makai by the road, Kaanapali by Mu's half.

My has another piece of Kalo land of 15 Lois in "Halue", Lahaina.

He received it from Upai in the days of Nahienaena before 1836 and his title to it has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by the creek of Hauaula, Olowalu by the same, Makai by "Haleu", Kaanapali by the pali of "Makila".

Paahana has a section of Kalo land in Olowalu, called "Kekio". He received it from A. Moku in 1833 and has possessed it in peace to this day.

It is bounded Mauka by "Kukui", Hana by the same, Makai by the old Govt road, Kaanapali by Pikao's lot and Poalima land. (v. 7/141-142)

6546 W.L. Hoonaulu

This is a claim for an Ahupuaa of land in Molokai called "Manawai". The claimant produced his paper showing that this land was given to him by the King at the recent division of lands he conferring upon the King his land at Oahu called "Malamalama" (see Book in Mr. Young's Office.). (v. 7/142)

4600 W.L. Hoonaulu

This claim is identical with Cl. 6546 (above). (v. 7/142)

2686 Oleloa

Par of this claim has already been heard under another number. But there remains a House lot.

A. Moku sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant, it is in "Paunau 1", Lahaina.

She received it from her husband in 1837 but they both lived there long before that time, her husband has died.

She occupied it in peace up to 1845 when Kapu the Konohiki took away the land. But the claimant still lives there, the King is the Lord of the land, and has never removed the claimant.

It is bounded Mauka by the Great Government road leading to Olowalu, Olowalu by "Paunau 2", Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by "Polaiki 2". (v. 7/143)

392 B. Ninia

Holouhee sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant. It is in "Waianae", Lahaina.

He received it from Kanele in 1845, Kanele had it from Kaeo the blind man, who had it from his mother Kaaimalolo in ancient times. His title has been recently disputed by Kaiheekai, who has received the land of Waianae at the recent division. He disputed it as being Poalima land.

The House lot and Lois is bounded Mauka by Umi's Lois, Olowalu by "Waianae 2", Makai by the yard of the Little Meeting house, Kaanapali by "Kilolani", Kaohie's land.

Kaiheekai appeared and said that he disputed this title on behalf of the King, because Kaaimalolo gave all his rights in "Waianae" to the King and therefore Kaeo had no right to give the land away. (See the King). (v. 7/143)

4911 Kapeahi

Kake sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Puaaiki". It consist of 7 Lois of Kalo in one piece up Mauka and one House lot and 4 Lois in one piece Makai.

The claimant received it from Kaaimalolo the Chiefess about 1842 or 1843 and she held it in peace up to 20<sup>th</sup> March in 1849 and then Kaeo the blind man took away because he saw it. I know of no other reason.

The piece up Mauka is bounded Mauka and Olowalu and Makai sides by "Puaanui", Kaanapali by "Waineenui."

The Makai piece is bounded Mauka by Maluai's lot, Olowalu by "Puaanui", Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by Manono's lot.

Nahau appeared and said that she represented Kaeo as a counter claimant and offered as a witness.

Mauae W. who was sworn. I know the land in dispute Kaeo turned the claimant off this land because when he came up here in March last he found no food on the land. He took it away the very day Kaeahi sailed for the Coast. He gave it to Maluae. (v. 7/143-144)

3116 Wahineahuli and Kamai (Brother and Sister)

(See counter claim of Keliipio No. 477 f)

Kaiawa sworn. I know the House lot of the claimants. The claimants received this lot from Kalaihea, J. Kaeo's father, when the Fort at Lahaina was built (about 1831). They have had undisturbed possession of it ever since. There is one Loi in the lot, It is in "Puou", Lahaina.

It is bounded Mauka by Makai's lot, Olowalu by my land, Makai by the Catholic Church, Kaanapali by Mr. Butler's lot.

Aha sworn. I know the land of the claimants up Mauka. It consists of 7 Lois in one piece.

The claimant received it from Kaleikoa in 1833 and had undisputed possession of it up to 1844 when Hanemo the Luna under Kaeo who is Lord of the land took it away because the claimant was a soldier. He went to the Poalima however.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Keawe, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by Unele's land, Kaanapali by Kuholilea. (v. 7/144-145)

8849 Kukaeliki Coles (Mr. Wm. Coles)

Piianaia sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. It is a House lot and garden and a piece of Kalo land of 6 Lois one of which is dry.

The claimant received this land from Naea in 1838 through her father Kaiwi. She has held them without dispute ever since.

The House lot and garden is bounded Mauka by Kueholilea, Olowalu by the land "Kupunui", land of Kipa, Makai by Kimo's land, Kaanapali by Puuki.

The piece of 6 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kuholilea, Olowalu by "Kuhuanui", Makai by Kimo's land, Kaanapali by "Puuiki".

Claimant says she has another House lot in Lahaina. See pg. 176 (v. 7/145)

486 Ku W. See p 198

Kamaka sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are in "Puuuoa", Lahaina. They consist of one House lot Makai, one piece of Kula down here also, and one piece of Kalo land of 30 small Lois.

The claimant received it from her father Panelaau and he had from Namauu in 1833 or about there, and her title has never been disputed except to about one third of the House lot which was taken away by Hanemo the Konohiki in 1843. Why he did so I cannot tell, I never heard of any reason given.

The section of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by Pilo's and Puha's land, Olowalu by the creek of Puunoa, Makai by the creek, Kaanapali by "Kuholilea".

The Kula is bounded Mauka by "Hanakaoo", Olowalu by the same, Makai by "Kainehe", Namauu's Poalima, and Hanemo, Kaanapali by "Puunoa 2".

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Olowalu by Namauu's lot, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the yard of Maluae. (v. 7/145)

503 Kainokane

The claimant appeared and said this claim had been heard a few days since under another Number. (v. 7/146)

3730 Bollae See No. 1310 Lahaina June 12<sup>th</sup> 1849

The claimant appeared and said he had put in a claim for his House lot in Lahaina at the same time that he put in his other claims but it had not been called. Search was made among.

The Lahaina Claims but no such claim was found.

L. Kaauoa stated that he distinctly remembered receiving such a claim at Oahu whereupon the Commission proceeded to have testimony thereon.

Kaaua sworn I know the House lot Hae in Aki, Lahaina.

The claimant received this lot from Kaenaena the Luna of "Aki" in 1841. He had held it in undisputed possession up to the present day and has built a very valuable stone house on he same.

It is bounded Mauka by the yard of Henese, and Wahie's lot, Olowalu by Kela Pake's lot or Wahie's lot, Makai by the main street of Lahaina called Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by a small lane or street dividing it from Kaenaena's lot.

The claimant presented a survey of the lot made by John Richardson.

The claimant likewise stated that he had put in a claim for the Ahupuaa of "Pukoo waena", in Kona, Molokai which L. Kaauwai said was so.



He exhibited a document showing that he had received this Ahupuaa from the King at the recent division of lands, and this was given to him in consideration of his relinquishing to the King "Maniania" a land in Koolau, Molokai and "Pukoo 3" on the same island. (see Book in Mr. Young's Office). (v. 7/146)

3288 Mu

This claim was heard yesterday under claim No. 475. It is the piece of Kalo land of 15 Lois in "Haleu". (v. 7/147)

10001 Laahili

This is a claim for an Ahupuaa of "Puehuehuiki", Lahaina.

L. Kaamoai sworn. I know this land was given to Laahili by the King at the recent division of lands. He gave to the King the Ahupuaa of "Moanui", Molokai and "Napili" in Kaanapali.

There are some tenants living on this land of Puehuehuiki who have put in their claims about five I should think. (v. 7/147)

7759 Kumaewa

Kaua sworn. I know the land of the claimant. It is in 4 pieces, One in "Hahakea" and three in "Wahikuli", Lahaina.

The claimant received the land in "Hahakea" from the Premier Kahauluohi in 1843 and has held it in peace until the month of March last when Kaaua the wife of Kamakini threatened to take it away.

The three pieces in "Wahihuli" he received from Kekauluohi in 1843 and held it in peace until 1846 when Kaenaena dispute his title owing to some misunderstanding about Poalima work.

The dispute has been settled and the claimant left in the possession of the land.

The piece in "Keahakea" is bounded Mauka by the Mountains land of Kekauonohi, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by Kalaikini's land, Kaanapali by the same.

The first piece of House lot in "Wahikuli" is bounded on all sides by Kalaikini's land. There only one House on it.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> piece, a cultivated iiece of Kula in "Wahikuli" is fenced and the fence is the correct boundary. It is bounded on all sides by Kalaikini's land.

The third piece up Mauka, a cultivated Kula is bounded Mauka and Olowalu sides by Kanaina's land, Makai and Kaanapali by the creek of "Wahikuli". (v. 7/147-148)

#### 2745 Paoao

Kanana sworn. The claimant has one House lot in "Iilikahi", Lahaina, and one piece of cultivated land in "Paunau", Lahaina.

The claimant received the House lot from his ancestor in the days of Kamehameha I and the same may be said of his land in Paunau. His title has never been disputed.

The House lot has 3 Houses on it and is fenced. It is bounded Mauka by the yard of Kaino, Olowalu by the yard of Kahula, Makai by Kekuanaoa's land, Kaanapali by Keaweluaole.

The other piece is bounded Mauka and Olowalu sides by the Pali of Paunau, on the other two sides by the creek of Paunau. (v. 7/148)

#### 3192 Kahinu

Pokai W. sworn. I know the lands of the claimant they are three pieces of land in "Honokowai", Maui, they are 2 pieces in the Ili of "Kapili" and one in the Ili of Papaolena.

The claimant received these lands from Pikanele the Luna in the year 1846 and has occupied them in peace down to the present time. There are however 3 Poalima Lois in Kapili and 3 in Papaolena belonging to the King who is the great Lord of the land.

The piece in Papaolena is of 6 Lois excluding the Poalima lois, is bounded Mauka by Kalaikini's, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by the creek and Kalaikini's land.

The first piece in Kapili of 24 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kaukau's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by "Ohia" an Ili, Kaanapali by Nakoko's land. Kalaikini says these are Poalima lois, but they are not.

The other piece of 6 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kaukau's loi, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the Poalima lois, Kaanapali by David Malo's land.

After a long and tedious investigation the Commission convinced that the 6 lois above spoken of were the only Poalima lois in these lands. See p. 22 v. 15 (v. 7/148-149)

7750 Kuikawai

Mai W. sworn. The land of the claimant is well known to me. It is in two pieces, one a House lot, and the other a Kula land of 3 Moos in "Moalii", Lahaina.

