MAUI Wailuku

Foreign Testimony Vol. 8

8459 Kuaele Wailuku July 23, 1849

Hoolana sworn. The claimant's land consists of four pieces in Wailuku, Maui.

No. 1 is a section of Lois in Papohaku, No. 2 is one Loi in Papohaku, No. 3 is 3 section of Lois in Kapalaalana, No. 4 is one Loi in Kapalaalana.

The claimant received no. 1 from Eleele before 1830. No. 2 from Moo in 1843, and he from his father in olden days. No. 3 from Nuai in the year 1837, and no. 4 from the same man, at the same time. His title is not disputed, nor ever was.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Ehu's land, Waihee by Kaauwai's land, Makai by Keliiaukai's land, Maalaea by Ehu's land.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Oi's or U's land, Waihee by Ehu's land, Makai by U's land, Maalaea by the creek and Poalima lois.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by and, Waihee by Ehu's land and Poalima lois, Makai by Kamakananaua's land, Maalaea by the creek of Wailuku.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Moo's land, Waihee by Naea's land, on other two sides by Moo's land. (v. 8/1)

4674 Pookee

Hoolana sworn. The claimant's land consist of one section of 8 Lois in the Ili of Papohaku, Maui.

The claimant received it from Kalapa in 1846, and he from Haauwai in 1843 and he from Governor Aumakeha. His title is not disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Keliiunui's land, Waihee by L. Kaaui's land, Makai by Kepio's land, Maalaea by Ehu's land. (v. 8/1)

4961 Keliiukau

Hoolana sworn. The claimant's land consist of 2 pieces so far as I know them.

Namely, No. 1 is a piece of 3 Lois in the Ili of Papohaku, Maui, No. 2 is 7 Lois in the Ili of Kapalaalaea, Wailuku (He has two other pieces perhaps but so don't know it.)

He received them from as follows: No. 1 from Ehu before 1837, or rather from his father, Kauahupa who had it from the days of Kamehameha 1 and no. 2 he received from Naea in 1837, and his title is not disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Kuaele's land, Waihee by L. Kaaui's land, Makai by Pookee's land, Maalaea by Ehu's land.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by U's land, Waihee by the Poalima lois, Makai by Kanui's land, Maalaea by the Poalima of Kalawaiahnue. (v. 8/2)

4385 Kuakaha

Moanalua sworn. The claimant's land is a Pauku of Lois and one Kula in Lamalii, Wailuku, Maui.

The claimant received it from me in 1837 and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by my land, Waihee by my land and Poalima of Naea, Makai by Pooa's land, Maalaea by the King's Eka. (v. 8/2)

3372 Pohuka W.

This claimant is dead and her claim was heard on the 12th of July 1849, under the claim of her heir Ehu. (See cl. 3214, Ehu claimant).(v. 8/2)

4378 Kuwaha

Hoolana sworn. The claimant's land consists of 15 Lois in the Ili of Auhaka, Wailuku, Maui.

He received it from his parents or rather father who had it from the days of Kamehameha 1. His title was not disputed u to his death in April. His widow Kanana and his children are his heirs.

It is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Pohakuui, Waihee by the creek of Wailuku, Makai by the Ili of Lamalii, Maalaea by the Ili of Waiaka. (v. 8/2-3)

3294 Moo

Moomooiki sworn. I know the claimant's land. It is one piece Lois in the Ili of Halelani, Wailuku.

The claimant received it from Kanakaole in 1843 and he from B. Makune, and he from the King. His title was not disputed until 1848, when the man from whom he received it took it away. The claimant is very sick and cannot attend the Commission.

It is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Puakea, Waihee and Makai sides by Kalawaiahonu's land, Maalaea by the Pali. (v. 8/3)

3294 B Moomooiki

Napela sworn. I wrote out Moomooiki's claim in December 1847 and sent it to the Land Commission at Oahu.

Kauhi sworn. The claimant's land consist of 2 pieces in Wailuku, Maui.

No. 1 is a Moo of Kalo and House lot in the Ili of Pohakupukupuku, No. 2 is a Moo of Kalo in the Ili of Kapalaalaea.

He received no. 1 from Kaniaa the Judge at Hamakua in 1843 and he from the Queen, and no. 2 from Paiwa in the reign of Kamehameha II. The claimant's title was never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the Government land, Waihee by the Ili of Kahuwa, Makai by the Ili of Waikani, Maalaea by Puuki an Ili.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Umieu, Waihee by the Ili of Puuoki, Makai by the Ili of Waikani, Maalaea by the Ili of Umieu. (v. 8/3)

3294 C Ihuole

The claimant made oath that Kahale the Luna Aechoa [?] of Wailuku wrote out his claim and that it was sent in to the Commission in January 1848.

Hoolana sworn. The claimant's land consists of one Moo of Kalo land in the Ili of Papohaku, Wailuku, Maui.

The claimant received it from L. Kaauwai in 1845 and he from Gov. Namakeha, and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by L. Kaauwai's land, Waihee by Naea's land, Makai by Kaulahea's and my land, Maalaea by the King's Eka. (v. 8/4)

3294 D Kahue

The claimant made oath that Naleipuleho wrote out and sent in his claim in December 1847.

Hoolana sworn. The claimant's land consists of two pieces in Wailuku, Maui.

No. 1 is a Moo of Kalo land in Papohaku, No. 2 is 2 Lois of Kalo land in Kapalaalaea.

The claimant received no. 1 from Kalapa in the year 1846 and he from L. Kaauwai, and he from Gov. Namakeha, and no. 2 from Naai in 1843 and he from Kalawaiahonu in olden times. His title is not disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka and all sides by L. Kaauwai's land.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Kuapue's land, Waihee by Loiweae's land, Makai by Naai's land, Maalaea by Paho'a's land. (v. 8/4)

3387 Poolilii

Moomooiki sworn. The claimant's land is 9 Lois in the Ili of Kahewa, Wailuku, Maui.

He received them from me in 1843 and I from Kalama the Queen. His title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by "Kaluaoopu" an ili, Waihee the same, Makai by the ili of Waikani, Maalaea by the ili of Pohakupukupu. (v. 8/4-5)

3470 Kaihuanu

L. Kaauwai sworn. The claimant's land consists of three pieces in the district of Wailuku, Maui.

No. 1 is one Loi in Halaula 3, No. 2 is 2 Lois in Halaula 3, No. 3 is one Loi in Umieu.

The claimant received no. 1 and 2 from Anehe in 1831, and no. 3 from Mauhilo before 1839, and his title has not been disputed except to no. 1 and 2. Kaumu put in claim for them in 1846 and took them away. The claimant is a constable and did not go to the Poalima, because the Governor, or law excepted such officers from such work, and therefore Kaumu took these pieces away in 1846. The claimant died in 1848 and his wife Hina is his heir in connection with his child.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka and Waihee sides by Puaa's land, Makai by Kaniu's land, Maalaea by the Pali.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka and Waihee sides by my land, Makai by Pepee's land, Maalaea by the Pali.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka and all sides by Mauhili's land. (v. 8/7)

Commenced hearing the Claims of Waihee Wailuku July 24, 1849 (v. 8/5)

2383 L. Kaauwai

Kaili sworn. I know the lands here claimed. They are four pieces in Kula, Maui. They are as follows:

No. 1 is a Potato Patch in the Ahupuaa of Waiakoa, No. 2 is a Potato patch in the Ahupuaa of Maopio, No. 3 is a Sweet Potato patch in the Ahupuaa of Maopio, No. 4 is a Irish Potato patch in the Ahupuaa of Kaliaimu.

The claimant received no. 1 from Kaiahua in 1837, no. 2 and 3 from Kaahumanu 1 in 1831 or 1832, and no. 4 from Maikaaloa in the year 1841 and he from the King. His title was never disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the land of Kailianu, Honuaula by Moeauna's and Ulunui's land, Makai by Maia's land, Makawao by Napela's Poalima and Kailiaini's.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by the Government land, Honuaula by "Kiona", Makai by Moeanu's land, Makawao by Keohokalole's and my land.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Keekee's land, Honuaula by my land, Makai by Kapala's land, Makawao by my land.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Keakaikawai's land, Honuaula by the Government land, Makai by the same, Makai by Kaaiwoowo's land. (v. 8/5-6)

3113 Kauakahi

Kawaa sworn. The claimant's lands in Waihee are all I know. They consist of four pieces in Waihee, Maui.

No. 1 is a Kalo and Kula land in Koiahi, No. 2 is a Kalo land in Koiahi, No. 3 is 5 Fish Ponds in Koiahi, No. 4 is a House lot in Kiokio.

The claimant received these lands from the Governor of Maui, Hoapili wahine and Kekauluohi the Premier in 1843. His title has never been disputed. There is one Poalima in no. 3 and two in no. 1.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Pea's land, Kahakuloa by "Kiokio" an ili, Makai by the Paahao lois and Govt. lot, Wailuku by the ili of Kalepelepa.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Komeke's land, Kahakuloa by the creek of Waihee, Makai by Pea's land, Wailuku by the Poalima lois.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Napela's and the Govt land, Kahakuloa by the ili of Kapoakea, Makai by the sea, Wailuku by Kapoho an ili.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Laupahulu's land, Kahakuloa by the Pali, Makai by the same, Wailuku by the Paahao lois.

The claimant's wife appeared and said the claimant had no title to land at Lahaina or Molokai. (v. 8/6)

4005 Hoauaeppuu

Kaholoaulani sworn. The claimant's land consists of one large piece of Kalo , Kula and House lot in the Ili of Holili, Waihee, Maui.

The claimant received it from Hawaii in 1820 and his title has never been disputed. There are 4 Poalima loi in it.

It is bounded Mauka by the ili of Pahukauwila, Kahakuloa by the ili of Kapuina, Makai by the ili of Halelani, Wailuku by Kawilioho's land. (v. 8/7)

4277 Kaholoaulani

Hoauaepuu sworn. The claimant's land consists of three pieces in Waihee, Maui.

No. 1 is a section of 27 Lois in Kahilinamaia, No. 2 is a section of 7 Lois in Halelani, No. 3 is a House lot in Holile.

The claimant received no. 1 from Kamaka in 1829, and no. 2 from Kekahuna at the same time, and no. 3 from me in the same year or near them. His title has never been disputed. There is one Poalima loi in no. 1.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the ili of Lauhue, Kahakuloa by the Govt lot, Makai by Kamaka's land, Wailuku by the ili of Halepahu.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by my land, Kahakuloa by the ili of Kapuna, Makai by Kahuna's land, Waihee by the Govt land.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka and all sides by my land. (v. 8/7)

5355 Napela

Pumawaa sworn. The claimant's land in Waihee, Maui consist of one piece of Kula in the Ili of Ohia.

He received it form his parents who had it in ancient days. His title was never disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by the road and Konohiki's land, Kahakuloa by the Pali, Makai by the same, Wailuku by the road leading from the Mountain to the sea. (v. 8/7)

3866 Pumawaa and Kahanu

Kekahuna sworn. The land of the claimants consists of 4 pieces in Waihee, Maui.

No. 1 is the Ili of Alae, No. 2 is a section of Lois in Kalepelepe 1, No. 3 is a section of Lois and Kula in Kalepelepe 2, No. 4 is one Moo of Kalo in Puulolo.

The claimants received no. 1 from Hawaii in 1829, no. 2 they received from Kealoha in 1843, and he from Kuilulani, and he from Gov. Kekuanaoa. No. 3 from me in 1843 and I from Kuikelani and he from Kekuanaoa, and no. 4 from Kealoha in 1843 and his title to it is the same as to no. 2. His title has never been disputed. There are 3 Poalima lois in no. 1 and one in no. 3.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the ili of Lepeo, Kahakuloa by the Pali, Makai by the ili of Honuakaua, Wailuku by the Pali.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by "Papaehia", Kahakuloa by the creek of Waihee, Makai by the ili of Kalepelepe 2, Wailuku by the ili of Paulani.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by my land, Kahakuloa by the creek of Waihee, Makai by the Paahao lois, Wailuku by the ili of Paulani.

No. 4 is bounded Mauka by Hapailua's land, Kahakuloa by Kamakaaloa's land, Makai by Kuihelani's Fish Pond, Wailuku by Hananui's land. (v. 8/8)

4303 Kekahuna cl. 4304 Keaweolu

Kamuikaaloa sworn. I know the lands of Kekahuna and of his father Keaweolu. Keaweolu died in 1848 and left all he had to his son Kekahune. The lands of father and son consist of three pieces in Waihee, Maui.

No. 1 is a section of Kalo in Kalepelepe, No. 2 is a section of Kalo and House lot in Kalepelepe 1, No. 3 is one Loi in Koiahi.

No. 1 and 2 they received from Kuihelani in 1843 and he from Kekuanaoa, and no. 3 from Aki in 1829. His title has never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Pumaiwaa's land, Kahakuloa by the creek of Waihee, Makai by Kahanu's land, Wailuku by Kahikiula's land.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Napela's land, Kahakuloa by Kulae's land, Makai by Kuihelani's Fish Pond, Wailuku by my land.