The claimant received this land from Hanau the Konohiki in the days of Hoapili wahine, before 1839 and he has held them without dispute to the present day.

The piece of 3 Moos is bounded Mauka by Kanakaole's land, Olowalu by the creek of "Moalii", Makai by Keawe's Poalima, Kaanapali by Paahao land.

The House lot Makai is bounded Mauka by Keawe's land, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Hualu's land. See p. 30 v. 15 (v. 7/149)

3974 Haui

Holoaukee sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Kapuuakua", Lahaina, they are a House lot and 2 Lois and a cultivated Kula.

The claimant received these lands from Beke the Konohiki in 1845 and has held them in peace down to the present time.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Beke's Poalima, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by my land.

The piece of 2 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kamiki's land, Olowalu by Ku's land, Makai by Kapena's land, Kaanapali by Kaehukulani's land and Beke's Poalima.

The other piece is bounded Mauka by Kahula's land, Olowalu by Paunau, Makai by Kahaolelua's land, Kaanapali by D. Baldwin's land. (v. 7/149)

5389 Holoaukee See p. 20

Kaiawa sworn. I know the claimant's land, it is in "Kapuuakua", Lahaina and consists of a House lot and a cultivated land.

The claimant received them from Hoapili before 1839 and his title to them has never been disputed.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by Beke's land, Olowalu by Haui's land, Makai by Mr. Butler's, Kaanapali by the same.

The other piece is bounded Mauka by the Poalima of Beke, Olowalu by Kamiki's land, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by Dr. Baldwin's land. (v. 7/150)

8867 Kapaakea (is dead)

Pikanele sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. They are two Ili of land in "Ukumehame". Their names are "Kaulu" and "Maknewa".

He received them from Nahienaena and he has held them without dispute up to his death in 1848. His mother Kaunahi is his heir. He has no children. His mother has had peaceable possession ever since his death.

The Ili of "Kaulu" is bounded Mauka by Kapena's land, Hana side by the Pali, Makai by the creek of Ukumehame, Lahaina side by the same.

There are 2 Poalima lois within this ili.

The Ili of "Makanewa" is bounded Mauka by Maloaike's land, Hana by Pualoa's land, Makai by the same, Lahaina by Moehauna's land. There are 2 Poalima lois within this.

There is a large Kula belonging with the Ili of "Kaulu" down makai but I believe it is owned by the Aupuni. (v. 7/150)

3053 Keaka Kaena

Kaiawa sworn. The claimant's land is a House lot in "Kilauea", Lahaina.

The claimant received this House lot from Makapelapela in the year 1835. He was the Konohiki of Kilauea. His title upon the death of Makapelapela was sanctioned by Hoapili wahine. His rights here were never disputed until 1848 when Kanaina raised a claim for Lunalilo as being the heir to Hoapili wahine. The claimant says that lot is entitled to this lot if any one.

It is bounded Mauka by Capt. Butler's lot, Olowalu by Kanaina's lot, Makai by Kalena's lot, Kaanapali by Kanaina's lot. It is fenced. (v. 7/151)

720 Kamakini (is dead)

Naawa W sworn. I know the lands of Kamakini. They consist of three lots in "Panaewa", Lahaina, one in "Waianae nui" and one in "Ukumehame".

The three lots in Panaewa he received from Kekauonohi in 1823 and he has held them in peace up to his death in 1848. But Maluo has a part of the third lot, she having lived there since 1832 (see Maluo's claim).

The lot in Waianae, the claimant had in 1819 and possessed it in peace up to his death.

The lot in Ukumehame he received from Kapena the Luna in 1842 and his title was never disputed. His heir is Hiamoe, his son by his first wife through whom he derived all his property.

The House lot in Ukumehame is bounded Mauka by the Poalima land, Hana by Makaeha's land, Makai by the Great road, Kaanapali by the land which it is not clear to whom it belongs. I think to the King. It is fenced.

The House lot in "Waianae" is bounded Mauka by Pahia's lot, Olowalu by J. Kaeo's lot, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by Dr. Baldwin's lot. It is fenced.

The large lot in Panaewa is bounded Mauka by John Steven's lot, Olowalu by Ukiki's and Kanaina's and Kekuanaoa's land, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni and Maluo's lot, Kaanapali by Maluo's and the Govt road.

The second lot is bounded Mauka by Blossom's lot, Olowalu by the road leading to Lahainaluna, Makai by Kaolulo's lot, Kaanapali by Hikiau's lot.

The third lot is bounded Mauka by Kekauonohi's Poalima, Olowalu by Kekauonohi's and Kuahamauna's lands, Makai by the Govt road, Kaanapali by the road leading to Lahainaluna. It is fenced. (v. 7/151-152)

5116 S. Kanae (is dead)

L. Kaauwai sworn. The claimants land, they consists of one Ili of land called "Kiokapu" in Waikiki, Oahu, and a Ahupuaa in Lahaina called "Hupokopoko, and one House lot in Lahaina also.

"Kiokapu" and "Huipokopoko" he received from the King at the recent division. There are 7 land claimants living in Kiokapu and 2 on Huipokopoko.

The claimant had the House lot from Hoapili Kane in 1835 and his title has never disputed. He died in 1848. He left a widow named Kekaula and one daughter.

He has a House lot also in Honolulu, Oahu. He received this from his wives in olden time in 1837 and he has held that but not without dispute. William Smith disputed his title to this lot and so does Moehonua.

The House lot at Lahaina is bounded Mauka by Kapaakea lot, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by Huakamauna's lot.

I don't know the bounds of the House lot in Honolulu, but it is the one near Dr.Wood's claimed by Wm. Smith. See p. 32 v. 15 (v. 7/152)

7749 Wanakanui

Kuakawai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. It is an Ili of land called "Oalau" in "Mualii", Lahaina, there are 12 Moos of land in this Ili. He has a House lot also.

The claimant received these lands in the olden times in the days of Kamehameha 1 and his title has not been disputed up to this day.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by Hanalei's, Olowalu by Keawe's Poalima, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Keawe's Cocoa nut grove.

The other piece is bounded Mauka by the Ili of "Kau", Olowalu by "Oalau 2", Makai by the land of Hanalei, Kaanapali by Kapaahu. See p. 84 v. 15 (v. 7/152-153)

9062 Keawa look for duplicate number no. 286

This claim was heard in the days of Mr. Richards. (v. 7/153)

2538 Umiumi

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Paunau", Lahaina. It is a House lot, one dry Loi, 4 Moos in another piece, and a pauku of Kalo.

The claimant received the House lot and dry Loi from Kamanawa in the days of Kaahumanu 1, he held these up to 1846 when Maluo took them away, but the Governor fined Maluo and returned the land. The Governor has done this with Maluo twice. He now has them but the wife of Maluo still disputes them. (see claim no. 6729).

The claimant received the 4 Moos spoken of from Maluo about 1842, and held them in peace up to 1846 when Maluo took them away and he has not enjoyed them since. Maluo took them away because he was the Konohiki.

The claimant received the Pauku of Kalo land from me in 1837 and there has been no dispute respecting his title since.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the land a loi in dispute between Maluo, Kekuanaoa and myself, Olowalu by the yard of Kaluopele, Makai by my yard, Kaanapali by Kekuanaoa's loi.

The dry Loi is bounded Mauka by Maluo's or Kekuanaoa's land, Olowalu by "Haleu", and Nahaolehia's land, Makai by the land in dispute between Maluo and myself, and Kekuanaoa, Kaanapali by my land.

The piece of 4 Moos is bounded Mauka by Kauai's land, Olowalu by Nahaolelua's land, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by "Puahoowali".

The section of Kalo land is bounded Mauka by Palahi's land, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Kakau's land. See page 20 v. 15 (v. 7/153-154)

4147 Kiananu

Keaeluole sworn. I know the land of the claimant. It is a section of Kula and Kalo land in "Kelauea", Lahaina.

The claimant received this land from me in 1837 and it has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Kane's land, Olowalu by Pikanele's and Kane's land, Makai by Kaleua's land, Kaanapali by the creek of Moalii. (v. 7/154)

1815 Keaweaeheulu W. Nanaina counter to H lot Lahaina (also to Kohinu's claim Kula end L. Luna)

Keawaluaole sworn. I know the claimant's land, it consist of a House lot in "Paunau", Lahaina, an a Pauku of Kalo in "Kuholilea", Lahaina, and a Kalo land in "Wahikuli", Lahaina.

The claimant received the House lot from her father Kaneanaue, this is the same House lot claimed by Kananaua in No. 6439. Kaneiua is a counter claim.

Nalehu sworn. I know the claimant's section of Kalo land in "Kuhelilea" and the Kula in Wahikuli.

She received it from kaenaena the Luna in 1841 and her title has never been dispute to the present day.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by the creek of "Kahoma", Olowalu by the same, Makai by Kaelemakale's land, Kaanapali by the Poalima of Kanaina.

The Kula piece is bounded Mauka by Kanaina's land, and all the other three sides by the same. See vol. 15 p. 10. (v. 7/154)

6448 Keawakea

Mua W. sworn. I know the claimant's land, it is a section of Kalo land in "Haleu", Lahaina, all in one piece of 3 Lois.

The claimant received it from Nahaolelua in the days of Hoapili before 1839 and he has held the same up to the present date without dispute.

It is bounded Mauka by Mealuhi's, Olowalu by the creek of Kauaula, Makai by the land of Kalalako, Kaanapali by Auwaa's land. (v. 7/155)

2777 Malule and Kaino man and wife (both dead)

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant in "Ilikahi", Lahaina.

They received it from Kanaina in this way via Kanaina took their lot near the Fort and sold it to the Government for \$425.00 and gave them for it this lot and \$125.00. This was in 1842. They lived on it in peace up to their death this year. Their heir is Paahao their son. His father wished this son who is a grown man to live under Kalola.



It is fenced and the fence is the correct boundary. It is bounded Mauka by the Poalima lois of Kanaina, Olowalu by Kahula's yard, Makai by the yard of Paoao or Kanaina, Kaanapali by my yard and Kalena.

Kailiokai sworn. I know the claimant's Ili of land called "Punawai", in Moalii Lahaina. It consist of 2 pieces, one Kalo land and one Kula land.

The claimants received it from Kaahumanu 1 and held it without dispute up to their death this year.

The Kalo piece iuka is bounded Mauka by Kekualele's land, Olowalu by the same, Makai by Moakaka's land, Kaanapali by Kauoi's lot.

It is bounded Mauka by the Govt road leading to Lahainaluna, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by the creek of Paunau. It is fenced and that is the correct boundary.

The claimant received these land of Lois 15 in number from Pikanele and his grandfather in 1838 and enjoyed them in peace until 1847 when Pikanele took away 3 of them because the man having them in charge has too old to go to the Poalima work.

The piece of 14 Lois is bounded Mauka by Kalaikini, Olowalu by Kailiuku's land, Makai and Kaanapali by the creek of Moalii.

The piece of one Loi is bounded Mauka by Pikanele's loi, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by Liu's land, Kaanapali by the creek of Moalii.

There is still one new piece a lot in "Kelawea" a very small lot.

The claimant received it from Pikanele in 1838 and he has held it without dispute to the present day.

It is bounded Mauka by Lui's lot, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by the street, Kaanapali by the creek of Kanaka. See p. 38 v. 5 N.T. (v. 7/156)

7157 Kanekuapuu

The claimant is dead but his wife appeared.

Kalohapalani sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Haleu", Lahaina, they are in three pieces, one of 3 Lois, and some sugar cane down makai, one piece of one Loi, and one piece of 8 Lois.

The claimant received these land from Nahaolelua in the year 1837 and he held it up to death 2 months since. His widow Mua is his heir. He left 2 children.

The piece of 3 Lois and the sugar cane is bounded on all sides except the north by Auwaa's land, Kaanapali by "Paunau."

The claimant received this land in Aki from Namauu's wife in 1842 and he has held them ever since in peace.

The two pieces in Paunau he received from Kahuna at the same time and his title to them has never been disputed.

The piece in Aki is bounded Mauka by the creek of Kahona, Olowalu by the Pali, Makai by Paluhe and Kauhi's land, Kaanapali by the creek of Kahoma.

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the land of the claimant. It is a House lot in "Kelawea", Lahaina.

Pikanele took on third of the lot as his right, but why cannot say. I never heard of his having any rights there. This was in the year 1847.

The piece in Puunooa is bounded Mauka by Maluo's lot, Olowalu by the same, Makai by Mahua's land, Kaanapali by "Kuholilea". 7 Lois are connected with this.

Kauioalukaua sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Moalii", Lahaina. They consist of 2 pieces, one a House lot and one a Kula land.

The claimant received the House lot from Mamaki in the year 1832. He obtained the Kula land from Hanalei at the same time. His title has never been disputed.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Govt road, Olowalu by Kamaikaoloa's land, Makai by the sea beach, Kaanapali by the yard of Kapule.

It is bounded Mauka by the Pali, Olowalu by the Pali, Olowalu by the creek of Kahoma, Makai by "Wahihuli", Kaanapali by Hahokea. See p. 67 v. 15 (v. 7/159-160)

464 Nawaakoa W.

A. Moku sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Lapakea", Lahaina. They consist of 2 House lot. Formerly it had all in one piece but the road has made two of it.

The claimant received it from Kekiau about 1837 through her brother. Her title has never been disputed.

The Makai piece is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Olowalu by Ladana's lot, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the Govt House.

The other piece is bounded Mauka by Hikiau's lot, Olowalu by the same, Makai by Alia's land, Kaanapali by Wahie's lot.

L. Kaaiwai sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant in "Panaewa", Lahaina.

The claimant received it through her brother Uluiahele from Kamakini in 1838 and there is no dispute about her title. It is fenced and the fence is the correct boundary.

It is bounded Mauka by Kaha's lot, Olowalu by the road leading to Lahainaluna, Makai by Kuakamauna's lot, Kaanapali by Ladana's lot. (v. 7/160)

2762 Part 1 Nawaakoa

This claim is identical with Cl. 464 above heard. (v. 7/161)

2762 Part 2 Nawaakoa

Kamauoha sworn. The land here claimed is in "Paunau", Lahaina. It is an Ili of land known by the name of "Pohahuou". It is in two pieces, one up Mauka and the other Makai.

The claimant received these lands from Pualinui the Luna that time in 1837 and her title has never been disputed.

The piece up Mauka is Kalo land and is bounded Mauka by Kekahuna's land, Olowalu by the creek of Kahoma, Makai by Kaiki, Kaanapali by the Pali.

The piece Makai is bounded Mauka by Kapena's lot, Olowalu by Kaohie's lot, Makai by Olekau's, Kaanapali by the Poalima of Kekuanaoa.

Kaumauma sworn. I know the claimant live in Moanui, Lahaina. The claimant received it from Ulunakele in 1823 and held it to 1841 in peace when Joachin Armas was the Konohiki took it away, because he was Konohiki and has held it to the present time.

It is bounded Mauka by "Aki", Olowalu by Palau's land, Makai by J. Armas land, Kaanapali by "Aki". (v. 7/161)

8021 Aha

Kalakoa sworn. The claimant's land is in "Kaholilea", one piece of Kalo land.

The claimant received it from Kaenaena, and has held it without dispute to this day.

It is bounded Mauka by Nalehu's land, Olowalu by Paunau, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by the creek of Kahoma. (v. 7/161)

2546 Lifu W.

Kapuhi sworn. The claimant has a House lot in "Halakaa", Lahaina, and another lot in "Puehuekunui", and 2 pieces in Alio, one a Kalo and Kula land, and the other a Kalo land.

The House lot she received from her ancestors in the days of Kamehameha 1 and has possessed it ever since. But Col. Moa when he came to possess Halakaa was angry because the claimant would not acknowledge that she lived under him and there in 1843 disputed her title for the same. He has put in a claim for it.

The piece in "Puehuehunui" she received from Manukau in 1840 and her title to this has never been disputed.

The two pieces in Alio, she received from Kaulahea the Luna of Alio in 1841 and there has been no dispute about her title.

10787 Panipani

This is not claim for land but a request that the Land Commission will except him from Poalima work forever because he is a Tailor! (v. 7/163)

7748 Keahilaweiki

Wahu sworn. The claimant's land is in one piece of 3 Moos in "Moahi", Lahaina.

The claimant received it from Hanalei in the year 1844 and he has held it without dispute.

It is bounded Mauka by Pukie's land, Olowalu by the creek of Moalii, Makai by the Govt road, Kaanapali by Kukawai's land.

355 Keopenui

Kaumauma sworn. The claimant lands are in "Kalimaohe", Lahaina, and consist of 5 distinct pieces. One a House lot Makai and 2 pieces of Kula and 2 pieces of Kalo land one of 10 Lois and the other of 20 Lois.

The claimant received these lands from Hoapili wahine in the days of Kamehameha 1 through his father Nahonu and he has held them without dispute ever since.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by Makini's house lot, Olowalu by Kanae's, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the creek of "Puekauwahi".

The first piece of Kula land, Mauka by Kahiamoe's land, Olowalu by "Kuia", Makai by the Poalima loi, Kaanapali by "Hanakaoo" and Pule's land.

The second piece of Kula land is bounded Mauka by Aupokopoko, and the Poalima loi, Olowalu by Kahiamoe's, Makai by Kapule's land, Kaanapali by Kamaka's land.

Aha sworn. The land of the claimant, it is in one piece of 18 Lois of Kalo land in Kuholilea. It is fenced and there is some Kula in there.

The claimant received this lot from Walue in the year 1827 and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by the Kula of Paunau, Makai by the road leading to Kaanapali, Kaanapali by the creek of Kahoma. (v. 7/165)

6481 Kailimeeau W.

Kaki sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it is in Waianae nui, Lahaina, is one piece.

The claimant received it from her ancestors behind the memory of Man, but her title has been dispute this day.

Wailele a woman appeared and dispute this title. She said a claim for it put in by Kuakini and heard by Mr. Richards was for the same lot.

The witness said the claimant lived in the lot under Kuakini, she had however a right of residence there, the claim was here dismissed. (v. 7/165)

10767 L. Pahia

This claim has already been heard under the claimant's other numbers. (v. 7/166)

470 Kuokoa

L. Pahia sworn. The claimant's lands are in "Puako", Lahaina. They are as follows: 1 a House lot; 2 One Kula and 2 Lois; 3 three Moos of Kula; 4 three Lois; 5 a Pauku of Kalo land.

The claimant a woman and received these first four lands from Kekauonohi in 1824 and has held the first four pieces without dispute until this day.

The 5<sup>th</sup> piece she received at the same time and held all of it in peace until 1838 when she gave away 3 Lois but they came back to her afterwards.

The piece of No. 1 is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Judge Parson's lot, Makai by the street leading by Judge Parson's lot, Kaanapali by the street leading up mauka.

I know the lands of the claimant in Puaanui, Lahaina, they consist of 6 pieces, one Pahale, two pieces of Kalo, 5 Moos of Kula separate two pieces, one piece of 1 Moo, and the other 4 Moos, and the other two pieces in Waineenui, one piece of 5 Lois and the other piece of one Loi and Kula.

The claimant has gone to California but his wife Kupenu appeared for him.

Kanalau sworn. I know the claimants lands, they are in Kuholilea niu, Lahaina. It is in 4 pieces. No. 1 is a Kalo land of 16 Lois, and a Kula. No. 2 is a Kalo of 12 Lois and Kula. No. 3 is one Loi. No. 4 is one Loi.

The claimant received this lands from Kalawaia in 1841 and his title has never been disputed.

The No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Kalia's land, Olowalu by the pali of Paunau, Makai by the pali, and the creek of Kahoma, Kaanapali by the creek of Kahoma.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Kanaina's Poalima, Olowalu by the pali of Paunau, Makai by Kaha's land, Kaanapali by the creek of Kahoma.

The No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Nipoa's kula land, Olowalu by "Puuiki", Makai by Nipoa's lois, Kaanapali by the high Pali.

6498 Hokio See p. 108

This claim has been partly heard before (see Page 108).

Samuela Jackson born in Madras sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it is in "Kainehe", Lahaina. It consist of a House lot and Kula in one piece, and a Kalo land of 5 Lois.

My wife Aki gave this land into the charge of Hookio in 1845 but the care of the land was all he had. He did not take proper care of the land. He did not plant it as he taught, and he was told to leave it about two weeks ago. He said I will go for I have plenty of business in killing beef. The land never was his but belongs to Piikoi (the clamant was sent for three times to appear before the commission and substantiate his claim, but did not come.) See page 57 v. 15. (v. 7/170)

7777 Kaiaino See Cl. 10667 P. 132

Liu sworn. The claimant is dead but his only child, Naomi his daughter is his heir. He died in 1848 with the measles and so died his wife Nahima. Naomi I should say is an adopted child. He has one true child, a little girl which Naomi takes care of, it is a baby.