No. 3 is bounded Mauka by Aki's land, Kahakuloa by the same, Makai by Heula's land, Wailuku by Kaamakua's land. (v. 8/8-9)

4304 B Maikaaloa

This claim is a distinct claim without number included under no. 3718.

Kekahuna sworn. The claimant's land consist of one piece of Kalo and Kula land in the Ili of Mookahi, Waihee.

He received it from Auwae in 1829 and his title has never been disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by Puhis land, Kahakuloa by Kuamoo's land, Makai by Kekaula's land, Wailuku by Kahinu's land. (v. 8/9)

3718 Iona

Kahinu sworn. The claimant has one piece of 16 Lois and one Kula in the Ili of Paulani, Waihee, Maui.

The claimant received this land from Kahikiula and Huno in 1836. His title was never disputed. There are 3 Poalima loi in it.

It is bounded Mauka by Kulae's land, Kahakuloa by KWahikuula's land, Makai by Kaino's land, Wailuku by the creek. (v. 8/9)

3710 B Kamakaulii

This claim without number will be found registered under 3718 Iona.

Kaholoaulani sworn. The claimant's land consists of 3 pieces in Waihee, Maui.

No. 1 is 6 Lois in the Ili of Waipae, No. 2 is 2 Lois in the Ili of Holele, No. 3 is 3 Lois and one Kula in Kapuna.

The claimant received no. 1 from KaikinoHopono in 1843 and he from C. Kanaina, and no. 2 from Hoauaepuu in 1829, and no. 3 from Nuhi in 1829. His title was never disputed. There are no Poalimas in either piece.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by Kaanua's land, Kahakuloa by the Konohiki's land, Makai by the ili of Lahue, Wailuku by the creek.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka and all sides by Hoauuapuu's land.

No. 3 is bounded mauka by Puali's land, Kahakuloa by the Konohiki's land, Makai by the sea shore, Wailuku by the ili of Halelani. (v. 8/9-10)

4426 Kahinu

Pi sworn. The claimant has three pieces of land but I know only one of them well. This is a piece of 16 Lois and one Kula in the Ili of Halepahu, Waihee, Maui.

He received it from L. Kaauwai in 1829. His title is not disputed.

This is bounded Mauka by the ili of Lahue, Kahakuloa by the Paahao land, Makai by the Poalima lois, Wailuku by the creek.

Kamakaiwi sworn. The claimant has three Lois in Kauwila and a House lot in the Ili of Kalaninuinaeheehe, Waihee, Maui.

The 3 Lois piece is bounded Mauka by the land of Kanuiheana, Kapakuloa by the Paahao lois, Makai by Nalima's land, Waihee by the Poalima lois.

The House lot is bounded on with no. 1 which it joins. (v. 8/10)

6594 Pi

This claimant has a claim no. 425 which was heard by Mr. Richards and Kaauwai.

Kahinu sworn. The claimant's land is one piece of 24 Lois in the Ili of Kaopilopilo, Kahakuloa, Maui.

The claimant received it from Koloa his wife in 1845 and she from his parents in olden times. His title is not disputed. There are 2 of lois, however, that ought to come out which will leave 22, and there is one Poalima loi in it.

It is bounded Mauka by Hale's land, Kahakuloa by M. Kenui's land, Makai by the same, Waihee by Kahinu's land (not mine). (v. 8/10-11)

2413 Kuaiki

Pu sworn. The claimant's land is one large piece of Kula, Kalo and House lot in the Ili of Puanea, Waihee, Maui.

The claimant received it from Auwae in the year 1829. His title has never been disputed. There are 4 Poalima lois in it.

It is bounded Mauka by the Mountain, Kahakuloa by William's (a foreign) lan, Makai by the Paahao lois, Wailuku by the Ili of Pohakupuka. (v. 8/11)

4274 Kuanea

L. Kaauwai sworn. The claimant's land consists of two pieces in district of Waihee, Maui.

No. 1 is a section of Lois in Pulolo, No. 2 is a section of Lois and House lot in Pulolo and Kapoho.

The claimant received them from me in 1832, and his title is not disputed. There are 3 Poalima lois in each piece.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the Paahao lois, Kahakuloa by Kahananui's land, Makai by the Poalima lois, Wailuku by the ili of Waiakaonaona.

No. 2 is bounded Mauak by the Poalima lois, Kahakuloa by the same, Makai by Puuone or Sand Hill's, Wailuku by Naea's land. (v. 8/11)

3962 Mapukeha

Pu sworn. The claimant's land consists of two pieces in the Ili of Kolohua, Waihee, Maui.

No. 1 is a Moo of Kalo and Kula, No. 2 is a Moo of Kalo and Kula.

The claimant received it from Keliikawaia and his title reaches back to the days of Kamehameha 1. His title was never disputed. The claimant near death. Keliilawaia died in 1847. There is one Poalima loi in no. 1 and two in no. 2.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the Ili of Makaaka, Kahakuloa by the same, Makai by the same, Wailuku by Keola's land.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by the Poalima lois, Kahakuloa by Pelua's land, Makai by the ili of Makaaka, Wailuku by the ili of Kaapoko. (v. 8/11/12)

2423 Kupuahelani

Lupu sworn. The claimant's land consist of one piece of Kalo and Kula land in the Ili of Malaukanaloo, Waihee, Maui.

The claimant received it from me I 1845 and I had it from Kauo in 1843 and she from Kekauloohe. The claimant possessed it in peace up to his death about two weeks since. His heir is his widow Maholowaa.

It is bounded Mauka by Luahini's lot, Kahakuloa by the Poalima lois, Makai by the Ili of Kaapoko, Waihee by my land. (v. 8/12)

2631 Naoho (and not Oho Wauhae as entered in the Register)

Kaakauhima sworn. The claimant's land consist of one piece of Kalo and Kula land in Pahihi, Waihee, Maui.

The claimant received it form Kualii in the year 1833 or thereabouts. His title was never disputed.

It is bounded Mauka by the Mountains, Kahakuloa by Paluhi's land, Makai by the Konohiki's land, Wailuku by the ili of Haleleha. (v. 8/12)

2655 Palulu

Naohe sworn. The claimant's land is one large piece of Kalo and Kula land in Pahihi, Waihee, Maui.

The claimant received it from Kualii about 1833. His title was never disputed. Thre are 2 Poalima lois in it.

It is bounded Mauka by Puu's land, Kahakuloa by Kaluahine's land, Makai by Puu's land, Wailuku by Naoho or my land. (v. 8/12-13)

2421 J. L. Kaawa

Naohe sworn. The claimant's land consist of one large piece of 49 Lois and Kula in the Ili of Pahihi, Waihee, Maui.

The claimant received it form Kahula in 1845 and he from Kekauloohi the Premier. There was never any disputed about his title. There are 5 Poalima lois in it.

It is bounded Mauka by the Government lot, Kahakuloa by Palulu's land, Makai by the Paahao lois, Wailuku by my land.

L. Kaaui sworn. The claimant has one land of 11 Lois in the Ili of Kipapa, Ahikuli, Maui.

He received it from Kawailoki in the year 1841, and he from Pualinui in the same year, and he from Kaunakini in 1840, and he from Laanui in the same year, and he from Pua in the reign of Kamehameha II. His title was disputed wrong fully in 1845, but there has been no disputed about it since.

It is bounded Mauka by the Paahao lois, Kahakuloa by the Ahupuaa of Polipoli, on other two sides by Kane's land.

(Noted by E. Bailey sect. Comm, dated Dec. 19, 1854, to whom the Award was sent to cite parties upon disputed. The Parties have not appeared to rectify it, and the award was returned.) (v. 8/13)

2422 Kaale

J. L. Kaawa sworn. The claimant's land consists of two pieces in Waihee, Maui.

No. 1 is a section of Lois in Pukauolu, No. 2 is a section of Lois and Kula in the Ili of Kaapoko.

No. 1 he received from Luhiau in the days of Kamehameha 1, and no. 2 from Kukae in 1843, and he from Kaweluhea, and he from Kuikelani, and he from Gov. Kekuanaoa. His title has never been disputed.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the Govt lot, Kahakuloa by Pahuwai's land, Makai by Kahoe's land, Wailuku by the ili of Waipakua.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by Kukae's land, Kahakuloa by the creek, Makai by Kukae's land, Wailuku by Kapiu's land. (v. 8/13-14)

4287 Kalaikalohe

Namakahikieha sworn. The claimant's land consists of two pieces in Waihee, Maui.

No. 1 is 3 Moos of Kalo and Kula in Makaaha, No. 2 is 1 Loi and House lot in Pahaalele.

The claimant received no. 1 from his wife Kuapuu in 1843 and she from Kuihelani, and he from Gov. Kekuanaoa. His title was never disputed. There is one Poalima loi in no. 1.

No. 1 is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki's kula, Kahakuloa by Kaloleikekapa's land, Makai by the Poalima lois, Wailuku by Keahi's land.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki's kula, Kahakuloa by Kaiole's land, Makai by Malaihi's land, Wailuku by Kaluakine's land. (v. 8/14)

3515 Kuamoo See 252 p. vol. 5 NT

Kauna sworn. The claimant's land consists of one piece of Kalo land in the Ili of Kalepolepo 2, Waihee, Maui.

The claimant received it from his parents who received it from Keaumoku in the days of Kamehameha 1. His title is not disputed. There are 3 Poalima lois in it.

It is bounded Mauka by the ili of Paulani, Kahakuloa by the ili of Papaina, Makai by the ili of Nehe, Wailuku by the ili of Meokahi. (v. 8/14)

7686 Kawa

J.L. Kaaua sworn. The claimant's land consist of one piece in the Ili of Papaina, Waihee, and seven piece in Honokohau, Maui.

The claimant received the land in Waihee in 1845 and he from blind Kaeo in 1838. The lands in Honokohau he received from Kaaunalalo in 1833 or about then, and lived on, and worked them in peace until 1844, when Peahi, the husband of Kaaimalalo, took them away notwithstanding the claimant went to the Poalima and paid the taxes. Kaaimalalo died that year and her son Kaeo because possessed of the land, but Kanaina drove him from it and holds it at the present time. Kanaina's Konohiki is Polea.

No person appeared to answer to this claim which is registered under 4389 and all the Land holders of Waihee being called upon said he had no land there. (v. 8/24)

The claimant received it form his father Wahineelua in 1826. His title was never disputed. There is one Poalima loi in it.

It is bounded Mauka by the Govt lot, Kahakuloa by the ili of Pahihi, Makai by Kahahalua's land, Wailuku by Pea's land.

I forgot to state that the Konohiki took away nine lois and a House lot. Pia is now on the Island of Lanai. He took them away in 1848. This is the foundation of this taking away. Pia went to Oahu and asked L. Kaauwai how many Poalima lois there was in this land in olden times, and he said 23. He then returned and asked the claimant and she said 16. Therefore he took these away to make good the number given by Kaauwai. (v. 8/25)

2513 M. Manoa

J.L. Kaawa sworn. I am the father of the claimant who is dead. His land consist of two pieces on the Island of Lanai in the Ahupuaa of Kaa, and Ili of Kaaina.

The claimant received it from Kaluahinenui in the days of Kaahumanu, and he from Kaahumanu. His title was not disputed up to his death. His heir is Naluahine his son.

No. 1 is a Kula wala, No. 2 is Kula wala.

This is an Ahupuaa called Kaa and the claimant was the Konohiki of it only under Victoria. (v. 8/25)

(Kuihelani says "I never took away this man's land. I only said to Kekahuna you may have the Poalima lois in it, but I never gave him the rights of this claimant. He took away the whole land however.") The claim of Kekahuna was heard yesterday and it included no. 2 and 3. There are 7 Poalima lois in no. 2 and two in no. 3.

This is a claim for land in Waikapu, Maui.

L. Kaauwai sworn. I know the land of the claimant in Waikapu. It is the Ili of Luapuaa. It is in three pieces. One the lowland, one a Kalo land in the Valley, and the third a Kula wauke.

The claimant received this from Hoapili wahine in 1836 and I never heard his title disputed to this day. Hoapili Wahine saw Mr. Copp's trouble in Lahaina, and gave him this land. He used to make clothes for Lot his Grandson. Joseph Gould now lives on the land, as Mr. Copp his rented it to him. Nalei has put in a claim for a part of the lowland, but I don't know the foundation of the claim. The land has been surveyed in part by Mr. Metcalf.

Wm. Humphreys sworn. I know the land of the claimant. The testimony of L. Kaauwai is correct. I was with the surveyor Mr. Metcalf when he surveyed the land, and the old man Haa who pointed out the land to Mr. Copp in the first place went with him and pointed out the correct bounds of the lowland. The second and third pieces were of so small value that they were not surveyed. (v. 8/34)

10460 Nalei (Heard July 16th in part) (v. 8/35)

236 J Charles Copp is a counter claimant

Kalua sworn. I know the land of the claimant as it is called at Waikapu. It is a part of the land of Mr. Copp called Luapuaa.