It is a House lot in "Kelawea" including 2 Lois. Kaiaino received this land from Naomi mother of Nalima in 1842. Nalima lived under Kapihenui, who has put in a claim for the same lot. (see Kapihenui's claim) heard a few days since. Kapihenui now occupied the House lot, there were 3 Lois, but Pikanele took away one in 1845 and he has lately thrown down Naomi's house, Naomi has two Lois in this lot now dry. Kapihenui said she was still wishing that Naomi should live there and have the two lois if she desired them.

The claimant had also 3 Lois in separate pieces outside of the House lot which he received from Maele in 1838, which he held until 1845 in peace when Pikanele took them away owing to his great power, and has held them to this day although the Luna Aukau and the Premier John Young have both decided that they should be restored to her. (see Pikanele's claim no. 10667).

Pikanele was called u and upon being questioned said that Kaiaina gave him one of these lois and the other two he had not taken away but he had no proof that Kainaina had given him this lois. Pikanele further said Kaninau had put in a claim for these lois but that he had not. (See Kaninau's claim No. --).

The Commission were of the opinion after a lengthy investigation that the claimant Kaiaino was the one truly entitled to these 3 Lois.

The witness then proceeded to give the boundaries.

The first loi is bounded Mauka by Pikanele's loi, Makai by Mr. Peek's lot, Makai by Pikanele's, Kaanapali by Kaluaokamano's land.

The second piece of 3 lois is bounded Mauka by the creek of Kapoulu, Olowalu by the same, Makai by Kaumanui's land, Kaanapali by "Wahikuli". (v. 7/170-171)

300 A. Paki from p 233 v. 3

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the House lot for which this claim is filed. It is in Pakala, Lahaina nui.

Paki received this lot from Kaaimalolo in 1837 and since then Paki has had the same in his undisturbed possession, though I have heard that the King once claimed it in 1826.

It is bounded Mauka by the fish pond of Kekuanaoa or the Aupuni, Olowalu by Kaihe's house, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by A. Kaeo's lot. (v. 7/172)

353 Kakai

Kanola sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it is a House lot in Panaiwa, Lahaina.

The claimant received it from his ancestors in the days of Kamehameha 1 and has held it without dispute to the present day.

It is bounded Mauka by Hikiau's and Kaohilo's land, Olowalu by Kelola's lot, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by Hikiau's lot. (v. 7/172)

6541B Keahole

Kaiaino W sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Punakea 1 and Punakea 2", Lahaina. No.1 is a House lot in Punakea 2, No. 2 of one Loi in Punakea 1, No. 3 is 3 Lois, No. 4 of one Loi, No. 5 of one Loi all in Punakea 1.

The claimant received the House lot from his ancestors in the days of Kamehameha 1. Four of the Lois he received from his sons in 1842 and his sons received them from the Konohiki.

The balance from his ancestors at the same time he did the House lot. His title has never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki's land Wahie, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by the Govt Cattle's Pen.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Loea's land, Olowalu by Wahie's land, Makai by the same, Kaanapali by "Mala."

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Loea's land, Olowalu and Makai sides by Wahie's land, Kaanapali by Loea's land.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Loea's land, Olowalu and Makai sides by Wahie's land, Kaanapali by Loea's land.

No. 5 is bounded Mauka by the Govt lot, Olowalu and Makai sides by Wahie's land, Kaanapali by Haawipu's lot. Alapai, the Premier's wife is the Lord of these lands. (v. 7/172-173)

10789 Puanaia

The claimant exhibited a paper showing that he had received at the recent division the Ahupuaa of Keaalii on East Maui in exchange for other lands given to the King.

Kaiwalu W. sworn. I know the claimants lands in Lahaina, they are the first piece of House lot in Kuluiaiki, the 2<sup>nd</sup> piece of Loi in "Kuhuanui".

The claimant received this lot and Loi in the days of Kamehameha 1 and his title has never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Naea's lot, Olowalu by Kuhuanui, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by Antonio the husband of Beke.



No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Kalauaia's lot, Olowalu by the Poalima of Kipa, Makai by Kalawaia's lot, Kaanapali by Heuakeua's loi. (v. 7/173)

7682 Kuluwaimakalani

Piianaia sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Kuhuanui", Lahaina. They consist of 2 pieces, one of one Loi, and the other piece of 2 Moos of Kula.

The claimant received these lands from Pahi in 1842 and Pahi received them from Alia about 1837. His title has been disputed, that is the Konohiki Kukuleloa took away the land 1847 because Pahi died and he has never returned it.

The piece of No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Hewahewa's land, Olowalu by Opunui's land, Makai by Kaluna's land, Kaanapali by Kipa's land.

The piece No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Kipa's land, Olowalu and Makai sides by the same, Kaanapali by Naea's land. (v. 7/173-174)

6507 Apaa

Puali sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Kooka", Lahaina, they consist of 5 pieces. One of 2 Moos of Kula, and the other of 4 Moos of Kula, and 3 Moos of Kula in the other and House and 1 Loi, and one Kula in another, and 16 Lois iuka loa in the last piece.

The first piece is bounded Mauka by Manu's land, Olowalu by Namauu Ehu's land, Makai by Haole's land, Kaanapali by Keaka's land.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Namauu's land, Olowalu by Hoouaulu's land, Makai by Manu's land, Kaanapali by the same.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Olelo's land, Olowalu by "Polanui", Makai and Kaanapali by Namauu's land.

The 4<sup>th</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Kupalii's land, Olowalu by "Polanui", Makai by Olelo's land, Kaanapali by "Waineenui".

The 5<sup>th</sup> piece is bounded Mauka and Olowalu and Makai sides by my land, Kaanapali by Kaia's land.

The claimant received these lands from Hoapili in 1837 and has held them without dispute until the present day. The claimant is dead. He died with the Measles in Nov. 1848. His heirs are his widow Keua, and his son Mokulewa. (v. 7/174)

#### 8587 Kaupena

Waihele W. sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Puaanui", Lahaina. Four pieces; No. 1 House lot and Kula, No. 2 a section of Kalo land, No. 3 of one Loi, No. 4 of one Loi.

The claimant received these lands from Kaheauanui the Konohiki of Puaanui in 1845 and he has possessed them in peace ever since.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by "Waineenui", Olowalu by "Kooka", Makai by Popolu's land, Kaanapali by "Waineenui."

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Kaheananui's land, Olowalu by the creek of Kauaula, Makai and Kaanapali sides by the Pali of Puaanui.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Maheae's land, Olowalu by the creek of Kauaula, Makai and Kaanapali sides by Kupena's land.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Kalua's Poalimas, Olowalu by Keohohana's land, Makai by Lupakoolani's land, Kaanapali by Kuakamauna's land. (v. 7/174-175)

#### 508 Kalakohina

Waihuioahu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Puinau 2", Lahaina. There are 5 pieces. No. 1 is a House lot, No. 2 of 4 Lois, No. 3 of 3 Lois, No. 4 of one Loi, No. 5 of one Loi.

The claimant received these lands from Kahekili in 1827 and there is no dispute about his title.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Olowalu by Paunau 3, Makai by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by Puunau 1. There is 1 Poalima Loi within this.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Puuanu 1, Olowalu and Makai sides by Puunau 3, Kaanapali by the poli of Puunau.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu and Makai sides by the pali of Puuanu, Kaanapali by "Keoka" and Puehueukuiki.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Kawau's land, Olowalu and Makai sides by the creek of Kauaula, Kaanapali by Kawau's land.

No. 5 is bounded Mauka by Paiki's Poalima, Olowalu by the creek of Kauaula, Makai by Ikeole's land, Kaanapali by the pali of Puunau. (v. 7/175)

6412 Kala

Kanalu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in two pieces, one of 10 Lois and the other piece has 5 Lois.

The claimant received them from Kahinelua, and he had from Kalaikoa in 1831. His title has never been disputed.

The first piece is bounded Mauka and Olowalu sides by the creek of Kanaha, Makai by the Loi of Kaupena, Kaanapali by the pali of Puou.

The second piece is bounded Mauka by Kaupena's loi, Olowalu by the creek of Kanaha, Makai by Kaupena's and Maikai's loi, Kaanapali by the creek of Kahoma. (v. 7/176)

8849 Kukaeliki (Mrs. Wm. Coles) fr. Page 145

This claim was partly heard before (see page 145). The claimant now says that she has one House lot for which Pikao has put in a claim and which was heard in the days of Mr. Richards. The claimant bases her rights upon the fact that this lot was once her fathers. Her fathers name was Kaiwi.

Laahili sworn. I know this House lot and have for 20 years. This lot was possessed by Pikao (see no. 296) and Kaiwi, under me in the days of Nahienaena. In 1838 Kaiwi left and went to live in another place. But Pikao lived there in 1824 and continued to live there until his death in November 1848. Since his death his heirs have lived there, but neither Kaiwi nor his heirs have lived there since 1835. (v. 7/176)

5664 Kekauai

The claimant exhibited his paper showing that at the recent division of lands with the King  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the Ahupuaa of "Puakoowali", Lahaina was given to him.

Pukeana W. sworn. I know the land of the claimant in "Alaeloa", Kaanapali. It is two sections of Kalo land and one is called "Waikulu", and the other "Olohe."

The claimant received these lands from Hoapili Kane in 1837 or 1838, and his title has never been disputed.

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the land of the claimant in Waihee. It is an Ili called Puhauolu. They are many tenants on this Ili, they are about 29 Lois belonging to him in this ili, but I cannot give the bounds.

He received this land from Hoapili in 1829 and his title has never been disputed.

Kahapaina sworn. I know the land of the claimant on Molokai. He is Luna over the Ahupuaa of "Keopukaloa" on Molokai under the King. (v. 7/176-177)

487 Kaailau

Kaulani sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it is a House lot in "Aki", Lahaina.

He received it from me in the days of Liholiho and his title is without dispute.

It is bounded Mauka by Kauhi's lot, Olowalu by Pueo's lot, Makai by Hoohu's lot, Kaanapali by Kinokeo's lot. (v. 7/177)

6243 Kaohie (fr. Page 7)

This claim was partly heard May 29<sup>th</sup> 1849 (see page 7).

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant in Puako, Lahaina.

The claimant's wife Kanikoa took this lot it being a waste place in 1824 and lived there in peace until 1841 when died and then I heard that the claimant her husband was her heir to this and all her other lands. His wife she was daughter of the King's Mother's Muse. Kaohu lived there until 1843 when the King it away. I don't know why the King did so. (v. 7/177)

8458 Kailihiwa

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the House lot of here claimed. He received it from the King in 1838 and his title is without dispute.

It is bounded Mauka by the main street of Lahaina, Olowalu by Puhi's lot, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Kaunuohua's lot. It is in "Alio", Lahaina. (v. 7/178)

10785 Paniani

Kahikona sworn. I know the land of the claimant is in "Puunau", Lahaina, they consist of one piece of a House lot and Kula lands.

Claimant received this land from Kapeeiliahi about 1835 and his title is without dispute.

It is bounded Mauka by the waste kula of Paunau, Olowalu by Kawaa's land, Makai by Waineenui, Kaanapali by the Konohiki's land. See p. 83 v. 15 (v. 7/178)

8458-B Kuhalake

The claimant appeared and made oath that he had put in a claim to the Land Commission for a House lot in Palauui, Lahaina and ½ of the Ahupuaa of Lupehu on Molokai.

He produced his paper showing that he received the one half of the Ahupuaa above spoken of at Molokai from the King at the recent division of lands. He said that had no witnesses for his House lot. (v. 7/178)

6463 Kapu

Waihele W. sworn. I know the land of the claimant is in "Wainunui", Lahaina, and consists of 8 Lois in one piece.

The claimant received this piece from me in 1847 and I received it from Kuakini in 1838. My title nor claimant's was ever disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Kekahuoi's land, Olowalu by Puaa's, Makai by Hololualani's land, Kaanapali by the Moo Poalima. (v. 7/178-179)

8621 Kekukahiki

Ahuli sworn. I know the land of the claimant in Kooka, Lahaina, they consist of one piece of one Loi.

The claimant received this land from the King in `842, and in one dispute his title.

The claimant received this land from the King in 1842 and no one dispute his title.

It is bounded Mauka by Paikaualani's land, Olowalu by Paoao's , Makai by Paikaualani's land, Kaanapali by Kaunaki's land. (v. 7/179)

507 Namauu (of the L. C.)

Kaehunui sworn. I know the land of the claimant they consist of two pieces, one House lot in Pakala, one House lot in Waiokama, both in Lahaina.

The claimant received the House lot in Pakala just north of here in several small pieces from the King and the other in 1836 or 1837 and so on, and it was never disputed up to this time, but the piece mauka of it and between the road is the Aupuni.

This piece in Pakala is bounded Mauka by the Govt land, Olowalu by the lot of the King, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the yards of Paki and Keoniana.

The House lot in Waiokama he took up as waste land in 1838 and held the same in peace up to his death last year. It is bounded Mauka and Olowalu sides by Nalehu's yard, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Kaleokekoi's yard.

L. Hanaino sworn. I know the House lot in Namauu in "Puunoa 3", Lahaina.

The claimant received it from His Majesty about 1830 and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Olowalu by Kainehe, Makai by Kamaka's, Poopuu's and my lots, Kaanapali by Ku's lot in dispute with me. (v. 7/179-180)

10892 N. Namauu

10893 Wm. Harbottle June 15, 1849

These are just claims for parts of the same lot.

L. Hanemo sworn. I know this House lot, it is in "Lapakea", Lahaina.

The claimants received this lot from Namoheau in 1837, and they have held it without dispute ever since. Namauu and Wm. Harbottle own one half of the lot each, but their parts are not divided.

The whole lot is bounded Mauka by the Govt road, Olowalu by the yard of Ladaua, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Nawakoa's lot. (v. 7/180)

7593 Kaulunae

The claimant is dead but her sister and heir alapai Mrs. John Young, appeared and requested that this claim be postponed for settlement at Oahu, because the one half of Puunau for which this claim is filed is not yet fully divided with the King. (v. 7/180)

1742 L. Kaauuai See 215 p. vol. 3 and 187 v. 7

This is a claim for Kaauwai and his wife separately.

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, Kaauwai in part. He has two pieces of lands in "Paeohi", Lahaina.

The 1<sup>st</sup> piece, this is a pauku of Kalo land called Waiia, and the other a pauku of Kalo land.

Kaauuai received these lands from Keohokalole in 1842 and his title has never been disputed. There is one Poalima Loi in the first piece.

The 1<sup>st</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Kaimuniu, Olowalu by Kekueliki's land, Makai by Kaa's land, Kaanapali by "Wahikuli".

The 2<sup>nd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Hauola's land and Kumokeo's, Olowalu by Neuneu's land, Makai by Pakea's land, Kaanapali by Kinoku's land.

For his wife's lands, Kaauuai said her witness at Olowalu and registered that it be postponed until the Commission visits Olowalu. (v. 180-181)

5230 Keaweamahi

Kaiapkeakua sworn. Nothing intelligible could be got out of this witness.

Paulo Kauhihape sworn. The claimant has 3 pieces of lands in "Polanui", Lahaina, and one piece of Kula called "Pulehu" which I do not well know. No. 1 is a Pauku of land, No. 2 consists of 7 Moos, No. 3 is one Loi.

The claimant received these lands from Makaulia in 1837 and his title has never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Maekaekahana's land, Olowalu by Kahaia's land, Makai by Kaolakai, Kaanapali by the "Wainee 2".

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Kuhalake's land, Olowalu by "Kamani", Makai by "Polaiki" J. Whele's land, Kaanapali by "Kooka".

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Kui's land, Olowalu and Makai sides by the same, Kaanapali by "Kooka".

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the claimants Kula "Pulehu" in East Maui.

I have always understood that the claimant received this from the King in 1843 and I never heard his title disputed. (See Keoni Ana and the King in reference to this land.)

It is bounded Mauka by the "Haleakala" mountains, Honuaula by "Pulehuiki", Makai by the sea shore, Makawao by Onaopio. There are a great many native on this land. (v. 181-182)

6449 Kapu

Kauanui W. sworn. I know the claimants land which is one piece partly in "Puehuehunui", "Halakaa", "Puunau 1" and "Puunau 2". It is fenced.

The claimant received this land in 1838 or before and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Col. Moa's land, Olowalu by Likua's land, Makai by "Halakaa" and "Puehuehunui", Kaanapali by Polanui. (v. 7/181)

9812 Kamano

Malaekahana sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Polanui", Lahaina. They consist of 4 piece, No. 1 is a Pauku of Kalo land, No. 2 is 1 Moo, No. 3 is 3 Moos, No. 4 is 3 Moos, 2 of which are very small.

The claimant received these lands from Laa before 1820 and his title has never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by "Alio", Makai by Makuahine's land, Kaanapali by Waineenui.



No. 2 is bounded Mauka by the road leading to Olowalu, Olowalu by Keha's land, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Kamani's land.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Kamani's land, Olowalu by Kamaka's land, Makai by the Poalima land, Kaanapali by Kamani's land.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Kamani's land, Olowalu by "Polaiki", Makai and Kaanapali sides by Kamani's land. (v. 7/181)

#### 9812 B Kelolou

The claimant appeared and made oath that she had presented or sent her claim to Oahu before the 14<sup>th</sup> Feb. 1848. She sent in August 1847 so she swears. The Commission resolved to hear it.

Puhi sworn. I know the claimants land, it is a House lot in "Panaeua", Lahaina. She has occupied it in peace ever since the days of Kamehameha 1.

It is bounded Mauka by Haolulo, Olowalu by the road to Lahainaluna, Makai by the road leading to Kaanapali, Kaanapali by my lot. (v. 7/182-183)

#### 9812 C Nalehu See Index 6621

The claimant made oath that he sent his claim to Oahu Feb. 10, 1848. The Commission resolved to hear it.

Kanalu sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in Kuholilea, Lahaina. There are 3 pieces. No. 1 contains of 32 Lois, No. 2 of one Loi, No. 3 is a Kula land.

The claimant received these lands from Kipa about 1831 and his title to the same has not been disputed except that the claimant and the new Konohiki, Opunui had some angry words about the Kula land n Feb. last.

No. 1 bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by "Puunua", Makai by Aha's land, Kaanapali by the creek of "Kahoma".

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Puunua, Makai by Kanaina's Poalima, Kaanapali by my land.

No. 3 is bounded by Aha's land, Olowalu by the pali of "Paunau", Makai and Kaanapali sides by Kanaina's Poalima. (v. 7/183)

9812 D Kanalu

The claimant made oath that he sent his claim to Oahu Feb. 4, 1848. The Commission resolved to hear it.

Nalehu sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it is in one piece, consisting of 30 Lois and one Kula in "Kuhollilea", Lahaina.

The claimant received it from me in 1831 and has held it in peace ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by Pukaki's land, Olowalu by "Puunoa" of Kaeo, Makai my land, Kaanapali by the creek of Kahoma. (v. 7/183-184)

9812 E Kaanaana

The claimant made oath that he sent his claim to Oahu in January 20, 1848. The Commission resolved to hear it.

Manu sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant, one of them was heard by Mr. Richards. The one remaining to be heard is in "Kooka", Lahaina, it is fenced.

The claimant received this from Kaeo of Wailuku in the days of Hoapili before 1830. His title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by my land and Kupalu's, Olowalu by Keliiokekane's land, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by "Puaanui". See page 7 v. 15 (v.7/184)

9812 F Hauola

The claimant said under oath that he had sent in three claims, two of which had been heard, but the third one had not and he filed a copy of his claim for this third piece, saying that he sent it to Oahu Feb. 4, 1848.

The Commission resolved to hear this claim.

L. Kaauwai sworn, I know this House lot and land in one piece, it is in "Paeohi", Lahaina.

The claimant received this lot from Waiki in 1841. Waiki received it from Koailoa in 1838 or 1839. His title has never been disputed to my knowledge.

It is bounded Mauka by Pikanele's and Kekuanaoa's land, Olowalu by the yard of Mr. Peek, Makai by my land and Kimokeo's, Kaanapali by Kimikeo's land. (v. 7/184-185)

9812 G Keaweluaole

This claimant's claim could not be found, but L. Kaauwai said he knew it had been sent in and the claimant made oath that he had sent in 3 claim in 1847. He said he gave them to Mr. Richard. (They stand in Register v. 2 under 705).

Keaweaeulu sworn. I know all the lands of the claimant in Lahaina and Hana. He has a Ahupuaa of land in Hana called "Muolea", there are 7 Natives on this land. He has an Ili of land in "Paunau", Lahaina, called "Kuaipuaa" and one Ili in Kelaweia called "Kukuikapu". He has 5 Moos of land in the Ili of Kealapii in Waialua, Oahu.