The claimant Mr. Copp gave Makole a native living with him the piece of Nalei's called no. 1 in the year 1846. Soon after Makole went to Hana with Mr. Copp, and gave the land to Nalei. He lived there but refused to go to Poalima and I appealed to Kuihelani and he said after a hearing that Nalei should do the work, he did so until rented the land to Joseph Gould and then he turned Nalei off because he wanted all Mr. Copp's land. (v. 8/35)

Puanea sworn. The claimant's land consist of one piece of 21 Lois in Puulolo, Waihee, Maui.

He received it from Kealoha in 1847. Kealoha took away the land from Kauhi in 1847, because he had too many children and gave it to claimant. The land I think is Kauhi's. (See his claim.) (v. 8/37)

4438 B Kekaula

This claim is registered under cl. 4440 but no number given to it.

Keawe sworn. The claimant's land consists of two pieces in Waihee, Maui.

It is bounded Mauka by Broadway, Waikiki by Honolulu Hale, Makai by Merchant Street, Ewa by Mr. Reynold's lot.

The claimant lives at Waihee. See. P. 270 v. 5 (v., 8/43)

4405 Kapahuwai

This claim was called for some days at Wailuku, with the Waihee claims, but no one appeared to answer. (v. 8/44)

4405 B George Raymond

The claimant made oath that he wrote out and sent in his claim before the death of Mr. Richards.

Kalama sworn. The claimant's land consists of 9 Lois in the Ili of Koiahi, Waihee, Maui.

The claimant received it from Anapanapa in 1846 and he from his parents in olden times. His title through is good for nothing for he forsook the land and does not till it. It has gone back to its old owner Kaaukahu whose claim has been heard. (v. 8/44)

4405 C Kaaipuni

J.L. Kaawa sworn. I wrote out and sent in this claim in the Early part of February, 1848.

The claimant has 3 pieces in Waihee, and Waiehu, Maui.

No. 1 is a section of Lois in Papaole, No. 2 is 5 Lois in Kapoho, No. 3 is 19 Lois in Poino, Waiehu.

The claimant received them from Anadalea in 1846, and he from Kuihelani. His title is not disputed. There are 5 Poalima lois in no. 1 and some in no. 3.

Kaehehiwa sworn. "Kalaloi" in Waianu was given to claimant by Lukua in 1839. Mauka by Konohiki, Hana by a stream, Makai by Konohiki, Hamakua by Ehu's land.

"Pahoa" in Keanae was given by Kekapoi in 1829. Mauka by Naeole's land, Hana by a stream, Makai by the same, Hamakua by Mahoe and Kaea's land.

2 Lois in "Koleamoku". Mauka by Keaka's land, Hana by Naaina's land, Makai by Punohu's loi, Hamakua by the land of Kamauoaewa I.

A Loi in "Kuopohaku". Mauka by Piwai's land, Hana by Kaope's land, Makai by Pooila's land, Hamakua by a water course.

1 Loi in "Kalihi". Mauka by Malailua's land, Hana by the same, Makai by Paupau's land, Hamakua by Ehu's land.

1 Loi in Waialohe. Mauka by Naohiki's land, Hana by the same, Makai by Makea's land, Hamakua by Naohiki's land.

1 clump of Olona in "Kukuiohoku", surrounded by Konohiki.

4848 H Kailio

Kealina sworn. A Moo in "Kealaakeakua" was given to claimant by Kaluwaa in 1839.

Mauka by Mahoe's land, Hana by Keliiaea's land, Makai by Mahoe's land, Hamakua by Kalawaia's land.

5 Lois in "Makaiwa". Mauka by Umikanaha's land, Hana by Konohiki, Makai by Kaopu's loi, Hamakua by a pali.

A House lot in "Kanemakue". Mauka by the house lot of Naeole, Hana by the same, Makai by the house lot of Kueau, Hamakua by a pali.

Title good.

6202 Francis Davis from 379 v. 4 Waimea March 26, 1851

James Lay, sworn deposed that claimant was a Servant of Governor Adams for many years. Frank Davis asked the Governor if he would give him the land in question. Kuakini did give it to him and said it was his own fault that he did not have a land before. The land was the Governor's own and he gave it absolutely to Frank in return for his services, telling Keleiopu and Kapau who had charge of it, that he had given this land to claimant and they must not disturb him in the occupation of it. This was about twelve years ago. Probably in 1837. The gift was made in my presence at Waimea. Claimant and his people have held it ever since without molestation.

Henry Purdy confirms the above statement in full, as do all the old residents of Waimea. (v. 8/663)

7885 Kaaukai Puukapu Maraki 27, 1851

Nalauniaia hoohikiia a olelo mai la, u a ike no au I ke Kuleana o Kaaukau ma Kapulena, Hamakua.

Apana I ke Kahuahale, ao le I pa a I ka ua.

Apana 2 I ke kihapai Uala, Kokoke uo I ka Hale. Penui na palena ina ka aoao o Waipio o Kaupo ili aina, makai he alanui, ma Hilo he Kahawai, mauka ke Konohiki.

Kaihoio, sworn, says he knows the kuleana of claimant in Kiloa 1, South Kona. It consists of 3 cultivated patches. Claimant has given u the land, it is now cultivated by other people.

Relinquishment signed by claimant to Mr. Fuller (v. 8/665)

11179 Luahine

Mu, sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Honaiunau, Kona. It consists of a piece of cultivated land. It is planted with Kalo. It is bounded on Kau sides by the land called Keaokea, Makai by Laolao's land, Mauka by the Konohiki. Claimant derived the land from Paukuwahie previous to the death of Kuakini, and has held it ever since without dispute. (v. 8/665)

11183 Lono

Claimant being sworn, says his claim was drawn up by Lilikalani in 1847, and sent to Honolulu.

Kealoha sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of Lono in Kealakekua. It is a House lot enclosed with a stone wall. There are 3 houses in it belonging to Lono. It is bounded on Kau sides by Kanehoahau's lot, Makai by land intervening between claimant and the sea, Mauka by the Public road. Claimant derived the lot from his mother in law some five years ago, and has lived there ever since without dispute. (v. 8/665)

11175 Kaikuaanai W.

Claimant being sworn says her claim was drawn up in 1847 by Papaula, and sent to Honolulu.