The Ahupuaa of "Muolea" in Hana he received from Hoapili wahine in 1832. This land was formerly Keohokaole's but she consented that Hoapili Wahine should place the claimant on the land and he held it as a Luna until Hoapili wahine's death at which time she requested of Keohokalole that she would let the claimant keep this land. He did so until 1846 when she took the land from him. Hoapili wahine never owned of the land.

The Ili of "Kuaipuaa" and "Kukuikapu" he received from Hoapili Wahine in 1832 and held Kukuikapu in peace until 1846 when Kanaina took it away with all his food, horses etc. Amounting in all to about \$350 and he has held them to this day refusing to give them up. The occasion of this high handed act of Kanaina's was the refusal of the claimant to say that he lived under Kanaina. The claimant sued Kanaina and the judge referred him to the Land Commission.

The Ili of Kuaipuaa was enjoyed by the claimant in peace from the year 1832 to 1846, when the claimant went to Oahu in 1846, when Maluo the Konohiki of Puunau under Kanaina fell upon the land and took it away with all the claimant's food etc. and gave it to Napapa. But the claimant last year took it back again by main force and holds it now. There are two Moos and two Lois that Maluo took away from the claimant in 1841 and these are held by Maluo's wido at the present day (see Maluo's claim).

Kamauoha Maluo's widow being called upon the state the reason why her husband took away this land? She said she did not know as her husband did not tell her!

There is one Poalima Loi within Kukuikapu belonging to Kekuanaoa. And one Loi Poalima also within Kuaipuaa belonging to Kekuanaoa. There is one person living on Kukuikapu who has a good claim which has been heard. His name is Kauioahi. There are three living on Kuaipuaa. Their claims have been heard. Their names are Kaiki and Umiumi and Kahalelole.

The claimant received the Moos in Waialua, Oahu from Kekuanaoa in 1846 and has held them without dispute ever since. I don't know the bounds. See p. 27 v. 15 (v. 7/185-186)

4320 Kaua See p 14

CN 737 first claim

This claim was mostly heard May 31.

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the claimant's land in Hana. It is a Ahupuaa called "Hamo".

The claimant received it from Hoapili Kane about 1838. His title is disputed by Keohokalole who took it away in 1845. It was the land of Keohokalole when Hoapili gave it away and as soon as after the death of Hoapili Kane, as she saw fi, she took it back again. (v. 7/186)

4320 B Laniheloua

L. Kaauwai stated this claimant had sent in his claim and that it must have been mislaid.

The claimant produced a paper showing that at the recent division of lands the King gave him ½ of the Ahupuaa of "Kamilolulua" on Molokai. (See Book in Mr. Young's Office.) (v. 7/186-187)

4320 C Punuoai

Kaauwai stated that this claim had been duly entered.

The claimant produced a paper showing that he was entitled to ½ of the Ili of "Kanuapoo" in Waikele, Ewa, Oahu. This was the part given him by the King. (v. 7/187)

6218 Mauae

Waihele W. sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Waineenui" in 2 piece. No. 1 is a House lot and 4 Moos, No. 2 a piece of Kalo land.

The claimant received this lands from me in 1841 and I had it from Kuakini in 1838. His title nor mine was ever disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Maio's land, Olowalu by Puaa o Kaeo, Makai by J. Nowlein's lot, Kaanapali by Waineeiki.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Helehealani's land, Olowalu by "Puaa", Makai by Aa's land, Kaanapali by Waineeiki. (v. 7/187)

1742 Z. Kaauwai Fr. 180 page

This claim was partly heard this forenoon. The part remaining to be heard it that which belong's to Kaauwai's wife Lale.

Maui sworn. I know the lands of Lale. They consists of 2 Ili of land in Olowalu, they are called "Wailoaiki" and "Wailoanui".

The claimant received them from her first husband Kauhau in the year 1844 and she has ever held them without dispute.

They are 4 pieces. I should say that Haole and myself have titles within this Ili.

No. 1 is a Kalo land, and Kula land with one Poalima Loi within.

No. 2 is a Kula land. No. 3 is a Kula land up Mauka. No. 4 is a Kula land up Mauka.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by "Kamani" a Ili, Hana by the same, Makai by the sea shore, Lahaina by Kahiokahui a Ili.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by "Maomao" a Ili, Hana by the high Pali, Makai by "Kaunuikukahe" a Ili, Lahaina by the creek of Olowalu.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by the mountains, Hana by "Kaunukukahi", Makai and Lahaina sides by the creek of Olowalu.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by the mountain, Hana by Kamani, Makai by the creek of Olowalu, Kaanapali by the same. Resumed p. 561 (v. 7/187-188)

7772 Kaninaualii (boy)

Kawaihalau sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant, it is in "Aki", Lahaina.

The claimant received this land from his father early in 1847 or 1848. His father's name was Kaleoku who had it from the time of Kamehameha 1. His title is without dispute.

It is bounded Mauka by the Govt road, Olowalu by Kaailau's yard, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Kipa's yard. (v. 7/188)

394 Nawaakoa fr. 160 p.

This claim has already been heard before under Claim 2762, claim 464. (v. 7/188)

293 Kaunuiohua W. Lahaina June 16, 1849

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant, it is in "Alio", Lahaina.

The claimant received it from her husband Kaluauualu, the King's Muse in 1837. I have never ben head her title disputed. The claimant died in 1848. She willed everything at her death to Alexander Liholiho and Naea has charge of the lot under him.

It is fenced and bounded Mauka by the main street, Olowalu by Kailihiwa's yard, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Thomas Phillip's yard. See p. 77 v. 15 (v. 7/189)

9793 Mumuku

Maiewa sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Puako", Lahaina, they consist of 4 pieces. No. 1 is a House lot, and 2 Lois and Kula, No. 2 is one Loi, No. 3 one Moo of Kula, No. 4 one Pauku of Kalo.

The claimant received these lands from Kuakoa the Konohiki before 1837 and there has been no dispute of his title since.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Pahia's land, Olowalu by the Govt road, Makai by Pahia's land, Kaanapali by the Konohiki of Puako.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Ku's land, Olowalu by Pahia's land, Makai by Kamoku's land, Kaanapali by the same.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by waste Kula of the Konohiki, Olowalu by Pahia's land, Makai by Judge Parson's land, Kaanapali by my land.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Kanuku's land, Olowalu by "Puunoo" of Namauu, Makai by Kanuku's land, Kaanapali by "Kuholilea". (v. 7/189)

9794 Kuokoa

This claim has already been heard under the claim of Kanuku. (There is no such name on the Books). (v. 7/189-190)

9795 Kaaumaiewa

Mumuku sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Puako", Lahaina. There are 4 pieces. No 1 is a House lot and 6 Lois, No. 2 is one Moo of Kula, No. 3 is 2 Lois, No. 4 of one Loi.

The claimant received this lands from Kuokoa the Konohiki of Puako in 1833 and has held the same without dispute.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by "Waianaē", Olowalu by the Konohiki's land, Makai by "Waianaē", Kaanapali by the Konohiki's land.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by "Paunau", Olowalu by my land, Makai by Judge Parson's land, Kaanapali by Kuokoa's land.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki's land, Olowalu by Koakoa's land, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by "Kuholilea".

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Kuokoa's land, Olowalu by the creek of Kahoma, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by Kuokoa's land. (v. 7/190)

9795 B Kaaua

This claimant appeared and made oath that he had sent in his claim to the Land Commission in 1847. The Commission then resolved to hear the claim.

Ilae sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, it is in two pieces, in Aki, Lahaina. No. 1 is a House lot. No 2 a Pauku of Kalo land.

The claimant received this from his wife in the days of Hoapili, before 1839. Her parents had it in the days of Kamehameha 2<sup>nd</sup>.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Kaua's land, Olowalu by Wahie's lot, Makai by Kimo's and Kumaena's and my lot, Kaanapali by Namauu's lot.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Kaauwai's land, Olowalu by the creek of Kapoulu, Makai by "Uhau", Kaanapali by "Moalii." (v. 7/190-191)

9795 C Kealohapalani W.

Kahia sworn. I delivered this woman's claim to Namauu and Momona in January 1848. The claim was in the name of her husband Kulolohe. He is since dead and the woman is his heir.

Nahau sworn. I know the land of the claimant, it is in one piece of land in "Bolabola", Lahaina.

The claimant received it from Kekauonohi in 1839, and she has held it without dispute ever since.

It is bounded Mauka by Nakaulea's land, Olowalu by "Waianae", Makai by Makaulia's land, Kaanapali by "Haleu." (v. 7/191)

9795 D Kaua

This man appeared and made oath that he had sent his claim in for this land in Feb. before the 14<sup>th</sup> of the year 1848.

Kahikona sworn. I know the land here claimed. It is an Ili of land in "Kuahaua" in "Kekekuloa", Kaanapali. There is one Kanaka on this Ili and there is one Loi belonging to the Aupuni a Loi Paakai, it is in one piece.

This claimant received this land from Pikanele in 1838 and his title is not disputed to this day. (v. 7/191)

9795 E Kahikona

The claimant appeared and made oath that he had sent in a claim for a Ahupuaa of land in Kona, Hawaii, called "Onouli" before Feb. 1848 and also for an Ili of land in "Pauwela", "Hamakualoa", Maui. The Commission resolved to hear his claim.

Keaweluaole sworn. I know the Ahupuaa of Omouli on Hawaii. It belongs to the claimant. He received it from Kuahini in 1821 and held it without dispute up to 1845, when Kanaina took it away from him, because he would not live under him and Lunalilo.



L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the land of the claimant's wife in "Pauwela", Hamakualoa. Her name is Lonokahikini.

The claimant received it from her father in the days of Kamehameha 1 and held it up to 1842 in peace. Then Daniel li took it away from her and still holds it. He took it away because she was Konohiki. It is in 8 pieces of land in 3 Iliis.

The names of the Ili are "Kapuna" and "Noni" and "Hoopauwahu". They are 3 sections of Kalo and five Kula land, but I don't know the bounds. (v. 7/191-192)

478 Nui fr. 13 page

This claim is identical with NO. 4804 heard on the 30<sup>th</sup> of May 1849. (v. 7/192)

9795 F Kaumauma

The claimant appeared and made oath that he sent in his claim in January 10<sup>th</sup>, 1848.

Ua sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, it is in "Nakalepo", Lahaina, it is in 4 pieces. No. 1 is a House lot, and 2 Moos, No. 2 is 10 small Moos, No. 3 of 2 Moos of Kula, No. 4 is a pauku of Kalo land.

The claimant received it from Daniel li in the year 1834. This title has never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Daniela li, Olowalu by "Aupohopoko" Ahupuaa, Makai by Daniel li, Kaanapali by Palau.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by the creek of Moalii, Olowalu by Daniel li, Makai and Kaanapali sides by Ua's land.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Aupokopoko, Olowalu by Daniel li, Makai by Palau, Kaanapali by the creek of "Moalii."

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by "Puuuoa", Olowalu by Kelawea, Makai by my land, Kaanapali by the creek of Kanaha. (v. 7/192-193)

9795 G Ua

The claimant appeared and made oath that he has sent in his claim in January 10<sup>th</sup> 1848.

Kaumauma sworn. This lands is in three pieces, the first piece consists of 5 Moos, the second piece of 4 Moos, the third piece of Pauku of Kalo with one Poalima patch within.

The claimant received these lands from Daniel li in 1831. This title has never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Kaa's land, Olowalu by the Konohiki's land, Makai by Puunoa, Kaanapali by Puunoa and Aa's land.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Mai's land, Makai by Hanakaoo, Kaanapali by the Poalima of li.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by my land, Olowalu by Kelaweo, Makai by Mai's land, Kaanapali by the creek of Kanaka. (v. 7/193)

9795 H Moakaka W. (entered Naamalia 2320)

The claimant appeared and made oath that she has sent in her claim in Dec. 11<sup>th</sup> 1847.

Kealohapalani sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in "Moalii", Lahaina. It consist of three pieces, No. 1 consists of Kula land, No. 2 of Kalo land, 15 Lois in number with 2 Poalima Lois within, No. 3 is a House lot.

She had these lands from the days of Kamehameha 1. Her title to the first piece has never been disputed but the Kalo has been disputed. No 2 has been disputed but it was restored to her in the year 1848.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Keawa, Olowalu and Makai sides by the same, Kaanapali by Nahale.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Kaeie's land, Olowalu by Kekualele's land the creek of Kanaha, Makai by the creek of Kanaha, Kaanapali by Waianaenui.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Kaei's land, Olowalu by Keawa's land, Makai by Kau's land, Kaanapali by Kalama's land. (v. 7/193-194)

2871 Kanealii W.

Keaweluaole sworn. The land of the claimant are in Paunau, Lahaina. It consists of two pieces, one of House lot and another of Kalo land.

The claimant received the House lot from Maluo in the year 1837. Her title has never been disputed to the House lot.

It is bounded Mauka by Puehuowali, Olowalu by Haleu, loi of Auwaa, Makai by the Poalima of Mr. Kekuanaoa, Kaanapali by Mr. Kekuanaoa's land.

Kaawa sworn. The Kalo lands of the claimant are in Paunau, Lahaina, it consists of three pieces.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the creek of Paunau, Olowalu by the pali of Paunau, Makai by Kanana's land, Kaanapali by Kanana's land and the creek of Paunau.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by the creek of Kahoma, Olowalu by the pali of Paunau, Makai by the land of Keaka, Kaanapali by the creek of Kahoma.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by the Poalima of Kekuanaoa, Olowalu and Makai and Kaanapali sides by Niu's land. (v. 7/194)

#### 477 Kekualele

Makanalau sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant are in Paunau, Lahaina.

The claimant received this land from Malue about the year 1836. This title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Kaawa's lot, Olowalu by the same, Makai by the Alanui Aupuni, Kaanapali by the road leading to Lahainaluna. (see claim 6391) (v. 7/194-195)

#### 477 B Kenalo

The claimant appeared and made oath that he has sent in his claims on the 27<sup>th</sup> of January 1848 for a piece of land called Polipoli in Napoko.

Keiauuai sworn. The claimant's land are in Polipoli. Postponed for further hearing at Wailuku. (see claim 6433) (v. 7/195)

#### 477 C Lalahi W.

The claimant appeared and made oath that she has sent in her claim in Feb. 15 1847.

Moakaka sworn. The land of the claimant are in Kapuwakea. It consist of two pieces, one of Kalo land, another of Kula land.

She received it from Koa in the days of Hoapili.

Kanalo sworn that the claimants land consists of five pieces. No. 1 consist of 5 Lois, No. 2 of 2 Lois, No. 3 of one Loi, No. 4 of one Loi, No. 5 of Kula land.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki's land, Olowalu by Wahie's land, Makai by Waiakane a fish pond, Kaanapali by the Konohiki's.

Nothing intelligent can be got out of this witness. (v. 7/195)

477 D Kahiamoe [525]

The claimant appeared and made oath that he gave his claim to Mr. Richards and Kaauwai when they were here in 1846.

Ua sworn. I know the lands of the claimant. It consist of three pieces. One a House lot in Moanui 2, and another piece a section of Kalo land in Kahiuaohē, and the last piece a section of Kula land in Kalimaohe.

The claimant has this House lot through his father from the days of Kamehameha 1 without dispute. The other lands he had from his wife's father Kapolo in the days of Hoapili, and his title to these is without dispute.

The first piece is bounded Mauka by the Govt road, Olowalu by Kapule's yard, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Kaihukai's yard.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by the loi of Napaalua, Kaanapali by the loi of Palaualelo, Olowalu by the pali of Kelawea, Makai by the loi of Napaalua.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> piece is bounded Mauka by Aupokopoko, Ololwalu by Mahoe's loi, Makai by Nakapaalua's land, Kaanapali by Keopenui's land. (v. 7/195-196)

477 E Ladana

L. Kaauwai says he remember the claim of Ladana to have been handed to Mr. Richards. Upon this the Commission resolved to hear it.

Kekualele sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in "Hopili", Lahaina. They consist of 2 pieces, one a House lot and another a section of Kalo land.

He received the House lot from Kaua, in the days of Hoapili before 1839, and he received the Kalo land from his father in law Mapea in the same time, and he has held them without dispute.

The first piece is bounded Mauka by Paeohi, Olowalu by "Panauoa", Makai by Kuakamauna's yard, Kaanapali by "Kopili 2".

The second piece is bounded Mauka by "Kopili 2, Olowalu by the creek of "Kanaha", Makai and Kaanapali sides by Waiane.

The claimant said he had one other lot for which John Young is the last witness as he gave him the land.

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the other House lot of the claimant in Lapakea, Lahaina. I have always heard that he received this lot from John Young in 1842, and he has possessed it ever since so far as I have heard without dispute.

(See John Young.)

It is bounded Mauka by the main street of Lahaina, Olowalu by the yard of Govt House, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by the yard of Namauu. (v. 7/196-197)

2546 Lipi from 162 page

6675 fr 741. Kaulapea Jader

There is a dispute or rather contradiction as to the bounds. (v. 7/197)

477 F Kelupu

The claimant appeared and made oath that he had sent in his claim for seven Lois claimed by Wahineahuli in cl. 3116 and a House lot in Lahaina, and a section of Kalo land in "Honokohau" in the life time of Mr. Richards.

Makewa sworn. I know the House lot of the claimant at Lahaina in "Wahikuli" and his section of Kalo land in "Honokohau" it consists of 38 Lois.

He had the House lot from his parents in the days of Kamehameha 1 and his title to the same has never been disputed. He received the Kalo land in Honokohau from Keahanui in 1846, the head man of Namauu paing for the same the rent of three dollars per year. If he fails to pay this sum then it returns to Namauu.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by the Alanui Aupuni, Olowalu by the land of Luaikai, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Mr. Chandler's House lot.

The land at Honokohau is in the Ili of "Lipuu 4" and is bounded Mauka by Kekai's loi, Olowalu by the creek of Honokohau, Makai by "Lipuu 2", Kahakaloa by the pali by Honokohau.

L. Hanomo sworn. I know the seven Lois of the claimant in Puunoo, and they are the same which are claimed by Wahineahuli in cl. 3116, page 144.

These Lois were forsaken by Wahineahuli in 1842 and I then took the land being the Luna of Puunoo, and gave them to the claimant and he has held them without dispute except Wahineahuli. The claimant has paid the taxes and gone to the Poalima work and worked the land. (v. 7/197-198)

486 Ku W. Fr. 145 p.

This claim was partly on Monday June 11. Hoapili now appears to justify his taking away of 1/3 spoken of by Kenaka.

Kahiamoe sworn. I know the piece of land in dispute between Hanemo (Namauu's head man) and Ku. It is the Mauka third of the lot. Formerly all this lot was Panelaau's, the father of Ku. This one third was given up, however to Namauu in 1831 by Panelaau. (v. 7/198)

484 B Maikai and Kaluapakohana

L. Kaauwai stated that he well remembered that the claimants had sent in their claims to Mr. Richards in 1846.

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the claimants land, it is a House lot in Lahaina.

The claimants received it from Pupuka in 1837 and their title was never disputed until 1849, when the heir of Pupuka made her some little trouble about the boundaries. See Pupuka's claim.)

It is bounded Mauka by the Seaman's Chapel road, Olowalu by the road to Lahainaluna, Makai by Kanaina's yard, Kaanapali by Pupuka's yard.

It is in a common yard with Pupuka's, but the boundary is plain and it is well known to me. (v. 7/198-199)

353 Lani (Serang)

Kaauwai remembers this claim to have been sent in.

Kahiamoe sworn. I know the House lot of Lani (alias Serang a Hindoo). It is in Kainehe, Lahaina.

The claimant received it from his wife Puipui in the days of King Liholiho and his title has never been disputed.

It is fenced and the fence is the correct boundary. It is bounded Mauka by the Main street, Olowalu by Moanui, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Pihalaalau's lot.

He has two pieces of Kula in Moalii, Lahaina. He received them from Paakai in 1846 and Paakai had from Polea in the olden days of Hoapili. His title is without dispute.

The first piece is bounded Mauka by Alamihi, Olowalu and Makai side by Paakai's land, Kaanapali by Hanalu's.

The second piece is bounded Mauka by Mokuniu's land, Olowalu by Hanalu's land, Makai by Paakai's land, Kaanapali by Hanalu's land. (v. 7/199)

486 B Kaei

Kaauwai remember that Kaei's claim was sent in before Feb. 14, 1848.

Kaiwi sworn. I know the lands of the claimant is in Moalii, Lahaina. One piece of Kula and one piece of Kalo land of 25 Lois.