Keoni, sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Kealakekua. It is a House lot, enclosed. There are 5 houses in it, 3 of which belong to claimant. It adjoins the lot of Kaha on one side, and a Road on the Maia side. Claimant derived this lot from her ancestors and has occupied it without dispute up to the present time. (v. 8/666)

1974 Daniel Barrett from pg. 616

Claimant being sworn, says he sent in his claim in 1847 but it appears to have been lost somewhere. The claim is for a piece of land in Kiloaiki, Kona. It contains about five acres. I received it from Govr. W.P. Leleiohoku in the year 1845, I think. I have occupied and planted the land ever since without dispute. It is bounded on Kailua side by the Road leading to the Mountain, Mauka by the Woods, on Kau side by the land called Kiloanui, on Makai side by a round hill.

Hale, sworn, says he knows the land of claimant in Kiloaiki. I came here from Oahu after the death of Govr. Pitt, and Barrett had possession of the land now claimed. (v. 8/666)

11184 Kaaua

Claimant being sworn, says her claim was drawn up by Lolo in 1847 and sent to the Board at Honolulu.

Kaui, sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Kolo, Kona. It consists of a House lot and cultivated land. The house lot is enclosed, there is one house on it. I do not know the boundaries of the cultivated land. It is distinct from the House lot. Claimant derived the land from her father, who got it in the time of Kamehameha 1. Claimant has always held it without dispute. (v. 8/667)

7017 Kaneuuiakea

Kekukui, sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant, it is in the land called Kalama 5, Kona. It consists of a House lot, enclosed by a stone wall. There is no house in it. I don't know the boundaries distinctly.

Claimant some time ago abandoned the land he formerly cultivated. He derived the house lot from Palake more than ten years ago and has held it since without dispute. (v. 8/667)

7007 KaiokuKakalo, sworn, says the place claimed by Kaioku has been abandoned by him for some time. The house and wall have both fallen down. He lives in another place altogether. Claimant is at present in Kau.

Neither the claim nor this testimony describe what or where the claim is. (v. 8/667)

7008 Keaka

Claimant says he has forsaken the place mentioned in this claim and therefore withdraws it. (v. 8/668)

9722 Keoni

Moohikiu, sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Waipuuaua, Kona. It consists of several cultivated fields, two patches forming, one piece are Makai. It is bounded Mauka by Govt land, also on the other sides.

The piece Mauka is planted with potatoes and is bounded on all sides by the Govt land. The land has not been cultivated by the labor of the Konohiki. Claimant derived the land from his parents long ago and has ever held it without dispute.

Palau, sworn, says the testimony of the last witness is correct. (v. 8/668)

9787 Kaahanui

Pupule, sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of Kaahanui, in Kealakekua. It consists of a House lot, enclosed by a stone wall. There is but one house in it. Claimant derived it from his ancestors over ten years ago, and has held it ever since without dispute. She lives there now. (v. 8/668)

9506 Namai

Palau, sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Kahauloa, Kona. It consists of a Coffee patch, not enclosed. It is bounded Mauka by Kaoni's land, on Kau side by Palau's land, Makai by Kaoni's land, on Kealakekua side by Kaaimeo's land. Claimant derived from Kanihoniauola about seven years ago. He planted the Coffee trees. It is not a Koele. Namai is at present in Oahu. (v. 8/669)

11185 Kamauli

Kaaimoku, sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant. It is a House lot, partly enclosed in Kealakekua.

It is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki, on Kau side by Govt land, Makai by Poaka's land. Claimant derived the lot from his ancestors and has ever held it without dispute. (v. 8/669)

7100 Kaaiahuli

Claimant says she wishes to withdraw this claim. She has no right to it. (v. 8/669)

7101 Ialua

Kalalo sworn, says he knows the land claimed by Ialua. He has forsaken and given up that part of his claim which consists of land for cultivation.

His House lot is in Kealakekua. It is enclosed. There is one house in it. Claimant derived the lot a long time ago, and has occupied it ever since in peace. (v. 8/669)

9730 Pikole

Palau sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of Pikole at Kahauloa, Kona. It consists of a House lot enclosed by a stone wall, and a field planted with Potatoes. There are two houses in the enclosure, one of which belongs to claimant. The field is bounded Mauka by the Konohiki, on Kau side by Kekao's land, other sides by the Konohiki. Claimant derived the land from Kukahiko a long time ago, and has occupied it without dispute.

Kahula sworn, says the testimony of Palau is correct in every respect. (v. 8/670)

5385 Laioha (Helekahi 8385 Index) Kailua, Hawaii Sept. 27, 1851

Kanakaole sworn, says she knows the Kuleana of claimant in Lanihau Nui, Kona. It consists of patches in the Ili of Piilani. They are all in one piece. She does not exactly know the boundaries. Claimant derived from her ancestors. She does not know about her claims in Keopu.

Laenui sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of Kaioha in Keopukaluapa. Claimant has no land there now, she has forsaken it. Claimant has been in Oahu for the last 3 years. (v. 8/671)

7350 Kialoa

Ipunui sworn, says he knows the claim of Kialoa in Kahului, Kona. It consists of 15 patches partly in cultivation. They all lie together in one piece. Claimant derived the land from the Konohiki in 1844, and has held it ever since without dispute. This piece is intersected by the Road.

Claimant also has 14 patches in another piece, Makai of the first piece. It is bounded on Kohala side by Kiniha's land, on Kau side by Nalenia's land, Mauka by a Road.

He has also a piece of Kula land near the Great Wall. It is bounded Makai by the Great Wall, Kohala side by Niuiha's land, on Kona side by Nalima's land. (v. 8/671)

11113 Kahue

Kuwahine sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Auhaueae 2, Kona. Claimant derived the land from Kamanawa in the time of Kamehameha 1. The name of the Ili is Ililoa. Claimant has 2 Kihapais in cultivation, one Mauka and one Makai. He has always held this land without dispute. (v. 8/672)

3659 Jeremiah Martin

John G. Munn sworn, says he knows the House lot of claimant in Kainaliu, Kona. Claimant got it from Mr. Samuel Rice about 1828. It is enclosed with a stone wall. I believe he has held it ever since. He had also a piece of land inside of the Great Wall. Gov. Adams told me that Martin had a piece of land there for cultivation. This was about 15 year ago. I don't know how much land he had, or whether he continues to cultivate it or not.

Naniani sworn, says he knows the House lot of claimant Mauka of the Great Wall. He got it from Kuakini before the death of Nahienaena. He held it under Kuakini, the same as a common native. Claimant allowed several natives to cultivate on the land, and they were his Hoainas. This Ili was called Opukea. At that time the land was sold to Mr. Wm. Johnson there were two natives living on it, Haa and Kukauai.

Note. Charles Hall claims the right of cart way through this House lot of Martin, and in consideration of this Martin agrees and guarantees that if the Cart road at present used by Hall is ever closed u, then Hall shall have a road through his (Martin's) lot, to the Govt. Road.

(Mr. Martin has applied to the Minister of the Interior for 50 acres of land in another place, in lieu of his claim within the boundary of the land sold by the Govt to Mr. Wm. Johnson.) (v. 8/672-673)

3660 John G. Munn

Jeremiah Martin sworn, says the land in question, an Ili in Holualoa called Kaohia, was originally given by Gov. Adams to Francis Davis. Some time afterwards, Davis committed adultery with some woman in Kohala and the Gov. took away the land from him. Mr. Munn came to Kailua about this time, perhaps 1829, and the Gov. told him he might have the land and cultivate it. The Gov. told me he had given the land to Munn, and said Munn had given him some money, I don't know how much. Kanekapulii has taken care of the land under Mr. Munn. Mr. Munn's family have lived there at different times.

Charles Hall sworn, says when I came on this Island, in 183, Munn and F. Davis were living on the land in question.

In 1839 Kanekapulii went to the Gov. in my presence, and paid in \$50 to him on account of Mr. Munn's land, Kaohia.

Kekoi sworn, says he knows the Ili of Kaohia IN Holualoa 1. I heard that the land had been given to Kanekapulii. I did not know that it was given to Mr. Munn. The Konohiki of the Ahupuaa has no Koele in this Ili. It is a large Ili. The Ahupuaa of Holualoa came to Kuakini from his father Keeaumoku. (v. 8/673-674)

4887 Thomas Sams Part 2

Manuhaaipa sworn, says she knows the Ili of land formerly held by claimant was Hookena, it is called Kupee. It was given to claimant by Kamehameha 1, and afterwards taken away again by Kauikeaouli, Kamehameha III. It was taken away after the death of Kamehameha 1 and Sams had not had possession of it since.

Nahau sworn, says he knows the land called Pupuaiki. It was given to claimant by Liholiho Kamehameha II. It was occupied by claimant either himself or through his people under him, from the time he got it up to this present time. The land is bounded on Kohala side by Kahului, Mauka by the forest, on Kau side by Pupuanui, Makai by the Sea beach. It belongs to claimant at this time, with no dispute.

Kawila sworn, says the evidence given. (v. 8/675-676)

7953 Kuahine

Kupihee sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Auhaueae, Kona. It consists of 6 Kihapais in one piece bounded on the Kohala side by the Konohiki, Mauka the same, Kau and Makai the same.

Claimant received the land from Kamanawa, before the death of Kuakini, and has had it in possession ever since without dispute. (v. 8/677)

9126 and 9255 Kaiakaola

Kalama sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Kahului 1, Kona. It consists of several pieces of cultivated land scattered over the Ahupuaa, viz, 3 Kalo patches, 3 patches of Coffee, 2 patches of Potatoes. He has a House lot also and 3 patches of Kalo in another place. The House site is not enclosed. Claimant derived the land from his ancestors, who got it in the days of Kiwalao, and holds it without dispute. (v. 8/677)

9165 Kiinui

Claimant appeared in person and said he had no claim whatever. (v. 8/677)

9952 Lapalaau

Kaupa sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Hianaloli 3, Kona. It consists of 20 patches of cultivated land. It is bounded Mauka by the Govt road, on Kau side by Kaupa's land, Makai by Peleunu's land, Kohala side by Hianaloli 2. Claimant derived the land from his ancestors and has occupied it without dispute. (v. 8/678)

11064 Apuni

Kekipi sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Honokahau Nui, Kona. It consists of one piece of cultivated land in which are 7 patches and House site. It is bounded Mauka by Kaumauma's land, Kau side by Wili's land, Makai by the Govt road, Kohala side by Konohiki's land.

Claimant got the land from Kahalehau in the time of Kuakini, and has occupied it without dispute ever since. (v. 8/678)

8218 Ikiiki

Kekipi sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Honokahau 2, Kona. It consists of 2 patches of land in which is his house. It is bounded Mauka by the Govt road, on Kau side by Makaena's land, Makai by Kamohai's land, Kohala side by Honokahau 1. Claimant derived the land from his brother in the time of Kuakini and has occupied it since in peace. (v. 8/678)

11186 Hekipi

Claimant being sworn, deposed that his claim was drawn up by Maewa when the other Kona claims were sent in, and was forwarded to the Board at Honolulu in 1848.

Ikiiki sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Honokahau 2, Kona. It consists of a House lot Makai, not enclosed, and some patches of cultivated land, Mauka.

The 2 patches are bounded on Kohala side by Kanae's land, Mauka by Kailimo's land, on Kau side by Benjamin's land, Makai by Hoochie's land.

Claimant derived this land from his ancestors and has held it ever since without dispute.

Memo. The land claimed by John Hooipo, no. 3083, belongs to Mahu). (v. 8/679)

6435 Keawekolohe

Kuai sworn, says he knows the Kuleana of claimant in Hianaloli, Kona. It is a House lot enclosed with a stone wall.

Claimant got it from Kalaikini at the time Mr. Bishop lived in Kailua. Claimant has not occupied it since 1845. He has no house now on the land. It was sold last year by Kaihumua, the father in law of Kalaikini, to a Negro named Dorsay, who now has possession of it. (v. 8/679)

11187 Kekea Kailua, Hawaii Sept 29, 1851

Claimant came forward and said he wished to withdraw his claim in Lanihau 2, Kona as he lives now on another land. (v. 8/680)

7468 Kahue

Mahue sworn, says I know the claim of Kahue. It is in the Ili of Kohelia, Lanihau 1. It consists of 18 Kihapais, one of which is a garden of Coffee. Another consists of a lot of garden trees. These Kihapais lie in 4 distinct pieces.

No. 1 is 5 patches of Potato land, bounded Mauka by Kaliai's land, Kau by the Ahupuaa of Lanihau 2, Makai by the House lot of Kauku, Kohala by the Ili of Papauela.

No. 2 is 6 Kalo patches bounded Mauka by Kauku's land, Kau by Lanihau 2, Makai by Kuia's land, Kohala by same.

No. 3 is 5 pieces of Kalo land and one Coffee patch, bounded Mauka by Mr. Thurston's land, Kau by Lanihau 2, Makai by Keoni's land, Kohala by Mahu's land.

No. 4 is a garden of Banana trees far inland, bounded Mauka and Makai by the Konohiki's land, Kau by Lanihau 2, Kohala by Auliilii an Ili.

Claimant received these lands from Hoapili Wahine before Kuakini's time and his claim has never been disputed. (v. 8/680)

10337, 10401, 10523 John Nawahie

Kapaiki sworn, says I am a Kamaaina in Kalaoa, Kona. I know the claim of Nawahie. It consists of one House lot and several Kihapais of Kalo and Potatoes. There are two pieces only.