The claimant received them from Keawe and Keawe from Kikuanaoa in 1846. His title is without dispute.

The piece of Kula and 3 Lois is bounded Mauka by "Uhou", Olowalu by Waiee an Ili, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Wahikuli and Kapunahea.

The Kalo land is bounded Mauka by Lapakea, Olowalu by the creek of Kanaha and Punawai, Makai by Moakaka's land, Kaanapali by the pali of Waianae. There are 2 Poalima Lois in this last piece. (v. 7/199-200)

486 D Poopuaa

L. Kaauwai said this man's claim had been sent in to his knowledge.

Kekeli sworn. I know these lands, they are in two pieces in "Puunoa", Lahaina, one a House lot, and one a Pauku of Kalo land.

The claimant received his House lot from his father in vag an ancient times before I was born.

The Kalo land he received from Haneneo, but it was in 1849 and of course he sent in to claim for it.

The House lot is bounded Mauka by Namauu's land, Olowalu by Hanemo's land, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by Ku's yard. (v. 7/200)

Olowalu June 18<sup>th</sup> 1848

The Commission Commenced labors this morning at Olowalu. L. Kaauwai and W.L. Lee present. Lot Kamehameha acting as interpreter and Uaua as Native Clerk. (v. 7/200)

5737 Keakaikawai

Pakamoai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in Olowalu and consists of 3 pieces. One a House lot, and one a section of Kalo land up Mauka and the last piece of Kula land.

The claimant received his lands from the King's Mother in the days of Kamehameha 1 and his title has never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Naea's land, Hana by the same, Makai by Maui's land, Kaanapali by the Govt fence.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Keahi and Naea's land, Hana and Makai and Kaanapali by the same.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Naea's land and the other three sides by the same. (v. 7/200-201)



4376 Keahi

Lupe sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in Olowalu in the Ili of "Puukoleohilo", they consist of 10 pieces.

No. 1 is 28 Moos of Kula land, No. 2 is 17 Moos of Kula land and 5 Lois, No. 3 a section of Kalo land, No. 4 of one Loi, No. 5 of 5 Lois, No. 6 of 7 Lois, No. 7 of one Loi, No. 8 of 2 Lois, No. 9 of a Pauku of Kalo land, No. 10 is Kula and Mountain land.

The claimant received these lands from his ancestors and they left them to him in the days of Kamehameha 1. His title has never been disputed and he has always enjoyed them in peace.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the waste kula belongs to the Govt, Hana by Naea's Poalima, Makai by the Govt lot, Kaanapali by the Govt kula.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by the Govt kula, Hana by Naea's Poalima, Makai by Alapai's land and the Paahao, Kaanapali by the Pali of Olowalu.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by the Govt Kula, Hana by Kalai's land, Makai by Kepaule's land, Kaanapali by Pelekune's land.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Kekona's land, Hana by Kalai's land, Makai by Piikea's land, Kaanapali by Pelekune's land.

No. 5 is bounded Mauka by the kula of the Govt, Hana by Moku's land, Makai by Kalai's land, Kaanapali by Kukona's land.

No. 6 is bounded Mauka by Kahalelaau's land, Hana by my land, Makai by Keakaikawai's land, Kaanapali by the Govt kula.

Kamakahi sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, they are in two pieces in "Kaumukukahi", Olowalu.

The claimant received this land from Kekahi, his grandfather in the days of Kamehameha 1 and his title has never been disputed.

Kuluio sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, it is one piece of Kalo land in "Uwai", and one Loi in the Ili of "Pualoa", both in Ukumehame.

The claimant received this land from J. Kapena the Konohiki in the year 1843 and his title is without dispute.

The piece in Uwai is bounded Mauka by Namauu's land, Hana by the creek of Ukumehame, Makai by Nahahi's land, Kaanapali by "Pualoa".

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by my land, Hana by the creek of Ukumehame, Makai by Kalua's land, Kaanapali by Kaou's land. (v. 7/222)

Puku W. sworn. The claimant is dead and her heirs I don't know. Her husband's name is Kanakahaole.

The claimant received this lands from Kauahuliwaa before 1839, and her title was never disputed up to his death this present year.

Painahala sworn. I know the lands of the claimant, there is one piece in "Puolaia", Olowalu and there is a House lot in the Ili of "Kaluaha", Olowalu.

The claimant received these lands from Naea, the Konohiki, in 1834, and has held them without dispute up to this time.

Kanakaole sworn. I heard Kaka says in the year 1843 to the claimant I don't wish this land and I will give it you and go and live on my son's land in Honuaula, Mahulu has tilled the land ever since.

L. Kaauiwai sworn for Pawaa. I know the land in dispute. In 1826 I lived here and this land there belonged to Kaka. In 1827 I received some of the Loi in the disputed section. Kaka lived on this land until 1842, when he died. Before he said his wife and children. They enjoyed this land until the year 1845 when Mahulu as Luna took away this land for the first time. When he took it away Opunui the son of Pawaa was working it.

Kalawa recalled. The House lot and Kula piece is bounded Mauka and Hana sides by Naea's land, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by my land.

He received it from his wife and his wife from Pikanele's wife. This was in 1832 and his title has never been disputed to this day.

It is bounded Mauka by the pali of Waikapu, Hana by Kapena's land, Makai by the sea shore, Kaanapali by "Olowalu".

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the land of the claimant on Molokai. It is the Ahupuaa of "Kaamola 1". The claimant has divided this land with the King and half of it now belongs to him truly (see the Book in Mr. Young's Office). Kaua is a Luna for him, this is the same land mentioned in Claim 10225.

I know the land of the claimant in Kona, Hawaii, it is three Ilis in the Ahupuaa of "Keauhou", called "Puuloa" and "Kumuniu", and "Kamuku" are the names of these lands. Here is but one native on these lands. His name is Kupaka.

The claimant received these lands from Hoapili Kane in 1824, and his title to them has never been disputed.

He has also one Ili of land called "Pokoniuhai" in Puna, Hawaii, in the Ahupuaa of "Keaau".

The claimant received this Ili from Hoapili Kane in 1825 and his title has never been disputed. I don't know how many natives are on this Ili once there were 13 perhaps, there are none now.

I also know that he has an Ili of land in Waikapu, Maui, it is called "Palaelaehaa." There is one Poalima Loi within this.

He received this land from Kekaulohe in 1826 and has had undisturbed possess of it ever since. There are two natives on it I don't remember their names.

The claimant also has an Ili of land in Honokowai, Maui, called "Moomuku", which he received in 1844 or 1845 from Gov. Adams of Hawaii, and his title has never been disputed for the Ili. There are 7 natives who have some claims in this Ili, for they live on and help to work the land. There are 8 Poalima Lois in this Ili. There was also a Kapa or half of the Ahupuaa of Honokowai given to him by Gov. Adams in 1846. He was made the Luna of it by Gov. Adams and Gov. Kekuanaoa put an end to his Konohikiship in 1846.

The claimant has also three Ahupuaa's of land in Koolau, Maui, two of them "Makapupu 1" and "Makapupu 2", the third is called "Honoluheiki."

The claimant received these lands from Kekaulohe in 1843 and his title has never been disputed. There are about 30 natives on this land perhaps and they have their tenants rights. They are small lands and there are 7 Lois of Poalima within them.

The claimant has also a land called "Alamihi, an Ahupuaa of land in Lahiana, Maui, which he received from Hoapili Wahine in 1835 and has held it without dispute ever since.

The King is the great Lord over him. There are some Poalima lois within it but I cannot say how many. (v. 7/225-226)

10225 David Malo

This claim is included in the general claim of D. Malo No. 370 just heard. (v. 7/226)

5410 David Malo

This claim is identical with no. 3702. (v. 7/227)

6659 David Malo

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the lands of the claimant included in this claim. They consist of one piece of land in "Moalii", and one piece in "Pakala", Lahaina.

The claimant received the land in Moalii from Kuakini or Gov. Adams in 1838 or 1839, and has possessed it ever since in peace. It is Kalo land mostly.

The claimant received the lands in 1843, but their ancestors who possessed them in ancient times.

The claimant has disputed with Mahoe about this Loi ever since he took it away. Mahoe's son was present and said he knew of no reason why his father took away this Loi.

The claimant received this land from his ancestors in ancient times. They possessed it from the days of Kamehameha 1. His title was never disputed up to his death in 1848. His heir is his widow Haiole.

called the Waikapu Hotel on account of the Wailuku people stopping there. I never heard the claimant's rights disputed till this year. (v. 7/469)

This claim which was partly heard yesterday was resumed today. Mr. Thomas Guemsey who leased the land from Mr. Louzada appeared to represent him and offered in support of Mr. Louzada's claim the following witnesses.

William Humphrey's. Sworn for Louzada. I know the House lot in dispute. It was once waste land outside of Mr. Wm. Crowningburgh's land and fence. It was Government Kula and Pika went there to take care of Government cattle in 1840 or 1841, and then fenced the lot and built a house on it. He lived there in peace until 184-, when the foreigners of Waikapu hired the lot from Pika and built a School House. There were two houses on it, and one blew down, and the other burnt down in 1845.

It then lay waste until about two years since when Mr. Louzada rose his fence around the whole or a part of it, and it was surveyed by Mr. Metcalf as part of his land. I once had this land given to me by Napuupahoe who owned the land before Pika took it up, but I thought it of so little value that I did not improve it. Louzada's rights is based upon the assertion of Kanaina that he could take all that belonged to the land. I suppose that the House being burned, he thought no one would ever want or occupy it, and thus enclosed it.

Kealuolelo sworn for Louzada says. I am James Louzada's Father in Law. I know the House lot in dispute. This witnesses testimony was substantially the same as that of Mr. Humphreys. When Mr. Louzada first went to built his fence he was going to include about half of it, but no one finding any fault, he inclosed the whole, and when Mr. Metcalf came to survey it no one appeared to say why do ye so?

Mr. Thomas Hermessy agent for Mr. James Louzada said as it was included in James Louzada's Survey he would give \$17.50 for the lot, and the claimants Naehu and Luukia agreed to take it and withdraw their claim. The money to be paid in one month from this date or the claim not to be withdrawn. (v. 7/514-515)

499 Auwae

Keawe sworn. The claimant's land in Waiehu consist of one piece of 4 Lois in the Ahupuaa of Polipoli, in the Ili of Halelau. He is Konohiki of the whole Ahupuaa but owns only this land truly.

Lani is the son of Pilipo wahine by her first husband, Manuela and they wish their lands to be heard together and have but one claim.