No. 1 is a House lot bounded Mauka and Kohala by the Konohiki's land, Kau by a fence, Makai by the Public road.

No. 2 is bounded Mauka by the Public road, Kau by the Ili of Kahuku, Makai and Kohala by the Konohiki's land.

Claimant received this land from I don't know who, I know he has lived on the land some years in peace.

Kalei sworn, says claimant received his House lot and land from Kapae the Kahukula of Kona in 1841 and has possessed the same in peace ever since. (v. 8/681)

5563 Kuula

Aoaokapu sworn, says I know the claim of Kuula. It is in Honuaino, Kona and consists of 2 House lots, one on the sea beach and one up inland, also some Kihapais of Kalo, Coffee and Bananas.

No. 1 is a House lot in the Sea beach, bounded by a stone wall.

No. 2 is a House lot inland, bounded by his Kihapais on the Mauka, on the Kau side by the Ili of Waipio, Makai by Kanekau's land, Kohala by the Konohiki's land. The Coffee patch, Kalo patches I can't bound. Claimant received this land from his ancestors in the days of Kamehameha 1 and has possessed the same in peace ever since. (v. 8/681)

3434 B Kahaoi

Claimant made oath that he sent in his claim for a piece of land in Pahoehoe 1, Kona, when Mr. Armstrong came round in 1848, before February of that year.

Paele, an old man, sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Pahoehoe and know the land of Kahaoi. It consists of 10 Kalo patches, in one piece, surrounded by the Konohiki's land. I am the Konohiki. There is a Coffee patch joined with the Kalo land and Potato land. Claimant received this land from Alapai in the days of Kamehameha 1, and has held it in peace ever since. (v. 8/682)

7351 Kahuenui

Papaula sworn, says I know the claim of Kahuenui. It is in the Ahupuaa of Kaahuolu, Kona. It consists of one piece of Kalo land, 5 patches, all lying together. One of these patches is planted with Coffee.

It is bounded Mauka by the land of Kahookohukaneole, Kau by Lanihau, Makai by the land Nahoualualu, Kohala by the Konohiki.

Claimant received this land from his brother in 1846 and his title has never been disputed. (v. 8/682)

7470 Keawe

Kauakahi sworn, says I am a Kamaaina on Keopu and know the claimant's land. I also know his claim in Puapuaa. His claim in Keopu consists of one House lot in Keopu nui and 5 Kalo patches in Keopu hui kahi. The House lot is bounded by a stone fence. The 5 Kalo patches are in one piece, bounded Mauka by the Konohiki's land, Kau and the other sides the same.

The claim in Puapuaa consists of one Potato patch and 2 Kihapais and one piece of Kalo land containing seven patches.

The Potato patch is bounded on all sides by the Konohiki's land, and so also is the Kalo land.

The claimant received these lands from Hoapili Wahine in the days of Kamehameha 1 and he has occupied them in peace ever since, either by himself or relatives. (v. 8/683)

9164 Kuapu

Kanewalawala sworn, says I know the claim of Kuapu. It is in the Ahupuaa of Puukala, Kona and consists of one House lot on Ohiki and 10 Kalo Kihapais in Puukala. The House lot is bounded by a stone fence. The Kalo land is bounded Mauka and Makai by the Konohiki, Kau by the Ahupuaa of "Kau", Kohala by the Ahupuaa of Ohiki.

The claimant received it from Kekuhaupio in the days of Kamehameha 1, and has possessed it in peace ever since. (v. 8/683)

7895 Kuikaloa

This claimant is dead. The widow appeared and said she did not wish to prosecute this claim as her husband had given the land to Kahuenui, one of his brothers. Kahuenui could not be found. (v. 8/684)

6179 Keakahaapoli

The claimant appeared and according to her own statement had no Kuleana in the lot claimed. (v. 8/684)

5412 Umiokalani

Ehu sworn, says I am a Kamaaina of Honalo and have charge of that land at the present time under the Govt. I know the claim of Umiokalani in Honalo. It is a piece of Kalo and Potato land, 5 Kihapais. The Konohiki has all of these as Koeles however, Umiokalani having given over this land to the Aupuni in 1848. He was only a Konohiki there and has no title of her own. The land is now worked by others. (v. 8/684)

11188 G.L. Kapeau Governor of Hawaii, for the Government no. 11188

This is a counter claim to Umiokalani and the heirs of Wm. P. Leleiohoku for certain lands in Kailua.

Moalo sworn, says I know the lands of Umiokalani and Leleiohoku at Kailua. I was a servant of Old Kamehameha when he lived here and an a son of Kona.

The Fort land as claimed by Leleiohoku or rather the land inside of the Fort is not his. It belonged to Kamehameha 1 and was enclosed by a small wall. The big wall was put there by Kuakini, but it was only making the small wall larger. This land inside of the Fort is not private property belonging to the heirs of John Adams, but belongs to the Aupuni, or if not to Kamehameha III.

The lot claimed by Umiokalani outside of the Fort is the property of Umiokalani but not the whole of it, a portion belongs to the Govt as it has come down from Kamehameha 1. The division is the "Hale aki" which is a long house built for the men or servants of our old King Kamehameha. We built boats there.

There is also a portion of the House lot of Loe that belongs to the Aupuni, which has been taken by Leleiohoku. The title is in Loe's name. I can point out the portion belonging to the Govt better than I can describe it.

Moses Moo sworn says I know that the land inside of the Fort was Kamehameha's. I lived with him as his servant for a great many years. At the present time I can't say to whom it belongs.

A portion of Umiokalani's lot belongs to Govt. The true division I can point out, it is the old "Hale aki" or long house. It is now fallen but the foundation is plain to be seen.

The House lot of Loe is also in part the property of Govt, as I can point out. (v. 8/684-685)

8513 V. Lorenzo B. Lincoln Kawaihae Dec. 16 1851

George Davis Hueu sworn, says he does not know of Governor Kuakini's having given the land in question to Lincoln, but he knows that Lincoln has lived on it, probably since 1839. Does not think that his right to live on the land has ever been disputed by any person. (v. 8/686)

1278 John Woods Puukapu January 10, 1852

John Davis sworn, says I know the place claimed by John Wood in Waipio, Hamakua, Hawaii. It consists of a House lot only, which is fenced in. Claimant got the place from Nakunu, who was a Konohiki in Waipio, about eighteen years ago. He has occupied the lot ever since without dispute.

(Claimant states that almost all the people who know about his getting land are dead. He asked one old man to come up and give testimony but he refused.)(v. 8/687)

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
